FATHER BROWN'S SUNDAY NOTES...

Happy 11th Anniversary to Mary Queen of Peace! It was eleven years ago today that the parishes of Corpus Christi and Our Lady of Good Counsel merged together to become this new parish of MQP! I think often about the past eleven years and it has gone by so quickly. I have enjoyed most of it – sometimes it is tough, but the people of this parish help immensely. **Your witness of faith is remarkable to me and inspires me on a daily basis.** Thank you for all you have done for Mary Queen of Peace – it is because of YOU that we are thriving today!

- ***I extend to you today a personal invitation...*** to join the Legion of Mary for their Annual Acies (*pronounced AH-cheez*). Each Legionary and Associate member consecrates themselves to Our Blessed Mother by renewing the Legionary Promise. Just as we renew our Baptismal Promises every year at Easter, it's important for each active and associate member of the Legion of Mary to renew their consecration. It is a brief ceremony, but very moving as each member comes forward to affirm his and her devotion and dedication to the Blessed Virgin Mary. I invite you to attend and to see for yourselves the great work of the Legion of Mary. We are presently having a membership drive for our Legion of Mary and encouraging new membership. I consider the good work of the Legion to be invaluable to our parish. **Come to the Acies TODAY at 1:30 pm in the Church to learn more about the good work of the Legion of Mary.** I am very committed to ensuring that the Legion of Mary continues at Mary Queen of Peace, but I remain concerned that without new members, the Legion will not survive. Please pray and consider becoming a member of the Legion of Mary.
- ***I have been asked to remind our parishioners and visitors...***that the Diocese of Cleveland presently requests that those who participate in congregational singing do so “softly as long as they are wearing their masks.” **Recently there have been some in attendance who are singing louder than the cantor at those Masses in which we have music. While I appreciate your joyful song to the Lord, I also ask that we allow the cantor to lead the singing. Thanks much for your cooperation.**
- ***We have a limited number of Mother's Day Intentions Cards available...***for you to pick up and use to remember your mom or someone that has been like a mom to you. There are three parts to each card: the card itself, which you can send to your recipient or keep as a reminder; the envelope to put the card in; and an intention envelope for you to write the name of your mom or other special person. **Those envelopes can be placed in the offertory baskets or dropped off at the Rectory and will be placed near the Tabernacle for Mother's Day.**
- ***We welcome our Knights of Columbus to the doors of Masses this weekend...***as they collect for their **Annual Measure-Up Campaign, which goes to support the developmentally challenged.** Please be generous as they only do this once a year!
- ***Some have asked me recently about Mass Intentions...*** so I thought a good review would be in order this week!

Mass Intentions may be offered for any person living or deceased. Only one intention, which may be for a single person or several, may be offered with each Mass. Mass intentions are available for daily Masses Monday through Friday at 6:15 am and 8 am; Saturdays at 8 am and 4:30 pm; and Sundays at 6:30 am. Please see Mary in the main vestibule of the church on Sunday mornings to schedule your Mass intentions or call the Rectory. There is a \$10 stipend requested for each Mass intention. **Presently, there are very few Mass Intentions available until September 2021.**

- ***I have found great spiritual benefits...***to the wearing of the “Cincture of St. Joseph”. Some of you may have not had the opportunity to have yours blessed or have a new one that you would like to have blessed. There will be a Blessing of St. Joseph Cinctures on the Feast Day of St. Joseph the Worker on Saturday, May 1st after the 8 am Mass.
- ***It is also First Saturday on May 1st...and we will have Eucharistic Adoration as well as the praying of the Holy Rosary and Confessions.*** There will also be time to meditate on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary as requested by Our Lady of Fatima to fulfill the Five First Saturdays. If you haven't started your Five First Saturdays, the month of May would be a great time to do it!
- ***The month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary...***so it is fitting that we have our **May Crowning on Sunday, May 2nd after the 11 am Mass.** As we hear the traditional hymn “Flowers of the Fairest”, Our Blessed Mother will be crowned as the Queen that she is! As the patron of our parish, I encourage everyone to attend the May Crowning. The Mass at 11 am that day is a Traditional Latin High Mass.
- ***Because this is one of those strange months...***where **First Saturday and First Friday are split by six days. Join us for First Friday on May 7th where there is Eucharistic Adoration from 8:30 am until 5:30 pm (for this month only).** There will be a temporary change to the time for our First Friday Devotions to the Sacred Heart - they will be at 5 pm, not 6 pm. In the evening, there will be a Latin Low Mass at 7 pm, followed by Eucharistic Adoration and Confessions.
- ***I am hoping that the weather will be pleasant...***so I may go out to visit our homebound parishioners for **First Friday on May 7th and bring them Holy Communion.** I ask that the homebound please meet me at the door if able or plan to see me outside. If you know anyone who would like a visit on First Fridays, please call the Parish Office.
- ***One of the things I missed the most last year...***is our Annual Prayer Service for Those Affected by Cancer. It is a moving service in which prayers are offered for all those afflicted with cancer, those who have lost loved ones to cancer, and cancer survivors. New this year is that we will be displaying luminaries for a small donation. **The Prayer Service for Those Affected by Cancer is on Saturday, May 8th at 7 pm.** Call the Parish Office for more information.
- ***In honor of Mother's Day...***the MQP Knights of Columbus will be distributing a special gift to all moms. **Don't forget to remember your mom – why not consid-**

er a gift card?

