FATHER BROWN'S SUNDAY NOTES

We have a book in the MQP Christmas Shoppe of which I was not familiar. It's called *The Hidden Treasure: Holy Mass* by Saint Leonard. It contains very helpful information about living a holy life – plus, it is only 123 pages in length. I share with you an excerpt from this book from a section at the end called:

RULES FOR LIVING WELL (abbreviated)

He who desires to be saved, lives, according to rule, and establishes an arrangement of his time with a view to devotional exercises. Dearest reader, if you wish to maintain yourself in the grace of God, never abandon these brief exercises which I now propose to you.

Choose for yourself a good confessor, to whom you may confide the treasure of your soul. Go often to him, to give an account of your conscience, and do not change him by mere caprice or fickleness.

Every morning offer to the Lord all the good works of that day, all its labors and sufferings, and all your actions, in union with the merits of Jesus Christ.

Offer all your actions to the Most Holy Trinity, to Mary, every Virgin, and to all the blessed of Heaven, in suffrage for the Souls in Purgatory.

Form the intention to gain the indulgences obtainable by prayer or acts during the whole day.

Avoid sloth, bad company, dangerous conversations, and games; remembering that time passes and never returns, that you have a soul, and that if you lose your soul, you lose all.

EVERY MORNING

When as yet scarcely awake, give your very first thought to God; while dressing keep reciting vocal prayers, and recommend yourself to God – then say upon your knees: "Most Holy Trinity, I believe that Thou art present with me; and I adore Thee, I thank Thee for having preserved me during the past night; I offer to Thee all my actions. My God, my love, Goodness Infinite, and worthy of all love, assist me this day; keep me free from sins and dangers; hold Thy hands above me, and preserve me from betraying Thee.

Then say three Glory Be's to the Most Holy Trinity, one Pater to Jesus, three Ave's to Mary, and beseech her to guard you under her mantle; offer all your senses and faculties to Jesus and Mary.

Say "Act of Faith", "Act of Hope", "Act of Charity", and "Act of Contrition". Then make a half-hour mental prayer, or at least during quarter of an hour, upon the Passion of Jesus, and upon the last things, death and judgment.

Never omit to hear holy Mass every morning [acknowledging that it may not always be possible]. It is an infinite treasure, and will be infinitely profitable to you. Afterward you will go to your affairs, often recalling your thoughts to God, Who is ever present beside you. At table give a thought to God and act upon the resolution of eating in order to live and serve your God. Practice some little mortification at each meal. Then thank the Lord.

Saint Leonard also includes charitable works to practice throughout the day and in the evening. There are also recommendations to make habitual for every week, every month and every year. This is a brief description, but I have found great substance for my meditation and for the way I live my life.

As we draw closer to Christmas in these final days of Advent, I encourage you to examine your own life and how you pass each day.

- Confession times are added...during this week to help you prepare for the birth of Christ. Confessions will be available on Sunday, December 20th at 9:30 am and 12 Noon; Monday, December 21st at 8:30 am and 3 pm; Tuesday, December 22nd at 8:30 am and 6 pm; Wednesday, December 23rd at 8:30 am and 5 pm; and Thursday, December 24th at 8:30 am. Do not wait to receive the Sacrament of Penance.
- Please note our Christmas Mass schedule...with Masses on Thursday, December 24th, Christmas Eve at 4:30 pm and 9 pm. We added the 9 pm Mass this year to help provide another opportunity to attend Christmas Eve Mass and to hopefully draw some people away from the 4:30 pm Mass. Midnight Mass will be at midnight (of course!) and will be a Latin High Mass. Masses on Christmas Day will be at 6:30 am; 8:30 am and 11 am, which will be a Latin Low Mass with Christmas Carols. There are many parishes that are requiring reservations for Christmas Eve Masses. I do not want to do that here because I think that we can make responsible and safe decisions for ourselves.
- Please note that the Rectory is closed...on Thursday, December 24th; Friday, December 25th; Saturday, December 26th; Monday, December 28th; Thursday, December 31st; Friday, January 1st and Saturday, January 2nd. Of course, I will always be available for emergencies.
- Spend New Year's Eve with Jesus...and gain two indulgences for yourself or a departed soul. There will be Eucharistic Adoration from 10 to 12 midnight on Thursday, December 31st. Confessions will be heard from 10 to 11:45 pm. At approximately 11:45 pm, we will pray the Te Deum, an indulgenced act. A Latin Low Mass for the Octave Day of Christmas will be at 12 Midnight. After Mass has concluded, we will pray the Veni Sancte Spiritu, an indulgenced act. What a beautiful way to ring in the New Year!
- January 1st is First Friday...and unless I hear from a large number of people in protest, there will be no Eucharistic Adoration that day until the evening. There will be the Blessing of Religious Objects at 6:45 pm and the First Friday Latin Mass at 7 pm followed by Confessions and a brief period of Eucharistic Adoration.
- First Saturday is January 2nd...and we will have our morning Mass followed by Confession and the praying of the Holy Rosary.
- blessing of Epiphany Holy Water...is a powerful blessing that we offered for the first time last year. You will want to ensure you have enough Epiphany Holy

Water for the year as it is a potent Sacramental. Because of the length of the blessing and the requirement that it may only be blessed on the day before the Epiphany, this will be the only time I will bless Epiphany Water this year. The Blessing of Epiphany Water will be on Monday, January 5th at approximately 6:45 am – after the first morning Mass. Please bring your own water.

