

FATHER BROWN'S SUNDAY NOTES...

With today's celebration of the Epiphany of the Lord in the Ordinary Form of the Holy Roman Rite and Wednesday's offering in the Extraordinary Form, it seems important to remind ourselves of what this significant feast day is all about. According to the classic work of Father Goffine, *The Church's Year*,

"This festival is set apart to solemnly commemorate the coming of the three wise men from the East guided by a miraculous star which appeared to them, and directed them to Bethlehem, where they found Christ in the stable; here they honored and adored Him and offered gifts to Him."

It is called the Epiphany "because the Church wishes to bring before our mind the three great events in the life of Christ, when He made known to man His divinity; the coming of the wise men from the East, through whom He revealed Himself to the Gentiles as the Son of God; His baptism, on which occasion His Divinity was made known to the Jews; and His first miracle at the marriage of Cana, by which He revealed Himself to His disciples."

In many cultures, this Feast of the Epiphany is as important or MORE important than Christmas. Because of the differing liturgical calendars of the Church, we actually get to celebrate the Epiphany twice! In the Traditional Latin Mass, the feast day maintains the understanding of the twelve days of Christmas, while in the English Mass, it was moved to a Sunday in order to make it more accessible. Either way, I pray that the Epiphany is the beginning of a great year for you and your loved ones!

- *Pick up a great meal today...*at the **First Sunday FREE Community Meal at 1 pm.** All you need to do is to drive up to the rear doors of the Parish Center and a volunteer will bring your meal out to your car. If you are not driving, you can also walk up and pick up. Don't forget that we now have TWO Free Community Meals each month (1st & 3rd Sundays).
- *The Board Gaming Group*...also meets today at 1 pm in the Parish Center. They ask that you call in advance so that appropriate accommodations may be made for you to play.
- New Novena for January...after offering the same novenas for the past ten years, I think it might be good to enlist the help of other intercessors in Heaven. Our January Novena will be for the Infant of Prague and begins on Tuesday, January 5th at 7:45 am and continues through January 14th. The Infant Jesus is the patron of schools, vocations, stu-

dents, foreign missions, health, children, colleges and universities, family life, finances, peace, and travelers.

- The Blessing of Epiphany Water...is only offered on the day before the traditional liturgical date of the Epiphany on January 6th. Epiphany water is a powerful Sacramental. We had a great response last year when we first offered this blessing. Please bring your own water for the Epiphany Water Blessing on Tuesday, January 5th at 6:45 am.
- *Flush with some Christmas cash...*and not sure what to do with it? Why not pick up a couple Year-Round Utility Continuous Raffle tickets? **They are only \$10 and new drawings begin in February.** There are 26 chances to win!
- Our monthly meeting...for the Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary will be on Sunday, January 10th at 10 am in the Chapel. It is followed by a Holy Rosary Procession which will be outside if weather permits. One of the benefits of membership is that a monthly Mass is offered for all living and deceased Rosary Confraternity members.
- Speaking of the Holy Rosary...the Children's Rosary returns on Tuesday, January 12th at 6:30 pm in the Church. The Children's Rosary is approximately 30 minutes in length.
- Students at Mary Queen of Peace School...who have opted for "in-person learning" return on Monday, January 11th. We were supposed to return on Tuesday, January 5th, but decided to take a few extra days for students to work at home to avoid any concerns about virus transmission.
- With the canceling of our CYO Basketball Season...we have a great way to keep in practice for our student-athletes. The Knights of Columbus will have their Annual Free Throw Competition on Friday, January 22nd at 3:30 pm. If you win your age group, you may move on to the regionals, semi-finals, and finals! Sign up in advance.
- We welcome back the Culture Project...to Mary Queen of Peace School in late January and early February. As many of you remember, the Culture Project is a group of young adults who visit Catholic schools and youth groups to talk about human dignity and sexual integrity in a way that is relatable to youth. The Culture Project was well received by our students last year and we look forward to their visit again.
- In anticipation of the Feast of Saint Blaise...the Blessing of Throats will be offered on January 30th after the Vigil Mass and after all Masses on January 31st. In addition, the Blessing will be offered on the actual Feast Day of Saint Blaise on February 3rd. You remember that Saint Blaise is the patron of those with diseases of the throat be-

cause he once saved a young child from choking.

- *Candlemas...*is the traditional ending of the Christmas season on February 2nd and we will celebrate here with a Blessing of Candles.
- After a postponement in December...the Adult Catechism Class is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, February 2nd at 7 pm. We ask that you sign up in advance by calling the Rectory. Registration fee is \$20 and includes a copy of *Baltimore Catechism Four*. We will cover a lot of information and there will even be some quizzes to check your progress! The Class will continue for approximately seven weeks.

