## Do children need to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before their First Communion?

For centuries the Catholic Church has taught that a person needs to be in a state of grace (free from mortal sins) in order to worthily receive the Eucharist. To that end, Catholics should make an effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation any time they recognize the need for the sacrament (and in keeping with the precept of the Church that asks that we celebrate this sacrament at least once each year).

In the case of children preparing for their First Communion, the Code of Canon Law is very clear that they should also celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist for the first time: "It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents as well as of the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession" (Canon 914). While some might question the significance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation — especially in the case of children who might not fully understand the reality of sin or the meaning of the sacrament itself — a child's "First Confession" can be a wonderful time for families to reflect together on the quality of their relationships, how they put their faith into practice, and, when it is possible, to celebrate the sacrament as a family. In the end, the celebration of these two sacraments mark important moments in the spiritual journeys of children and we hope their "First Confession" and "First Communion" help instill in them a love of the sacraments of the Church.



*This week's message from Fr. Dave....*

In Luke's gospel today, Jesus looks like any ordinary person. He seems normal to us and to his closest friends. Yet, the resurrection has changed Jesus and his friends forever. His risen presence strikes us as different because he has no limits in this world. He has walked through locked doors and offered the Spirit and power to forgive to his apostles. He eats like any normal human being as he appears to his friends.

While sharing this meal he has powerful words for them. That the prophecies of old are fulfilled through him. Then he opens their minds to better understand this in the scriptures. He encourages them through his suffering, dying, and rising to preach and offer repentance and forgiveness to all nations beginning in Jerusalem. Jesus calls them to be witnesses. Jesus' apostles have been charged to make this happen. This fascination of sharing the story of Jesus' life will carry them to many places. They have the Spirit to help them use the right words and the perseverance needed to face difficult situations.

If you peek at the reading from the Acts of The Apostles (first reading today) Peter is sharing the gospel with an attentive crowd. They are in awe of his healing a crippled beggar. He responds to them by firmly stating that he does all he can, including this healing, through the person of Jesus Christ. It is by the name and presence of Christ that the man is healed and not his own name.

Peter is the ultimate witness. The freedom of heart he experiences helps him carry the message of Christ. That freedom allows him to be the best of witnesses. Peter's faith is clearly what is leading his life. This kind of faith does not exempt him from any human suffering or pain. He believes with Christ all things in this world will be overcome. If you are to witness Jesus' passion and death; then you have to witness to his death and glory. Are we inclined to be witnesses for our faith in an often confused and chaotic world?

It is the greatest challenge to live as Jesus lived. Most people believe they could never measure up, so why even try. Or others will simply not believe. Could it be that they see how difficult it is to live like Christ or it takes too much effort to even try? Jesus says all the right things to transform our world. Can I love God as Jesus loves his father? Can I love others as Jesus did? Can I lay

down my life out of faith and love for Jesus and those I love the most? The resurrection has transformed Jesus and friends that is so evident. How has the resurrection changed us?

As I look back at Easter Sunday, I was so inspired by the number of people who attended Mass. Thank you for your presence. Your time with us during these pandemic days was heartwarming. I continue to pray each day that we will have permanent relief from COVID soon. I hope people are feeling more comfortable coming to Mass and being with us. Remember our 8:30AM mass is Livestreamed each Sunday.


As I look forward in just two weeks, we celebrate First Communion. This is one of my favorite moments to celebrate with all the children and watching them receive Eucharist for the first time. This past week we offered the Sacrament of Penance to our young people in preparation for First Communion. This is an exciting time to offer Jesus in his body and blood and to invite these young children into the heart of our faith.

One area of ministry that we want to focus on through the Spring and Summer is our Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This process begins in the Fall, but we want to get the word out to find those who would like to go through the process of becoming Catholic. If you know of anyone who is interested in being baptized or needs to be fully initiated (receive Confirmation and Holy Communion) let me know.

We continue to push forward on our plans to renovate the altar area. We are in the process of ordering the altar and lectern. This will take several months, and I am expecting to see this happen in the early fall. With the renovation of the inside of the church anticipated, how good has the weather been for us these past couple of weeks! I keep reminding myself that it is only the month of April. I hope you see the trees budding and the beauty of Spring flourishing before our eyes. These are good days of Easter.




## Cancer Support Group



### Life is Just a Walk in the Park

While I'm learning about birds and other things in nature (like beavers at the beaver dam on River Road and that gray, fuzzy pussy willows blossom as seen in the picture taken on the boardwalk on Mentor Marsh), I'm also finding my walks to provide an opportunity to learn about people, and to learn more about myself. It's pretty amazing what people will share. There's a thoughtful man at Chagrin River Park,



who would stop with his two dogs so that my Mom could visit and see the dogs on her Amazon Echo. He'd always wave and say "hey, Mom, great to see you today" (even though all he was seeing was the back of my phone). I saw his genuine sadness when we met on a path one day, and he asked "where's Mom?", and I had to explain that she'd died. I then learned from him that his Mom died of Alzheimer's 10+ years ago, and his Dad and only brother have also passed – his brother four years ago that day. I could sense the losses he experienced.

Then there was the lovely woman with her beagle. She explained to me that her dog's name is related to her sister, who was her best friend and who died a couple of years ago. I'm sorry I didn't get her number, as I could see the pain in her eyes and I would have liked to meet with her someday to share more. Reminder to self to do so if/when I see her again and I hope that I'll have that opportunity.

When it comes to birding, I'm finding that it sometimes requires more patience than I possess. Real birders will literally stand for an hour or more patiently waiting for a kestrel to come out of its box or a meadowlark to show




