

# Q A

**I get annoyed with myself when I am distracted while I pray. Is it a sin? How can I be more attentive?**

The mind is a marvelous and complex thing, producing amazing thoughts, images, wisdom and inspiration. Yet at times it is like a two-year-old: it does not follow directions, does what it wants and loves to tell us “no!” This is probably the oldest and most common problem in the spiritual life-dealing with distraction. It comes in all forms: good intentions forgotten, wandering thoughts at Mass, daydreaming, etc. A little poem says it all: When the soul begins to pray, the brain always wants to play!

There are many ways to handle distractions. If we are distracted by thoughts about our families or friends, we should pray for them. If we lose our focus, we need just “re-collect” ourselves. If some worry or concern just won't leave our mind, then we deal with it and come back to prayer or make it part of our prayer. And when words just won't come, the only prayer we might offer is our presence, our suffering, and our desire to be close to the Lord. Most importantly, we need to be patient with ourselves. These things are not sinful, but reminders of our human frailty. Our weaknesses and good efforts are all acceptable to God, who reads the love in our hearts and the good intentions of our minds.



### *This week's message from Taylor Long....*

This week Father Dave asked if I would write his column, as he is out of town getting some much needed rest and rejuvenation.

I am going to be honest, I read this week's gospel and immediately thought to myself, "There is absolutely no way I can reflect on this passage." I was kind of bummed that I did not get an easier passage to dissect. But, something I have learned over the years is that God always gives us what we need, at the perfect timing. I would come to find this out, through sitting with and processing this passage.

Sometimes you have to re-read things a hundred times, or on different days to see it in a different perspective. So, that is what I did. I even asked other people to read it and tell me what they thought. Finally, I asked my friend in the seminary what he got from the reading and one of the things he said struck me. "Jesus has everything to do with our lives and our hearts. And we can go to him for anything and everything." My friend was spot on, and it paved the way for my reflection.

I think sometimes we forget how much Jesus wants to be a part of everything we do. I'm sure that some of us only go to Jesus in the good moments, and hide from him in the bad, or vice versa. Maybe we are struggling with something and think we can get through it alone, but we truly need Jesus to help guide us.

In the gospel reading the man with the unclean spirit cried out to Jesus and said, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" The man automatically assumed that Jesus would not want to be with him because he was unclean, but that was far from the truth. Even though the man questioned Jesus' intentions, Jesus still commanded the unclean spirit in him, out. Simply telling us that Jesus has EVERYTHING to do with us.

No matter where we are in life right now, struggling, in a period of suffering, or a period of great joy, Jesus is calling us to come out of hiding and let Him love us. To me this passage that I thought was impossible to decipher, now screams with a theme of hope. Hope that if we run into the arms of the one who loves us the most, He will continue to guide us. I pray this passage can

become a sign of hope for you as well as we get closer and closer to the season of lent.

So many of us are looking for little signs of hope and trying so hard to remember the immense love Jesus has for us right now. For me some days it is so hard. It is easy to feel hopeless, it is easy to fall into the lie that Jesus is not with me. I have to constantly list off the good things I have in my life, or find ways to see something positive coming from the things that are not as great.

One sign of hope for me right now is the power of Saint Joseph. I am so unbelievably excited to participate in this consecration with you all and overwhelmed with the response we have gotten from it. It was a true blessing to share my personal story with you all two weekends ago. There is so much power and beauty in being vulnerable and sharing your journey of faith with the people around you.


A second sign of hope is the Illuminate Youth Group. This group of girls have a child-like faith and curiosity to grow in relationship with Christ and serve others. It is so inspiring to see 15 and 16 -year old-girls dedicated to their time spent at the church. With that being said, I signed us up to attend Catholic Heart Work Camp in Memphis, Tennessee this summer in great hopes to give them the opportunity to only dive deeper. The camp not only gives them the opportunity to dive more into their own faith lives, but to share their faith with other people across the country through different service and prayerful opportunities. I am praying for you all this next week and I am challenging you to find one sign of hope in your life right now. If you feel called, you can even write me a little paragraph about the "sign" and email it to me. Also, if you have time, listen to the song *Out of Hiding* by Steffany Gretzinger, pray with it, and sign up for the consecration to Saint Joseph.



## St. Joseph Consecration







### A Word about our Finances

Because our fiscal year runs July 1 – June 30<sup>th</sup>,

when it came time to budget last May, it was a daunting task. Who knew how long the pandemic would last? Who knew if we'd have a Reverse Raffle fundraiser? Who knew if people would grow weary of giving if they couldn't participate in the Mass in person? Who knew how long we'd be investing in masks and sanitizers and extra cleaning solutions and supplies? There were just so many unknowns.



At the time, I thought it wise to err on the side of caution. I believed in my heart that our parishioners would be supportive, but I also couldn't anticipate the impact the pandemic might have on their lives and finances. The outcome? I low-balled the anticipated offertory. The result? We look fabulous in the above-noted stewardship report! The reality? Offertory is actually down about \$11,000 from this same time last year, and total revenue is down just shy of \$21,000. At the same time, expenses are down by about \$44,000 so our heads remain well above water. That remains an immense show of God's provision for Divine Word. The continued support of parishioners in these uncertain times is amazing!

I want to mention how grateful I am to our Finance Council. They carefully review the budget and all financial documents on a quarterly basis (as well as in between quarterly meetings), and they provide amazing guidance and support to Fr. Dave and to me. Divine Word has an abundance of marvelous volunteers.