As we begin 2021, I pray for every blessing to be upon you and your loved ones. As long as we continue to trust Almighty God, it will be a great year! Here's a prayer that I have said for the New Year:

O sacred and adorable Trinity, hear our prayers on behalf of our holy Father, Pope Francis, our Bishops, our clergy, and for all that are in authority over us. Bless, we beseech Thee, during the coming year, the whole Catholic Church; nonbelievers; soften the hearts of sinners so that they may return to Thy friendship; give prosperity to our country and peace among the nations of the world; pour down Thy blessings upon our friends, relatives, and acquaintances, and upon our enemies, if we have any; assist the poor and the sick; have pity on the souls of those whom this year has taken from us; and do Thou be merciful to those who during the coming year will be summoned before Thy judgment seat. May all our actions be preceded by Thy inspirations and carried on by Thy assistance, so that all our prayers and works, having been begun in Thee, may likewise be ended through Thee. Amen.

New Year's Resolutions for the Catholics

It's that time of year again. Time to reflect on your life and come up with resolutions for the new year! While diet and fitness are the usual resolutions it's important to add a spiritual resolution for your interior life. Just remember that whenever you are trying to change your life it is easiest to pick just one or two things at a time and to stick with them until they become habits. While there are countless spiritual resolutions and devotions you can add to your repertoire for the new year, we have listed just a few below. As your resolutions turn into habits, you can begin to add more.

Renew your baptismal vows

Kick off the new year by renewing your baptismal promises with your family. It's easy, you can do it within your own home, and it will remind you of what it is to be a Catholic. It might just be the boost you need to be a holier person in 2021. The Baptismal Promises can be found in many places online and in prayer books below is one such link:

Go to confession

Many people are afraid of confession because they focus too much on the act (confessing their sins) and not enough on the grace of the sacrament (reconciliation with God!). Our parish is one of the few in the area that offers confession more than once a week (M-F at 8:30 am and Sat. 8:45 am & from 3-4 PM plus additional times on Sundays during Lent and Advent). Don't wait until you mortally sin and feel obliged to go. Get in the habit of going regularly (1-2 times per month) so that you can realize the full grace being offered. Utilize this sacrament and great mercy from God!

Set a time each day to pray

Start small. If you haven't been praying daily at all, set aside just five minutes during the morning to offer your upcoming day to God (as a morning offering) or in the evening to review your day in prayer (as a daily examination of conscience). If you already pray daily in the morning and evening learn how to "pray always." St. Alphonsus Liguori says "Now, you are not required to apply your mind so constantly to prayer as to forget your ordinary work and recreation. 'Praying always means that, without neglecting your ordinary occupations, you treat God as you treat the friends who love you and whom you love. God is ever near you, even within you." This is where short prayers called aspirations come in. Before a project at work or phone call "Lord help me." After a small success, "Thank you Jesus!" Aspirations are easily done and take almost no time throughout the day. Think of them almost like text messages to God.

Attend Daily Mass

There is no greater grace, this side of heaven, that the Catholic Church can offer you than union with Jesus' Real Presence (Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity) in the Eucharist. Just because you are only <u>required</u> to attend Mass on Sundays doesn't mean you wouldn't benefit from attending more often. If your goal is to become holy and to live like a saint attending Mass more frequently ought to be your first goal. Fr. Brown offers Masses every M-F at 6:15 am (in Latin) and 8 am in English. He also offers Mass on Sat. mornings at 8 am in the Latin.

Participate in First Fridays and First Saturdays!

The Immaculate Heart of Mary and Sacred Heart of Jesus are age old devotions to remind us of the loving mercy Jesus has for us as our savior, and the motherly love Mary has for us as her adopted children. Associated with the two Heart devotions are special Masses celebrated every month. Join us every First Friday at 7 PM for a Latin Mass followed by adoration and an evening of prayers (adoration is also available First Friday from 9 am - 6 PM with special prayers following from 6-7 PM before Mass) and every First Saturday at 8:00 am for a Latin Mass followed by adoration and a Holy Rosary.

Pray for Others (both living and deceased)

The Church asks that we pray for others, both friends and enemies, living and dead. We have many organizations here devoted to praying including our Holy Rosary Confraternity, Our Purgatorial Society and a Men's Prayer Group. If you are interested in joining any of these groups just attend the next meeting you see when it appears on the calendar or contact the parish office for more information. Additionally it can be a great habit to get into to pray for the conversion of others. The following Perpetual Help prayer below is a great example of one such prayer.

Perpetual Help Prayer for Conversions

Mary, Mother of Perpetual Help, thou knowest the great value of an immortal soul. Thou knowest that every soul has been redeemed by the Blood of thy Divine Son. Despise _, a great not my prayer for the conversion of sinner who is rapidly hurrying toward eternal ruin. God hast given the power to bring about the conversion of even the most wretched sinner. All that has been done for his soul has been done. If thou dost not came to his assistance, he will go from bad to worse. Obtain for him an effectual grace that he may be moved and brought back to God and his duties. Send him, if necessary, temporal calamities and trials, that he may enter into himself and put an end to his sinful course. Thou, O merciful Mother, hast converted so many sinners at the intercession of their friends. Be moved also by my prayer and bring this unhappy soul to true conversion of heart. O Mary, help! O Mother of Perpetual Help, show thyself as refuge of sinners! Amen.
