

### **Do we need to fast for one hour before Mass, or one hour before communion?**

The practice of fasting before receiving the Eucharist is a centuries-old act of devotion that was once very different than it is today. In the 1917 Code of Canon Law, for example, anyone who wanted to receive the Eucharist had to fast from midnight until the time of communion (even water and medications were forbidden). Over the following decades, the rules for the eucharistic fast were relaxed, first by Pope Pius XII and, later, by Pope Saint Paul VI.

The current Code of Canon Law (1983) states very clearly: "A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine" (Canon 919, §1). And, in the case of those who are ill and the elderly, the rules are even more accommodating, "The elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them can receive the Most Holy Eucharist even if they have eaten something within the preceding hour" (Canon 919, §3).

So, if we strictly follow the "letter of the law," the fast is calculated from the time of Holy Communion and not the start of Mass. However, when we remember why we fast — it is a reminder of the deeper hungers of the spirit that our physical thirst or hunger symbolize — we see that the issue is much bigger than simply fulfilling what is called for by Church Law and tradition. Joining fasting to our prayers and reflection before Mass is an opportunity to really center ourselves and to prepare our minds, hearts, and bodies to welcome the One we receive in the Eucharist.

### *This week's message from Fr. Dave....*

Easter is here! Jesus Christ has risen and given us new life. This day is always good for me. I enjoy the Easter liturgy and the Holy Week services that lead to this time. I cannot even imagine what it must have been like for Jesus to shed his humanity and reveal his divine nature. Yet, as we know he still bears the wounds for all to see. I want to wish all of you a blessed and holy Easter. For most of us, this Easter is like no one we have celebrated before this time. COVID has certainly hampered our ability to fully worship as a parish community. I am confident we can and will move on from this time to the day we will take off the ropes from our pews. We are getting closer to that moment.

Certainly, the highlight for me through the days of Lent were those people who stood consistently in their devotion to the Consecration of St. Joseph. Two weeks ago, when we participated in the prayers after Mass and blessed the statue of Joseph, it made me think we are getting so much closer to a state of normalcy. So, we continue to pray that we can patiently wait for that moment.

As we gather today, I hope that you are not restricted from your own family. Easter was always a good time for our family to gather. It was a time of the year that we knew warmer weather is coming our way. Easter signified in many ways that new life is all around us. I hope that this year Easter has that extra significant meaning because of all we have been through this past year.

Most importantly, Easter marks for me that Jesus Christ shows the power of the Resurrection and the enormous love God has for his people. Jesus follows his Father's call no matter what the personal cost. His unwavering faith calls us to stand and take notice – And we do!

This past week, like all Holy Weeks, never fails to convey that Jesus was completely focused on doing his Father's will. The Cross becomes for us not a death dealing moment but rather a moment that is life giving. The empty tomb is a reminder that God's intentions for us through Jesus Christ cannot be contained in this world. Jesus' appearances to his closest friends after the resurrection guides our faith to places it could never go before. I hope

Easter brings to all of us greater trust and faith in the saving actions of the Cross and Resurrection.

As we move forward, I have sent to all those who head our committees and parish groups the guidelines for in-person meetings at Divine Word. We are asking all groups gathering have no more than fifteen people. These guidelines will help with set-up and clean up after each meeting. Wearing a mask and physical distance are still in effect until further notice. (Now I am just waiting for the day to take the ropes off the pews in the Church.)



Already I have seen some of our people working the beautiful grounds we have on our property.

These next six weeks we will be in the liturgical season of Easter. These days lead us to the end of the liturgical season of Easter and back into the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This will be marked by the great Feast of the Ascension of the Lord (May 16th), Pentecost (May 23rd), the Most Holy Trinity (May 30th), and The Body and Blood of Christ (June 6th). I always enjoy these consecutive Sundays of worship. We have the chance to reflect on several important moments in the life of Christ and the life of the Church.

Finally, I want to thank you for your presence today. You have all been so good and generous in many ways throughout the pandemic. I am grateful for all you do for us at Divine Word. I consider myself lucky to be here and to share my ministry with the people of our parish. A big Thank You to the parish staff who continue to make me look good. Their talent and dedication makes my life easier and enjoyable. Just like I do for all in the parish, I pray for our staff every day. I pray that Jesus Christ risen from the dead gives you all that you need to endure and persevere through these unprecedented days. He has Risen, He has truly Risen!




## The Seven Sorrows and Joys of Saint Joseph