• A belated thank you...to the Companions of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood who were awarded a grant in the amount of \$5000 to be used to supplement the Third Sunday Community Meal. Thank you!

As we prepare for the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord, I am reminded of the miraculous nature of this event. Who would have thought that the Son of God would be born in a lowly stable, surrounded by farm animals? Yet He was born for our salvation and redemption. When I get discouraged by some of our aging facilities or when finances are tight here, I think of Jesus being born into poverty. Who am I to complain?



Here's how the CARES Act Changes Deducting Charitable Contributions made in 2020

Previously, charitable contributions could only be deducted if taxpayers itemized their deductions.

However, taxpayers who don't itemize deductions may take a charitable deduction of up to \$300 for cash contributions made in 2020 to qualifying organizations, one of which is MARY QUEEN OF PEACE. For the purpose of this deduction, qualifying organizations are those that are religious, charitable, educational, scientific or literary in purpose. The law changed in this area due to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act.

The CARES Act also temporarily suspends limits on charitable contributions and temporarily increases limits on contributions of food inventory. More information about these changes is available on IRS.gov.

THE ADVENT WREATH

The Advent Wreath symbolizes the children of Israel waiting for the Messiah through the centuries as well as our own spiritual preparation to welcome the Christ Child, the Holy Messiah on Christmas morning. The Advent Wreath is a set of four candles set in a wreath of evergreen. The evergreen, sometimes richly decorated, symbolizes the beauty of Christian hope in the loving promises of God. The perfect circle of the wreath represents the eternity of God. The four candles mark the four Sundays of Advent which immediately precede Christmas. One of the candles is lit on each Sunday of Advent until by Christmas all the candles are lit! Three of the candles are violet colored reflecting the penitential spirit of the Advent season. One candle is rose colored reflecting the joy of the Gospel on the Third Sunday of Advent. The four candles represent, not only the four weeks of Advent when we wait for the coming of the anniversary of the birth of Christ on Christmas Day, but of the four thousand years that Jews waited for the coming of Jesus as the Messiah. It also reminds us that we are now waiting for Jesus to come again...at the end of the world!

The candles of the Advent Wreath are given the following names:

- 1. The **PROPHECY CANDLE**, is a reminder of the foretelling of Jesus' birth by the Old Testament prophets.
- 2. The **BETHLEHEM CANDLE**, recalling the words of the Prophet Micah that the Christ Child would be born in Bethlehem.
- 3. The **SHEPHERDS' CANDLE**, a reminder of the first people to worship the baby Jesus. This is the rose colored candle and reflects the anticipated joy of the Gospel for this Sunday.
- 4. The ANGELS' CANDLE, lit on the Sunday before Christmas in remembrance of the Angel who spoke to the Virgin Mary at the conception of Jesus and of the Angels who appeared to the shepherds in the fields outside Bethlehem that first Christmas



Christmas Wafer Story

For centuries on Christmas Eve, families in Poland, Lithuania, the Czech and Slav Republics have practiced a beautiful tradition. It is the breaking and sharing of the Oplatek—Christmas Wafer. Oplatek taken from the Latin word oblatum, meaning Sacred Bread, has been the symbol of Christianity and Jesus Christ our bread of life.

On the Holiest Night of the year a festive 12 course meatless dinner is prepared for the gathered family and friends. An extra setting is placed for a beggar (our Lord) who may come to the door, or a poor family (the Holy Family) looking for a place to stay. The host or hostess leads the group in a special prayer and distributes an oplatek to the participants. Each person breaks off a piece of the other's oplatek and continues until they have exchanged good wishes and blessings with everyone.

Traditionally at midnight the head of the household takes the pink oplatek and shares it with the animals on his farm or at his home. This custom brings us back to that Holy Night when even animals were able to speak, and to remind us that we are all God's creatures

Oplatki is on sale for \$2 (previously \$3) in the Parish Office. If this is not one of your family traditions, why not start it this year?

Lectionary: 11 Reading 1

2 SM 7:1-5, 8B-12, 14A, 16

When King David was settled in his palace, and the LORD had given him rest from his enem

he said to Nathan the prophet,

"Here I am living in a house of cedar,

while the ark of God dwells in a tent!"


