Q Why do we use incense at Mass?

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).



This week's message from Fr. Dave....

I am often intrigued by the faith displayed throughout the scriptures. How can anyone imagine what was going through the mind of Abraham as he is taken to the brink of sacrificing his own son for the sake of his faith in God? On the other end, the disciples are taken in by the incredible vision of Christ now glorified at his transfiguration. They are so stuck on this moment they do not want to leave the mountain. They want to squeeze as much out of the experience as possible. Abraham's faith is the arduous work of listening and discerning the divine will of God. He stayed loyal to his relationship to God, no matter the circumstances he faced in life. The disciples will come to realize moments like the transfiguration come very infrequently.

The power of these two events is what comes next. What does Abraham do with this event of displaying extraordinary faith? What do the disciples do once they are down the mountain from the transfiguration of Jesus? These are life changing moments. They will probably never see or experience anything in life like this again. Yet, these moments will profoundly affect how they treat others, how they see the world, how they display empathy toward others, and most important how they live out their faith.

Abraham in the Old Testament and the disciples at the transfiguration of Jesus must go back to the realities of life. They must come back to their day-to-day existence but not without a faith that is called to be lived and shared. I believe Abraham and the disciples needed these experiences. The sacrifice called of Abraham will give him the knowledge that God is not about us asking to take life. Rather, God will bless Abraham abundantly in many ways and for many generations. God is about giving life. The disciples will carry with them Jesus' glory into life. They will see him differently from this moment, but also live knowing of his glory. They will ultimately go forth bringing Jesus to the world.

How can we find ourselves inspired by these powerful moments from scripture? Abraham displays the power of faith. In those moments of death, we are reminded that the hope of life always wins out. The disciples are so caught up in what they see at the transfiguration it makes their sight shrink. However, we know that the sight Jesus gives to us through his ministry opens us to the varied and vast realities of life. The kind of eyesight that makes us sensitive to the difficulties of others and the troubles of the world. What we have is a faith that helps see through the cross and the empty tomb and

that Jesus has done for us what he calls us to do for others – to give life and hope!

We are asking parishioners to fill out a survey to assist with a parish-wide and diocesan-wide initiative. 
Remember, there will be Stations of The Cross in the church on the Fridays of Lent. Due to Confirmation this coming Friday night there will be no Stations of the Cross.

This week instead of giving you details about the consecration, I wanted to be able to share some things that parishioners have been saying about the process and impact this consecration has had on them.



It's a Dog's Life

In the 16th century, that statement indicated that life was hard. But in today's pampered pet world, "it's a dog's life" is intended to imply that life is "cushy."



I've had the pleasure of working for Divine Word for two and a quarter years. During that time, I've seen firsthand how hard our priests work. I think there's sometimes a perception that their life is cushy. I can assure you that it's nothing of the sort.

Fr. Dave has one day a week off, in his case, Thursday. He has one day a week off **if** there's not a funeral, an anointing, an urgent need for counsel, a need to plan a funeral, etc. His weekends are taken up by Masses and reconciliations and weddings and funerals. His mornings start by opening (and heating or air conditioning) the church before 7 AM. Many evenings there are meetings (now Zoom meetings) that last until 8 or 9 PM. Twelve and fourteen hour days are not at all uncommon for him.

If Fr. Caddy is a good example of retired, then I never want to retire. Pre-COVID, that man was up and out of the house most weekday mornings before I arrive at work (between 8 and 8:30 AM). His days are filled with NDCL activities, visits to nursing homes to serve Mass and anoint residents, visiting the homebound with communion, etc. He's now 83 and sometimes my 60-year-old mind and body get tired just watching him serve others.

We are blessed to have two selfless and incredibly dedicated men of God serving our parish. Each of them has amazing gifts that they lend to us daily – often including on their day off. How blessed we are.