- **The traditional feast of the Ascension of the Lord...**has been on Thursday. There will be a **Traditional Latin Mass for the Ascension of the Lord on Thursday, May 13th at 6:30 pm.** Because the Bishops in our Metropolitan See desired to make the Ascension accessible to as many people as possible, the feast was moved to Sunday many years ago.
- **The next Catholic Movie Night...**is on **Sunday, May 16th at 6 pm – and this is a great one!** Come see **The Miracle of Our Lady of Fatima, a 1952 classic** that I think is one of the best Catholic movies around. It is fitting to show this movie during this month dedicated to Our Blessed Mother and close to the feast day of Our Lady of Fatima!
- **Bishop Malesic has given permission this year...** to pastors to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. I am looking forward to welcoming the *confirmandi* and their sponsors here at **Mary Queen of Peace on Saturday, May 22nd at the 4:30 pm Mass where I will celebrate this beautiful Sacrament of Initiation.** Please pray for those being confirmed.

I am pleased to offer my assistance today to one of my friends who every year organizes **“Rally for the Troops” which honors our military, veterans, and those who have given the ultimate sacrifice.** The **2021 Rally for the Troops will be at Rock N Roll City Harley Davidson on West 130th St.** Please pray for all those who serve in our armed forces, both home and abroad. The Promise of the FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS

On December 10, 1925, Our Blessed Mother promised Sister Lucia (from Fatima) that she would “...assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation...” all those who on the first Saturdays of five consecutive months confess, receive Holy Communion, pray a Rosary, and keep me company for a quarter of an hour mediating on the fifteen mysteries with the intention of offering me reparation.”

How to complete the Five First Saturdays devotion:
There are four requirements to faithfully fulfill the five first Saturdays

1. Go to Confession on the First Saturday itself or within eight days before or after
2. Receive Holy Communion (in the state of grace)
3. Pray five decades of the Rosary
4. Meditate for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary (separate from praying the Rosary)
5. During the apparition of February 15, 1926, Sister Lucia presented Our Lord the problem some people had if confessing on Saturdays. She asked Our Lord if the confession would be valid if done within a period of eight days before or eight days after the first Saturday. Our Lord answered: “Yes, it can even be within many more days, provided they are in the state of grace when they receive Me, and have the intention of offering reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.”

The Intention

To console the Immaculate Heart of Mary, offer reparation for the blasphemies and ingratitude of unrepentant sinners, and for peace in the world.

The Reason for this Devotion

On May 29, 1930 Our Lord explained to Sister Lucia why five First Saturdays.

“My daughter, the reason is simple. Against the Immaculate Heart of Mary, five kinds of offenses and blasphemies are committed:

- Those committed against the Immaculate Conceptions;
- Those committed against the virginity of Our Lady;
- Those committed against the Divine maternity, refusing at the same time, to accept her as the mother of men;
- Those committed by men who publicly attempt to instill indifference, scorn and even hatred for this Immaculate Mother in the hearts of children;
- Those committed by men who insult her directly in her statues.”

The Origin of the Five First Saturdays Devotion

On July 13, 1917, Our Lady appeared at Fatima to the three seers Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco, and revealed a three part secret to them. The first part was a vision of Hell, which was so terrible that Lucia later declared that it were not for Our Lady’s presence, they would have died of fright.

After the vision was over. Our Lady spoke thus: “You saw Hell, where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them God wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart in the world. If they do what I shall tell you, many souls will be saved, and there will be peace.

“The war [World War I] is going to end, but if they do not stop offending God, another even worse war will begin in the reign of Pius XI [World War II]. Behold, a night illuminated by an unknown light will be the sign that God shall give you that He is going to punish the world for its crimes by means of war, hunger, and persecutions of the Church and the Holy Father.

“To prevent it (the war) I will come to ask the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart, and the Communion of reparation on the first Saturday's. If they listen to my requests, Russia will convert and there will be peace; if not, it will spread its errors throughout the world, promoting wars and persecutions of the Church. The good will be martyred; the Holy Father will have much to suffer; and several nations will be annihilated. Finally, my Immaculate heart will Triumph.”

If you have cancer, are a cancer survivor, or lost a loved one to cancer please join us for a Cancer Prayer Service

on Saturday, May 8th at 7:00pm

We will also be having a Novena to St. Peregrine from April 23-May1, 2021 each day at 7:45, before the 8am Mass.

We will also have a **Light a Luminaria** to remember or honor a loved one touched by cancer.

A luminaria is a candle that will be lit and placed in the church during the prayer service. Each luminaria bears the name of the person who has battled cancer, is fighting cancer or survived cancer.

Luminarias are \$10 minimum donation each and will profit The Gathering Place, in partnership with Cleveland Clinic Taussig Cancer Center.
