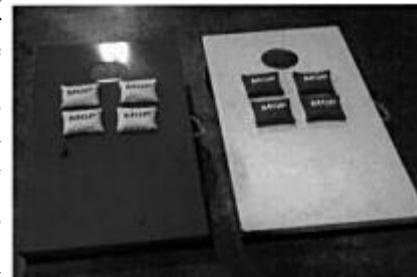

FATHER BROWN'S NEW YEAR'S NOTES...

Are you tired of my excerpts from *The Liturgical Year* by Dom Prosper Gueranger? Usually, my column includes those things which are on the top of my reading pile and lately it has been *The Liturgical Year*. Because today and Thursday are the two days for the Feast of the Epiphany, I thought I would share with you these beautiful words:

The Feast of the Epiphany is the continuation of the mystery of Christmas; but it appears on the Calendar of the Church with its own special character. Its very name, which signifies *Manifestation*, implies that it celebrates the apparition of God to His creatures.

For several centuries, the Nativity of our Lord was kept on this day; and when, in the year 376, the decree of the Holy See obliged all Churches to keep the Nativity on the 25th December, as Rome did – the Sixth of January was not robbed of all its ancient glory. It was still to be called the *Epiphany*, and the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ was also commemorated on this same Feast, which Tradition had marked as the day on which that Baptism took place...

The Epiphany is indeed a great Feast, and the joy caused us by the Birth of our Jesus must be renewed on it, for, as though it were a second Christmas Day, it shows us our Incarnate God in a new light. It leaves us all the sweetness of the dear Babe of Bethlehem, who hath appeared to us already in love; but to this it adds its own grand *manifestation* of the divinity of our Jesus. At Christmas, it was a few Shepherds that were invited by the Angels to go and recognize THE WORD MADE FLESH; but now, at the Epiphany, the voice of God Himself calls the whole world to *adore* this Jesus, and *hear Him*.

But let us return to the triumph of our sweet Savior and King. His magnificence is manifested to us so brightly on this Feast! Our mother, the Church, is going to initiate us into the mysteries we are to celebrate. Let us imitate the faith and obedience of the Magi: let us adore, with the holy Baptist, the divine Lamb, over whom the heavens open: let us take our place at the mystic feast of Cana, where our dear King is present, thrice *manifested*, thrice glorified.

Masses for the Epiphany are at 4:30 pm on Saturday, January 1st and at 6:30 am and 8:30 am on January 2nd. The Traditional Latin Mass celebrates the Epiphany on Thursday, January 6th at 7 pm.



- *In accordance with the request from the Holy Father...we will host two Listening Sessions for the Synod of Bishops on Synodality to take place in 2023.* Every parish is asked to host Listening Sessions to discuss the relevant issues facing our Church today. We will have two Listening Sessions this week. **The first one is TODAY at 12:15 pm and the second will be on Tuesday, January 4th at 6 pm.** Notes will be taken and forwarded on to the Diocese of Cleveland Office of Evangelization.
- *Welcome back...*to our MQP School students who return to classes on Tuesday, January 4th! Our faculty return on Monday, January 3rd for an in-service day.
- *We continue with our Community Meal TODAY...*and continue in the same manner as we have been offering in the past few months. Doors to the Parish Center Cafeteria open at 12 Noon and meals are served eat-in from 1 to 1:30 pm. You can pick up meals drive-through between 1:30 to 2 pm. If you are driving-through, please do not line up in your cars before 1:15 pm. **We also ask that if you are coming to the Community Meal, you do not arrive to the parish before 12 Noon. We cannot accommodate those who are not attending Mass to “hang out” in various places around the parish.** Thank you for your cooperation. Please remember that we only distribute one meal per person. There will also be a Community Meal on Sunday, January 16th.
- *Called the most “potent” of Holy Water...*a special Blessing of Epiphany Water will be offered on the day prior to the traditional Feast of the Epiphany. **The Blessing of Epiphany Water will be on Wednesday, January 5th at 6:45 am and 7 pm. Please bring your own water AND salt.**
- *First Friday is January 7th...*and I think that a great New Years Resolution would be to make the Nine First Fridays. There are 12 promises that I encourage you to take a look at that may inspire you to make the Nine First Fridays if you have never done it before. The 12th promise and maybe the most convincing promise is this: **“I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who communicate on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.”** What powerful words that beautifully describe devotion to the Sacred Heart. See you on First Friday!
- *A special give-away...*called “Winter Warm-Up” will help provide hats, gloves and snow shovels to all in need! **It will take place on Saturday, January 8th at 10 am in the upper parking lot.** Only one package of winter gear per vehicle or family.
- *I am grateful for the good work...*done by the Legion of Mary during their existence at Mary Queen of Peace.

However, because of some recent changes, our membership has dropped somewhat. We are looking for new members! I am a proud Legionnaire and encourage you to join as well. Meetings are generally on Wednesdays at 4:30 pm in the Rectory. A membership drive will be happening next weekend. Please learn more about the Legion of Mary and consider being a part of their good work.

- **Our next After-Mass Sunday Social...** will be on **Sunday, January 9th from 7 am to 1 pm. Come downstairs to the Marian Lounge and enjoy hot coffee and great food!** We only ask for a donation for anything you take. Thanks to our great AMSS Committee for their help in promoting community and fellowship.
- **Welcome back to our...CCD students who return to classes on Sunday, January 9th.** Remember that if you have a student in public or charter school, please enroll them in CCD classes. It will help them to learn more about our Catholic faith. Classes are held on Sunday mornings from 9:30 to 10:45 am in the school building.
- **Please note...**that this month the **Mobile Food Pantry will be on Saturday, January 22nd from 9 to 11 am** because the Cleveland Food Bank is closed the previous weekend for Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day.
