



Q What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?

A The practice of making a “spiritual communion” dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aquinas described it as “an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him.” Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass, or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion.

Although the graces offered in spiritual communion are not the same as those offered in the sacramental communion of the Mass, this practice is still a powerful opportunity to express our desire for union with the Lord and to be united with Christ and the Church, even in an imperfect way. ©LPi





This week's message from Fr. Dave....

We started the weekend with a two-hour Staff Meeting and I came away from the time with our Staff feeling good about the next couple of months. I really believe we will see some major light at the end of the tunnel by the middle of the summer. That being the case, it is exciting to talk about in-person meetings, taking communion to nursing homes and to our shut-ins, our Youth Mission Trip, and possible hospital visits. We all know all these possibilities rely on the continued downturn of the COVID Virus. I pray every day that it will leave us alone, so we have more leverage to do our ministry.

I am so grateful for all those who have come forward to clean and sanitize our church on Sunday mornings, those who clean our church weekly and wash our liturgical vessels, and those responsible for cleaning our altar linens. In many ways these people have served the parish in a most important way. As we proceed to Holy Week, I am hoping that more people will feel safe about joining us at liturgy on the weekends. Remember we have our 8:30AM Sunday Mass Livestreamed and then archived on our website.

As we celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we are also completing the consecration of St. Joseph immediately after the 11AM Mass. We will use the prayers of consecration and make this journey over the last several weeks more meaningful. I hope that those who have participated in the consecration have enjoyed the reflections, time of prayer, and the Zoom calls. There is not much said in the scriptures about St. Joseph, but we know he was so important in the life of Jesus and Mary.

What always strikes me about this time of year is the swiftness of Lent. This powerful and reflective liturgical season quickly runs its course. In the meantime, we are trying to make better sense out of the salvific actions of Jesus. I am thoroughly convinced one area of our spiritual life that is often left out is the power of the Sacrament of Penance. COVID has certainly dampened people's ability and desire to receive the sacrament. Please note that Monday, March 22nd, Fr. Caddy, and I will be available to hear confession in the Church at 7PM. Confessions are also available during Holy Week: Monday, March 29th 9AM-10AM and 7PM-8PM; Tuesday, March 30th 9AM-10AM and 7PM-8PM; and Wednesday, March 31st 9AM-10AM and 7PM-8PM. I hope this gives many of you a chance to receive the sacrament.

The words of John's gospel are extremely challenging. "Whoever loves his life will lose it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life." It's that powerful paradox we strive to live out as followers of Christ. We are called to empty our

lives or lose our lives for the sake of others and in the same process when we do that we are actually preserving our life for all eternity. You can count on Jesus to leave us wanting. The thought of following him should never dissipate. Allowing Jesus to lead us is where we can understand better our faith being one and at the same time feeding us, yet not totally satisfying us.

This is what we know: Jesus will fulfill these words better than anyone else. His emptying process from the beginning of Holy Week to its climax on Easter Sunday takes us on the most incredible ride of faith and trust in God. These days of Lent become a precursor of what transpires during Holy Week. I am always struck by the reading that accompanies the Passion Narratives we read on Palm Sunday (next Sunday) and Good Friday (3PM Service of our Lord's Passion). Next Sunday we proclaim the second reading just before the Passion is read from Paul's Letter to the Philippians. Paul states the obvious to all Christians about what Jesus is going to do and personally encounter. Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not deem equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he took the "form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." The emptying is so clear to Paul that he cannot hesitate but offers this reflection to the Christian Church in Philippi.

Next Sunday, March 28th the Red Cross Blood Drive will take place in Hanson Hall from 8AM until 1:30PM. Please register online at redcrossblood.org. The Blood Drive is by appointment only (no walk-ins) to adhere to social distancing. Please contact Debbie Lokar in our parish for more details.

Confessions during Holy Week will include the following days and times: Monday, March 29th AM-10AM and 7PM-8PM; Tuesday, March 30th 9AM-10AM and 7PM-8PM; and Wednesday, March 31st 9AM-10AM and 7PM-8PM.

Holy Thursday, Morning Prayer at 9AM, Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7PM; Good Friday, Morning Prayer at 9AM, Stations of The Cross at 12(Noon), and Service of the Lord's Passion at 3PM; Holy Saturday, 9AM Morning Prayer, 11AM Blessing of Food, and 8:30PM Easter Vigil; and Easter Sunday Mass 8:30 AM Church (livestreamed) and Hanson Hall and 11AM Church and Hanson Hall.

As we continue to quickly approach Holy Week, please know you are in my daily prayers and thoughts. Have a great Lenten week.

Easter Food Collection



God's Mercy, Love and Grace

Last Sunday's second reading from Ephesians really hit home for me: "God, who is rich in **mercy**, because of the great **love** he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ. By **grace** you have been saved ... it is the gift of God." A great reminder that God's mercy, grace and love for us never falters.

I don't know about you, but in my spiritual life,



sometimes the closeness of my relationship with God varies. And any time it's waning, it's not God who has moved away from me, but me from him. Romans states

that nothing can separate us from the love of God "... neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." I think that makes it pretty clear who does the moving away when we feel separated in our relationship with God! Depending on the cause of my withdrawing from God, sometimes I need to call more heavily on his mercy and grace. It's ever present. I do well to remind myself of that fact.

As we continue to prepare to celebrate Jesus' death and resurrection, if there's anything standing between us and feeling surrounded by God, let's allow ourselves to separate our self from what's come between us and to fall back on the mercy, love and unfailing grace God provides us through Jesus. I think that's a lot of what's behind this amazing season.

May your week be filled with God's mercy, love and grace!



