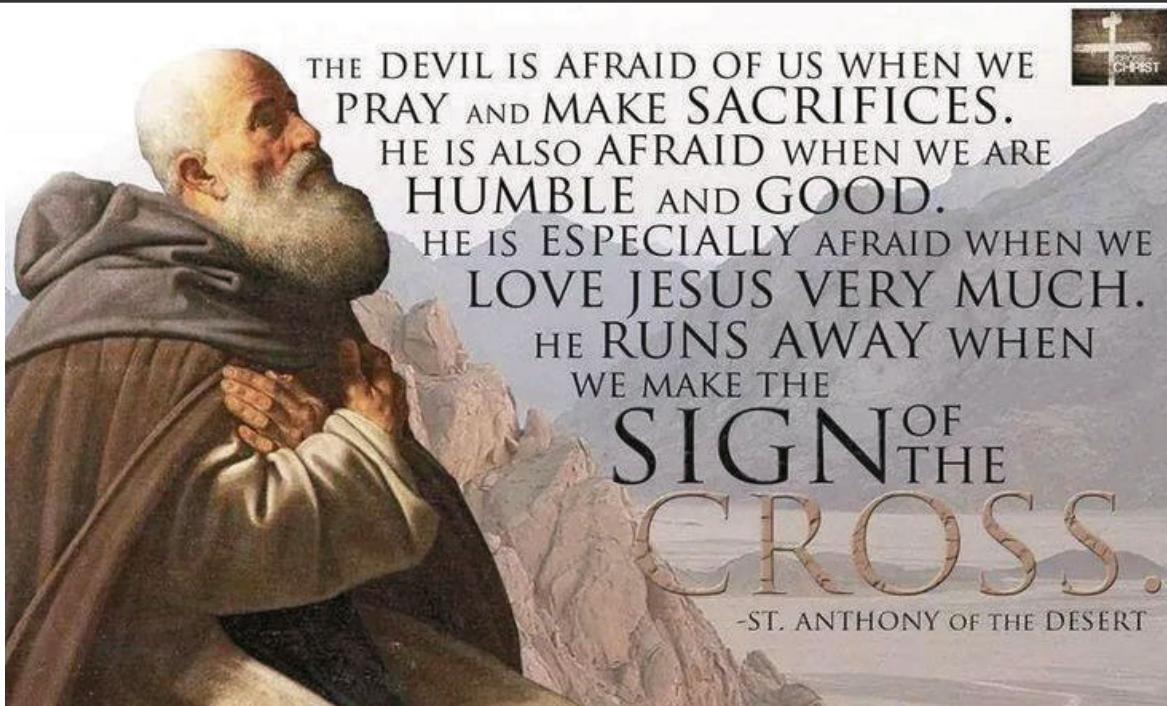

FATHER BROWN'S SUNDAY NOTES...

This month of January is often devoted to the hidden life of Jesus, that time which lasted from His return to Nazareth after being found in the temple by His parents when He was just twelve-years old, to the age of thirty. These words from The Most Reverend Louis Laravoire Morrow from his classic *My Catholic Faith* offer a great perspective for our prayers. He wrote:

“By His hidden life Jesus Christ teaches us to learn holiness and wisdom before we presume to teach others. He teaches us, by living in obscurity, to fight against our vanity, which makes us desire to be doing only what seems great and important, which makes us desire to be praised and noticed. By His hidden life Our Lord teaches us to subdue our pride, to live day after day without impatience or complaint, unknown to the world, and even despised, if that is the will of God for us; then we shall have true peace of heart. And so Jesus teaches, “Learn from Me, for I am meek and humble of heart” (St. Matthew 11:29). For long years of obscurity in Nazareth, He was just “a carpenter’s son.”

These words remind of the importance of humility and that we do not always need to be recognized or even acknowledged for the good things we do. God sees all and knows what is in our heart. The praise and acclamation of others means nothing when we reside in the eternal splendor of Heaven!

I said that as long as we had people who were willing to offer the prayers, we should continue. Please consider attending **the Blue Army Holy Hour TODAY at 2 pm in the Church** where you will find a beautiful hour of prayers and devotions to Our Lady of Fatima.
- **The great French saint...**Joan of Arc is honored in TONIGHT'S Catholic Movie night showing of the 1948 classic *Joan of Arc* starring **Ingrid Bergman**. It is free admission and there will be refreshments available for only one dollar! I will offer some interesting trivia about the movie before and after so don't be late! **Catholic Movie Night starts at 6 pm in the Parish Center Upper Hall**. As I have said, this is a longer movie – almost two hours and thirty minutes – so you might want to bring something soft to sit upon!

It will provide IMPORTANT information about the Sacramental Preparation required.

- **With so much illness around...**it seems timely for the Annual Blessing of Throats in honor of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, who once saved a young child from choking. Two blessed candles are placed near the throat and the blessing is offered. **The Blessing of Throats will be available after the Vigil Mass on Saturday, January 29th and all Masses on Sunday, January 30th.**
- **Candlemas...**is a beautiful bright light in the dreary days of February. Instead of Groundhog Day, celebrate Candlemas when candles are carried in procession just as Our Blessed Mother carried the Christ child into the temple. **Masses will be at 6:15 am (Latin), 8 am (English), and 7 pm (Latin High Mass) on Feb. 2nd.**

On New Year's Eve, I was called out to Fairview Hospital as a Chaplain for the Cleveland Police, where Cleveland Police personnel had gathered because of the murder of a CPD Officer, Shane Bartek. While the sorrow of his family and Academy classmates and friends cannot be measured, the entire city has been in sorrow. It has not been the easiest time for me, and I have been blessed to be able to be a small part of his funeral services. Please keep this family in your prayers as well as all of my brothers and sisters in blue who serve and protect us every day. **This is the prayer I said at the Funeral Service for Shane Bartek:**

O Almighty God, whose great power and eternal wisdom embraces the universe, watch over all police and law enforcement officers. Protect them from harm in the performance of their duty to stop crime, robberies, riots and violence. We pray, help them keep our streets and homes safe, day and night. We commend them to Your loving care, because their duty is dangerous. Grant them Your unending strength and courage in their daily assignments. Dear God, protect these brave men and women. Grant them Your almighty protection. Unite them safely with their families after their duty has ended, and when their duty on this earth is over, may they be as proud to guard the throne of God, as they have been to guard Your city here below. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

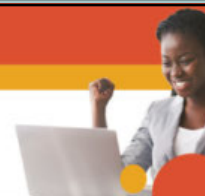
