Q What's the difference between priests and brothers, friars, etc.?


A The distinctions titles and categories used for priests and the male members of religious communities can be confusing, especially since the categories can sometimes be intertwined as a man can be both a priest and a monk, or a brother and a friar. So, to help to piece the puzzle together, it's important to begin by noting some basic distinctions:

The distinction between priests (who are ordained for sacramental ministry) and brothers (who are non-ordained members of religious communities and who are committed to lives of prayer and service).

Priests: A priest is a man who has been ordained for sacramental ministry and these fall into two categories: A) Diocesan (or Secular) Priests can either be attached to a diocese and who serve under a bishop. Their ministry is usually oriented toward pastoral service. B) Religious Priests are members of religious communities (like the Franciscans, Jesuits, Salvatorians, or Carmelites) and their lives are guided by the special mission and charism of their community. While both kinds of priest practice sacramental ministry, their spirituality and how they live out their priesthood can be very different.

Brothers: Brothers are non-ordained members of religious communities (such as those mentioned above) who live lives committed to prayer and service. Religious priests and brothers serve together in their communities and their ministries include much more than the care of parishes.

Monks, Friars, and Canons: These are broad categories that include religious priests and brothers, and each of these is connected to specific ways of life and spiritualities. ©LPi



This week's message from Fr. Dave....

Over the last several weeks we have made plans to push forward to renovate the altar area, choir area, and the baptismal font area. We will be replacing the green carpeting in the sanctuary with tile. The carpeting is now 22 years old. We are designing a new altar that will be stationary in the sanctuary. The altar we have now can be easily moved, but with the new design the altar will be placed in a stationary position in the sanctuary. The ambo will be replaced to match the altar. We will add a ramp to make the sanctuary accessible for those with disabilities. We will have new candlesticks around the altar and a new holder for the paschal candle. The choir area will have new carpeting.

The baptismal font has never properly worked in the sixteen years I have been here. The plumbing needs to be reworked. We are going to take the entire font out where it is located and replace it with a new baptismal font that will be in the same area. We have met with finance council, discussed this with parish council, talked with our parish staff, and received input from several parishioners who were a part of the expansion of the church in 1999.

If you remember when we began the Heart of a Shepherd Appeal for the Seminary, thanks to your generosity, we have the money to make many of these changes in the church. Hopefully, you remember back on Sunday, November 17, 2019, I spoke at Mass explaining in detail the purpose of the Campaign and that the money allocated back to the parish would be for the purpose of renovation in the sanctuary and the baptismal font.

This will be a major change for the interior of the church. My hope is the renovation will bring greater "light" to the church. I am excited and somewhat nervous that this works out for enhancing worship in our parish. I would ask that you pray for this project to meet its right end. I am grateful to everyone who has given much needed input to make this happen. Our hope is to have this entire project done by the new school year in the Fall. If you have any questions about the renovation, please let me know.

Jesus shows us a side of his personality we rarely see in scripture. It is a shock to imagine Jesus armed with a corded whip, driving traders and moneychangers out of the Jerusalem Temple, and overturning their tables. Jesus' outburst is the only way he can claim the Temple as a place of prayer and worship to his father. The preparations for Passover brought more people to the Temple but in Jesus' mind did not give anyone an excuse for their

behavior. His cleansing of the Temple gives us a great opportunity to see what we need to clear out of our own hearts.

We are asking parishioners to fill out a survey to assist with a parish-wide and diocesan-wide initiative. "Called for More" is a process to help each parish and the diocese see the strengths and the areas of ministry that we need to strengthen in the near future. Please help us by participating in a 10-15 minute survey on line or you can pick up a hard copy of the survey in the Gathering Area along with an envelope. We are trying to get the highest response rate possible. This information will help us as we plan for the future. We will receive the results of the surveys that have been submitted later this year. Thank you for your help in this matter!

Our Easter Food Collection will continue until March 25th. Please bring your non-perishable food items and drop them in the bins located in the Gathering Area. As we continue through the season of Lent, I hope that your spiritual life has been strengthened.

Please keep up on the Consecration to St. Joseph. We have Zoom meetings on Tuesdays at 11AM, Wednesdays at 7PM, and Thursdays at 7PM throughout the Consecration. I hope to see you at one of the meetings on-line. Keep pushing forward through the outside noise of COVID and all that comes with it. Feed the soul through prayer and worship. Stay connected to us through the Livestream on Sundays at 8:30AM.



Keep reading and keep praying. St. Joseph still has much more in store for us.






Singalong Blessings




