# FATHER BROWN'S CHRISTMAS NOTES ...

My companion during the Holy Season of Advent and now Christmastide has been *The Liturgical Year*, the amazing 15-volume work by Dom Prosper Gueranger. I have had the full set for many years – I believe I received it as a gift at my priesthood ordination. During my priesthood, I have returned to it time and time again because of the wisdom contained within the many pages. I love what is written for Christmas and I share it with you today in an abbreviated form.

The time has now come for the faithful soul to reap the fruit of the efforts she made during the penitential weeks of Advent to prepare a dwelling-place for the Son of God, who desires to be born within her...let us, first, learn from the Church the duties which human nature and each of our souls owes to the Divine Infant...now that He is come, let us consider what is the homage we must pay Him. The Church offers to the Infant-God, during this holy season, the tribute of her profound adoration, the enthusiasm of her exceeding joy, the return of her unbounded gratitude, and the fondness of her intense love. These four offerings; adoration, joy, gratitude, and love must also be those of every Christian to his Jesus, his Emmanuel, the Babe of Bethlehem.

The first of our duties at our Savior's Crib is Adoration. Adoration is Religion's first act; but there is something in the Mystery of our Lord's Birth, which seems to make this duty doubly necessary. In heaven the Angels veil their faces and prostrate themselves before the throne of Jehovah...Let us endeavor to make, by our profound adorations, some return to the God who thus humbles Himself for us; let us thus give Him back some little of that whereof he has deprived Himself out of love for us, and in obedience to the will of His Father.

Come, then, faithful Children of the Church, let us take our share in her joy! This is not the season for sighing or for weeping. For unto us a Child is born (Isa. ix 6). He for whom we have been so long waiting is come; and He is come to dwell among us (St. John i 14). Great, indeed, and long was our suspense; so much the more let us love our possessing Him...but at present we must rejoice and be glad at His coming and sing round His Crib with the Angels.

Intimately and inseparably united with this exquisite mystic joy is the sentiment of gratitude. Gratitude is indeed due to Him who, neither deterred by our unworthiness nor restrained by the infinite respect which becomes His sovereign Majesty deigned to be born of His own creature, and have a stable for his birthplace...Gratefully, therefore, let us receive the precious gift – this Divine Babe, our Deliverer.

Shall our debt, then never be paid? Not so: we can pay it by love, which, though finite, gives itself without measure, and may grow forever in intensity. For this reason, the Church, after she offered her adorations and hymns and gratitude, to her Infant Savior, gives Him also her tenderest Love. What beautiful words! Merry Christmas to you and your loved ones and in a particular way, we remember those that are no longer with us.

- To celebrate the Nativity of the Lord and the Feast of the Holy Family today...there will be a simple After-Mass Sunday Social from 7 am to 1 pm. While I did not want to overcommit our Social Committee, they wanted to do offer some hospitality this morning. Please go downstairs to the Marian Lounge and support their efforts!
- Didn't get what you wanted for Christmas...then why not buy a few Cornhole Raffle tickets! We will be raffling off at least 15 Cornhole Board Sets – and these are indeed beautiful boards. They are made for any kind of weather and are a rich red and white. Cornhole bags are included – two red and two blue - and they are imprinted with MQP on them. Tickets are only \$10 each and the drawing will be on January 29th!
- Bring your own bottle(s) of wine to be blessed...in honor of Saint John the Evangelist on Monday, December 27<sup>th</sup> for the Annual Blessing of Wine. Saint John the Evangelist reportedly was at a banquet and served a goblet of poisoned wine without his knowledge. When he prayed over it, a serpent came slithering out. The Blessing of Wine will occur after the 6:15 and 8 am morning Masses.
- Come pray the Holy Rosary in our beautifully decorated church...with a Christmas Scriptural Rosary on Monday, December 27<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm in the church. If you have never prayed a Scriptural Rosary before, I encourage you to come and pray with us.
- Over the next couple of weeks, we are hosting...a Young Adult Swing Dance Group who like to get together and practice swing dancing! I appreciate their commitment to have wholesome fun and support their efforts.
- While it is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year... because it falls on a Saturday, we still will offer a full schedule of Masses for the Holy Day of Mary, the Mother of God. Even when we are not required to attend Holy Mass, it is laudable to do so and keeps us in the habit of attending on Holy Days so we do not fall into mortal sin. Masses for the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God will be on December 31<sup>st</sup> at 4:30 pm and on Saturday, January 1<sup>st</sup> at 6:30 and 8:30 am. Masses for the Octave Day of Christmas (Latin Mass) will be at 12 Midnight and 11 am.
- More information about the midnight Mass...on January 1<sup>st</sup> is as follows: Confessions will be heard from 10 pm to 11:45 pm on December 31<sup>st</sup> which will coincide with Eucharistic Adoration. At approximately 11:50 pm, we will pray together the *Te Deum*, an indulgenced act. A Latin Low Mass for the Octave Day of Christmas will be at 12 Midnight followed by the praying of the *Veni Creator* at approximately 12:45 am, which is also an indulgenced act. A New Year Social will conclude the morning!
- Masses for the Epiphany of the Lord...will be on Saturday, January 1<sup>st</sup> at 4:30 pm (Vigil) and on Sunday, January 2<sup>nd</sup> at 6:30 and 8:30 am. The 11 am Mass on Sunday, January 2<sup>nd</sup> will be for the Holy Name of Jesus. The Traditional Latin Mass calendar has retained the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6<sup>th</sup>. A Latin High Mass will be at 7 pm on Thursday, January 6<sup>th</sup>.
- You can pick up your own Epiphany Home Blessing Kit... at all Epiphany Masses. Ensure that you bless your house and write the traditional Epiphany inscription over your doorway. Chalk will be blessed beforehand.

