

I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around their necks. Is it OK to do that?



The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the

respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.



This week's message from Fr. Dave....

I have been waiting for this last weekend of 2020 to come and go! As many have said to me, "I want the year 2020 behind us." I think everyone can resonate with that statement. Not to put a damper on anyone's parade but I believe we still have some way to go through this new year before life returns to something called "normal". I want to take time in the early weeks of 2021 and reflect on what happened to us this past year. Can we take something positive away from the difficulties we encountered over the last nine months? What did I learn about myself when I cannot control a situation that is dictating the way I live, work, and worship? What do we take away from the last year that will make our faith stronger in the years to come?

Three men from the East visit Jesus on this feast of the Epiphany. They were magi who understand travel by way of the stars in the sky. When they appear before Jesus at his birth they are astounded. They are so caught up in the revelation of Jesus that they cannot help but pay him homage and open their coffers and present gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These three men have never seen anything like this. Nothing could have predicted that God's Epiphany would come in a remote place among these foreign visitors.

I wonder if there will be an "epiphany" for us both individually and collectively as to the deeper understand of experiencing a global wide pandemic. I have heard it said more than once over the last several months, "What is God saying to the world through this catastrophic event?"

Over the past couple of months, I have celebrated weddings that were postponed from earlier in the year due to COVID. The reason given as to rescheduling later in 2020 was the powerful fact the bride and groom love each other. "We do not want to wait any longer and most important to us is to be married." It is love that called several couples not to delay any longer, their love for one another summoned them to marriage. I admire the couples for the fact that they had to simplify their wedding plans and fewer people were here for their wedding liturgy.

The power of love can help us persevere and it can also help us drive furiously towards the goal of newness in life – like getting married. This is one of the epiphanies I saw first-hand through this last year. I have also witnessed people reaching out to each other with more kindness and more patience. I have seen empathy and the presence of loved ones as they experienced the death of a family member.

This past year has not been easy for most people. I have seen families struggle, people lose their jobs or having to close their businesses. Here at church the declining numbers in our attendance have been somewhat offset by those who view on our Livestream. Our young people having to learn remotely from their own homes. In so many ways we have endured the past nine months and I believe we will continue to persevere until necessary.

This coming week we have the Holyday of Mary, the Mother of God. Our Vigil Mass will be on Thursday, December 31st at 4:30PM and Mass on January 1st, New Year's Day at 9AM. I cannot think of anyone better to turn to than Mary at the beginning of this year. Her modeling of discipleship and faith gave her incredible endurance to observe everything that Jesus went through in his life.

As we begin this new year, I pray that we all get an extra boost of faith to sustain us through the winter months and to hopefully meet the world when "normal" returns! We often speak of New Year resolutions, how about a faith that is built on our relationship with Christ. If we need strengthening in our relationship with Christ, then we need to put forth the effort to make that happen. My resolution is to pray for all of you and especially those most affected by the events of 2020 for the gaining of a perseverance and patience focused on Christ who loves us beyond all telling. As St. Paul tells us, "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things. Love never fails." I hope we might discover more of what St. Paul is telling us all.

Our next Adult Education opportunity will begin Tuesday, January 5th at 7PM on Zoom. The Book we will be using is entitled, "Rescued: The Unexpected and Extraordinary News of The Gospel." The author is Fr. John Riccardo, a priest from the Archdiocese of Detroit. The book is a clear and concise read. Please call Debbie Lokar if you will be joining us for these classes or if you need us to order the book. We will be meeting every Tuesday night until February 23rd.

Let us keep in mind all those suffering in anyway through the pandemic and those separated from their families. Keep in your prayers the many people who are suffering from cancer and all other life-threatening diseases. Keep in mind the unemployed in their search for a new job. Pray for those struggling in relationships including family members. Most important, offer thanks to God for sustaining us through the difficult and trying days of 2020. My best to you and your family in 2021. Keep the Faith!



This provision is in effect only for the 2020 tax year.*** And, if you are 70 ½ or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish.

Anyone who attended the first Bible Trivia we hosted in the Spring quickly learned that, while I was raised in a Christian home, I wasn't raised Catholic.

(I included several questions in that week's Bible Trivia where the Catholic answer differs from the Protestant answer, such as "how many books in the Bible?") It proved good for some hearty laughs!

I'll never forget the morning when Fr. Norm (predecessor to Fr. Dave) asked me (loudly) in the Gathering Area following Mass "Shari, would you like to become a Catholic?" I think he was trolling for RCIA candidates, and I was ripe for the pickings as I'd been volunteering for Joseph House and other Divine Word ministries. I suggested to him that we schedule a meeting where we could talk further about what that might mean for me.

At a meeting later that week, I indicated to Fr. Norm that there were a couple of concepts of the Catholic faith that I wasn't sure I'd utilize, and I asked if that would prevent me from becoming Catholic. We then launched into the really important tenets of the Catholic faith (or, for that matter, Christianity in general). Upon expressing wholehearted agreement with the Creed, we moved forward. The essence of what I believe includes: that we have one loving God, Jesus is the Son of God and was born of the Virgin Mary, Jesus lived, died and was resurrected to cover our sins and make us whole. He will come again. The Eucharist is our spiritual food and remembrance of Jesus. The Holy Spirit completes the Trinity (a true trinita for us believers). Plus, we can look forward to heaven when our time on earth is completed.

Jesus and all He did for us, of course, is central to our beliefs. This season of preparing to celebrate His birth is amazing. Particularly this year, I think focusing on the gift of Jesus and what Christmas represents to us is especially useful. So much is beyond our control these days, but Jesus, our loving God, and the Holy Spirit continue to be at our side guiding our lives. And for that we can be grateful and joyful.
