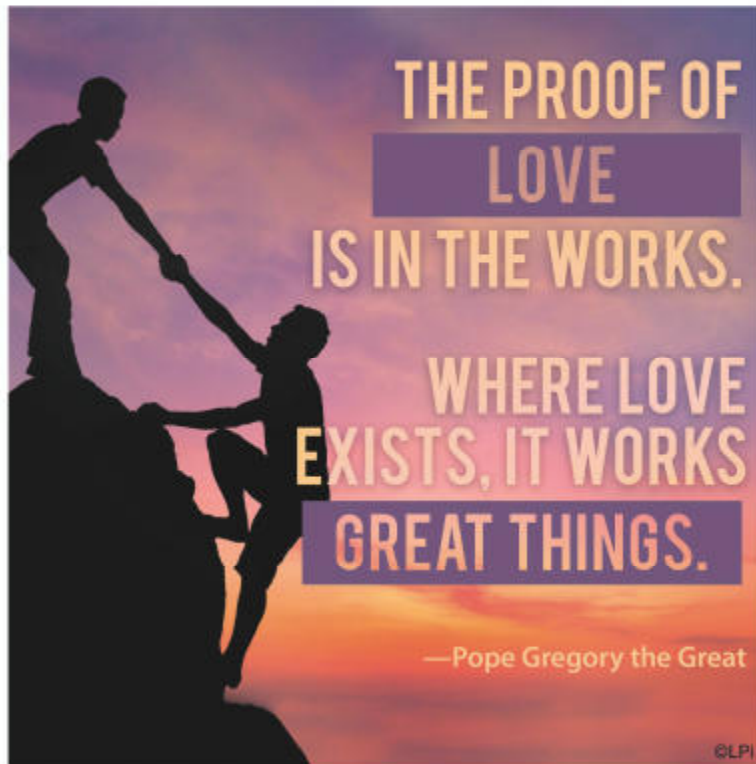

Mission Appeal

Beginning Tuesday, August 31– September 5, St. Joseph Cathedral will be hosting Fr. Joseph Dang, SVD in our Mission Appeal. Fr. Joseph represents the missionary efforts of the Society of the Divine Word.

The work of Fr. Dang and his brothers in the Society is rooted in the image of Christ as Missionary and how Jesus, himself "...shows us through teaching and example, how to live our lives in righteousness..."

They primarily do this by operating Seminaries whereby they can continue to promote the growth and spirit of faith by evangelization in the formation of men for priesthood.

Originating in 1875 in the Netherlands, The Society of the Divine Word found in the Americas a unique opportunity for evangelization among the many African-Americans following the Civil War and the collapse of the Old South. The Society opened the nation's first Seminary for African-American men in Bay St. Louis, MS in 1923, and though the first men to finish the program were not the first African-American men to be ordained to the priesthood, they were the first four African-American men to be both fully educated and ordained on United States soil.

Fr. Dang is here this week and next weekend to help continue the good work of forming men for the priesthood. Education for priesthood is expensive, and Seminaries rely on many different avenues to allay the cost of formation and education. **Please consider contributing to our second collection next weekend, Sept 4-5,** and be sure to say hello if you run into Fr. Dang. Please pray for the efforts of Fr. Dang and the missionary work of the Society of the Divine Word.

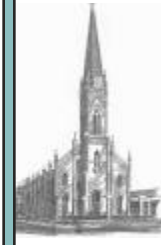