- Offered only once a year...the Blessing of Epiphany Water, believed to be one of the most potent Holy Waters available, will be on the day BEFORE the traditional feast of the Epiphany. Water will be blessed on Wednesday, January 5th at 6:45 am and 7 pm. Please bring your own water and salt.
- Mark your calendar for both Community Meals...in the • month of January on January 2nd and January 16th. Community Meals remain both eat-in and take-out with doors opening to the Parish Center Cafeteria at 12 Noon. Meals are served inside from 1 to 1:30 pm and drivethrough from 1:30 to 2 pm. Please do not line up in your cars prior to 1:15 pm. Only one meal per person is permitted.
- In acknowledgment of the upcoming...Synod of Bishops on the topic of "synodality" we are asked to host "Listening Sessions" for the Synod at the parish level which will be recorded and presented to the Diocese of Cleveland who will collate results and submit to Rome. There will be two opportunities at Mary Queen of Peace for a Synod Listening Session: on Sunday, January 2<sup>nd</sup> at 12:15 pm in the Marian Lounge and on Tuesday, January 4<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm also in the Marian Lounge. This is your opportunity to have your voice heard for the upcoming Synod.
- Even though we will not have our Holy Rosary and Eucharistic Adoration...on January 1st for First Saturday, you can still comply with the request of Our Lady of Fatima by receiving Holy Communion and meditating in silence on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary for 15 minutes.
- First Friday is...January 7th and our regular schedule of First Friday Masses, Confessions and Prayers will be offered.
- If you want to learn more about the Legion of Mary...and it is an organization that I strongly support, plan to talk to one of the Legionnaires after the Vigil Mass on January 8<sup>th</sup> and all Masses on January 9<sup>th</sup>. Our parish Praesidium will have a Membership Drive for the Legion of Mary on that weekend. The Legion meets every Wednesday at 4:30 pm in the Rectory.
- We are planning a give-away...on Saturday, January 9<sup>th</sup> of hats, gloves and snow shovels - all you need to get through a Cleveland winter! More information will be coming soon.
- Our next Catholic Movie Night ... will be on Sunday, January 16<sup>th</sup> where we will view the classic 1948 Joan of Arc starring Ingrid Bergmann. It's a big Hollywood spectacle that tells the story of this amazing saint from France. Catholic Movie Night begins at 6 pm. Concessions available for only a dollar each!

During these days surrounding Christmas and New Year, please call the Rectory before coming here for parish business to ensure that we are open. I appreciate our parish staff and their good work and want to give them the opportunity to enjoy these days with their families. My prayers are for you and your loved ones as well and know of my greatest appreciation for your faithfulness!



#### Year-End Giving Opportunities

In this season of giving, consider making a year-end gift to our parish in gratitude for all the blessings you have received in life. As you plan to make the most of your charitable donations in 2021, know that we gratefully accept gifts of cash and appreciated assets such as stocks or bonds. We wanted to take this time to remind you of some important CARES Act provisions that are scheduled to expire at year's end. These provisions may affect you - and even make it easier for you to make a gift to your parish.

They include:

- An expanded charitable giving incentive that allows taxpayers who take the standard deduction to make up to \$300 in charitable cash contributions for single filers (\$600 for married couples) to qualified charities like ours this year.
- For those who do itemize their deductions, the law allows for cash contributions to qualified charities such as ours to be deducted up to 100% of your adjusted gross income for the 2021 calendar year.

And, if you are 70 1/2 or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish.
