Why do parishes have the Blessed Sacrament in a separate room?

While many Catholics of a certain age have memories of the Blessed Sacrament being housed in the tabernacle on the high altar of the church, many parishes in the decades since the Second Vatican Council have chosen to build a separate space — a reservation chapel — where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. Although this practice is not universal, it is in keeping with the guidance offered by the US Bishops in their document *Built of Living Stones* (see nos 77-78). The goal is to create a space that is separated from the nave and sanctuary, but which is “integrally connected with the church” which can foster “reverence and can provide the quiet and focus needed for personal prayer.” This can be especially important for communities that have continuous Eucharistic Adoration, allowing people to come and pray in a space separate from the normal activities of parish life.

The practice of reserving the Eucharist in a separate space — or in a dignified location away from the altar where Mass is celebrated — is that it emphasizes the importance of the liturgy itself, which is the “source and summit” of the life of the Church.

As with many things in the Church, the practice of placing the tabernacle in the sanctuary or in a separate chapel is not universal (as can be seen in visits to historic churches in Rome and other places). The important thing is that as communities question where to place the tabernacle, they listen to the voice of the Church, explore the ancient and varied liturgical tradition of the Church, consider the needs and life of the community, and also take into account the architecture and limits of the spaces they might already have.



This week's message from Fr. Dave....

“Behold, the Lamb of God.” This is how John describes Jesus’ would-be disciples. They are more than curious upon hearing John’s description and without hesitation they follow the

Lamb. You see, the Jewish understanding of the lamb was as a sacrificial offering. This bold offering to God was to remind them of times past, especially the freeing of slavery from Egypt. The Lamb was a reminder that God is always present to the people of Israel. The Lamb on a more personal level was an offering that lifted one’s alienation of sin and brings unity to God and his people.

As they follow Jesus, he does what anyone else would wonder why they are closing in on him. He asks the right question, “What are you looking for?” The question carries with it more than just the thought that we are going wherever you go. Rather, the question also implies they are looking for greater satisfaction in life. Almost as if to say their lives have an emptiness that needs to be filled. They follow Jesus because John’s description leads them to what they need – The Lamb of God!

The disciples never offer an answer to that question but respond with a question of their own, “Rabbi, where are you staying?” They want to spend time with the Lamb who can satisfy their own lacking or emptiness in life. If he is the Lamb of God, then he can give to the world what it needs. The disciples will have their own opinion as to how the Lamb will give them a better life, but they will never suspect it will be through the ultimate act of sacrificing the life of the Lamb.

Jesus’ response to where he is going is a rather distinctive one, “Come and you will see.” I believe the author of the gospel of John wants us to clearly understand that it is not the “where” that is as important as the “with whom.” He is the Lamb, and he will sacrifice for the sake of the world. You can only discover that by spending time with the Lamb. This is great news for us because the Lamb is in no one place, the Lamb will be always everywhere for us!

Here is the thought that is not yet clear concerning these two disciples who take it upon themselves, after hearing John the Baptist, to follow Jesus. The description “Lamb of God” is more than an attractive lure. The disciples are “looking” for something this world cannot give. Jesus will become the way, the truth, and the life for

them. He will be the sacrificial Lamb who will lead them to the offering of self on the cross and to the emptiness of a tomb on Easter morning. They could not have imagined as they stayed with Jesus that first day that the events to come will reflect beyond this world.


I hope many of you know about the St. Joseph Consecration for 2021. The Pope declared this year as *The Year of St. Joseph*. This consecration will begin on February 15th. We begin this process thirty-three days before the feast of St. Joseph (March 19). The book by Donald H. Calloway will guide us through the consecration. You can register to be a part of this consecration and order the book in the Gathering Area or call the parish office. The book will offer us about ten minutes each day of thoughts and prayers pertaining to St. Joseph. His part in the raising of Jesus as an infant, child and adolescent is often forgotten. Joseph serves as the guiding and protective presence for both Mary and their child. I hope you might take the time each day and join us in our reflection on Joseph’s life and seek his intercession. The book will come free of charge and we look forward to making this available to everyone in the parish.

Since we are now in Ordinary Time for the Church year it is only right to count down the days until Lent. Can you imagine that Lent begins exactly one month from today on Wednesday, February 17th? I hope you take the time to see what you might do to enhance your spiritual lives. You might consider the Consecration to St. Joseph as a good way to enter Lent. You might consider a new practice to the faith that could enhance your awareness of God: adoration on Mondays at the church, daily Mass at 8:30AM, adding a rosary to your daily prayer, the liturgical hours for the days of Lent, reading on the saints through the season of Lent, or reading the shortest gospel of Mark throughout the season of Lent to properly prepare for Holy Week. I hope and pray that this Lent will be a guiding force that leads us to newer and brighter light out of our worldwide pandemic.

I hope and pray all is good for everyone in your family. My prayer continues to be for the betterment of our world and for the safety and health of everyone in our parish. Please know you are not too far away from my prayers each day. Keep the faith – Have a great week!


Next Adult Education Book Series

St. Joseph Consecration




Prayer Shawl Ministry

A Faith-Filled Life

Thanks for patiently awaiting the January 3rd financial report while I took care of arrangements for Mom. Many of you have dealt with the loss of a loved one during COVID. In Mom's case, it took away the immediate opportunity to gather -- and grieve and celebrate a life -- with others. But we'll celebrate Mom's life when it's safe to do so, and in the meantime, she's now peacefully buried with Dad in New Hampshire.



Mom was a woman filled with faith -- faith was part of her daily life. And she wasn't afraid to share her faith. Why is it that I can sometimes feel awkward about sharing my faith with others? Precisely what harm can it do, particularly when the world is so unreliable and people are anxious and in need of something other than world news and "reality" TV?

I had so many calls, emails and texts from people who told me how much Mom's faith helped to guide them to a faith-filled life. One of my favorite stories follows ...

For the three years prior to COVID, I had two out-of-town friends visit for a week each summer. One is a staunch atheist. Following Mom's passing, her note to me read: "Believe it or not, one of the topics I enjoyed listening to your Mom talk about was her faith. So pure." I can remember during my friends' visits sometimes thinking "oh my gosh, Mom, you're going to offend my friend -- don't say that!" But I never stopped Mom from sharing her faith, and now I'm so grateful I didn't!




