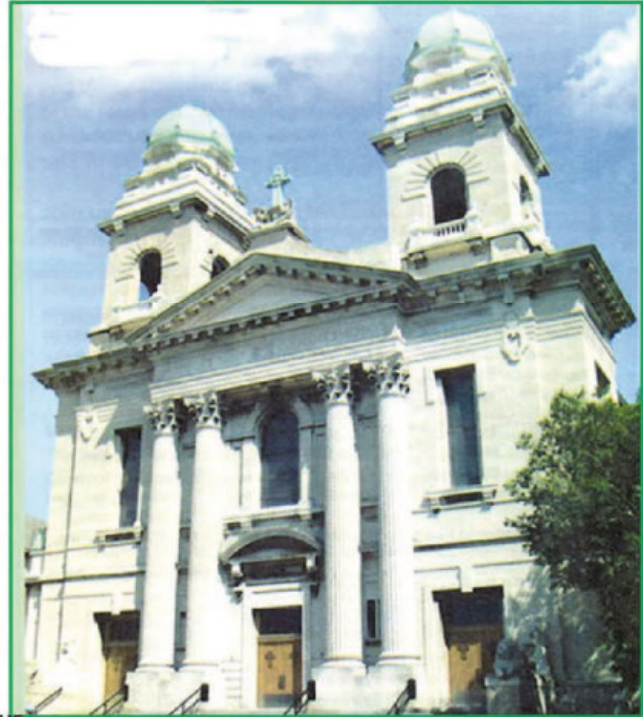

Reflection 2nd Sunday of Lent.
