Q Is gossip a mortal sin?

To really ask this question, we must consider the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness."

A In its reflections on this commandment, The Catechism of the Catholic Church invites us to not only think about what bearing "false witness" means, but to also consider how we understand the truth and how we communicate more broadly. This is why so much of this section of the Catechism has to do with the gift of language. With this in mind, we will notice that the word "gossip" isn't used by the Catechism. Instead, we find the words "detraction" and "calumny," which are actually two forms that gossip can take, and both can be quite serious.

First, detraction is the of revealing "another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them," without morally valid reasons. Calumny, by extension, is saying something about another person that is untrue, and it is sinful because it "harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgements" (see no. 2477).

In all of our communication, we have to always recognize that we have a moral obligation to the truth and to always work to protect the reputation and honor of our neighbors (see no. 2479).

Gossip can, in fact, prove to be a very serious sin. After all, the Catechism reminds us: "No one is bound to reveal the truth to someone who does not have the right to know it" (no. 2489). When we have gossiped, especially if we are aware we have damaged another person's good name or reputation, we want to make every effort to undo the damage we have done, including seeking the grace and forgiveness offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



This week's message from Fr. Dave....

Jesus wants us to think deeply about him. I believe we find this sentiment often in John's gospel. When he boldly proclaims his "I am" statements in the gospel it is a call to us for deeper reflection. First, he pronounces, "I am the true vine and my Father is the vine grower." These words are a direct reflection of his intimate connection with his Father in heaven. Jesus can do nothing without his Father, the vine grower.

God the Father in heaven will take away the branches of Jesus' life that for whatever reason do not bear much fruit and the branches that do bear fruit he prunes so they can bear more fruit. This relationship Jesus has in heaven is so powerfully intact that it is difficult to describe. However, we know that Jesus in his divinity and his humanity will fight through the darkest of times to do the will of his Father.

Second, this should make us feel even more confident to go to Jesus, to listen to his words, and to absorb all he has to offer to us. Why? He is the true vine, and we are the branches. Jesus tells us by his words we are the branches pruned for our own good and to bear more fruit in life. He is clear about our relationship with him. We cannot bear any fruit in this life without him.

Third, he reemphasizes the connection we have with him like branches are intimately connected to the vine. These are powerful words, "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." And here is how confident Jesus feels about anyone who is intimately connected to him, "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you." I wonder if we have the confidence on our part as branches connected to the vine and wholeheartedly to believe this about Jesus!

I admit, this intimate connection Jesus is describing in today's gospel is extremely compelling. Just like a branch should know the vine, I want to know Christ. These challenging words call me to a deeper sense of prayer. How can I truly know the vine I am connected to unless I desire to understand who the vine is? This can come through our prayer, the scriptures, within our own relationships, our service to our neighbor, reaching out to those who are disadvantaged, and the list goes on. Intimacy is what the human spirit seeks, and Jesus offers that to us each day.

I hope you heard the good words of Maureen Powers, the Director of Joseph House of Cleveland, last weekend at Mass. Most of you know that Joseph

House is our place we have for housing refugees and the distribution of clothing through our clothing bank. These ministries give us direct connection with the inner city and working among the most vulnerable in society. Maureen's work is valuable to us because there is great need for clothing in the St. Clair-Superior area and for those refugees who come through our Catholic Charities organization. I am grateful to Maureen, the Joseph House Board, our volunteers, and all who continue to support us financially and through your clothing and monetary donations. Thank you!

Are you interested in learning a little more about Mass (Liturgy)? I will be offering, on the five Wednesdays of June (June 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd, and 30th), an exploration into the different parts of the Mass. I am going to also examine a comparison between the experience of Sunday Mass and the weekday Masses we celebrate. I will be doing this in Hanson Hall with all restrictions and to offer Zoom for anyone who might feel uncomfortable with gathering on these Wednesdays of June from 9:15-10:30AM. Call me if you have any questions. We will have sign-up in the Gathering Area or call the office to let us know you will attend or will be on Zoom.



The Desires of Our Heart

When my Mom lived with us, I got in the habit of trying to head out of the house as early as possible for work, or I'd end up detained by Mom (who was *ever so* ably cared for by my husband, Rod, anytime I wasn't around). I'd toss something in a bag for lunch, but I got in the habit of stopping at McDonalds for coffee and either oatmeal or an Egg McMuffin. Even after Mom went into the memory care center, I continued my Monday/Wednesday/ Friday stop at McDonalds. All I have to say when I get to the drive through kiosk is "good morning, it's Shari!" Then I'll hear "oatmeal or Egg McMuffin?" I select. Then, "iced or hot?" Again I select. They know for my iced coffee I want no liquid sugar and light cream. They know for my hot coffee I simply want light cream. I always receive what I want.



On occasion Rod and I have stopped at McDonalds on a Sunday after Mass to get me a coffee -- generally an iced coffee. I yell across Rod into the kiosk "large iced coffee, no liquid sugar, light cream please." The Sunday crew doesn't know me, and I

inevitably get either a sickeningly sweet or a WAY heavy on the cream iced coffee. Rod inquires why I can't just order what's on the menu. I explain because it's not what I want, and I don't enjoy drinking it that way. (He rolls his eyes and we happily move along.) But that got me thinking ...

I think the Lord knows the desires of our heart. Psalms 37 says "Delight yourself in the Lord, and he will give you the *desires of your heart.*" Mind you, these desires need to coincide with his will. Telling the Lord you'd like to win the lottery to get a snazzy new car, a boat and an island vacation home isn't likely to happen. But sharing with him what you'd like to achieve in life, or specific needs for which he can provide, make it likely to receive the desires of our heart.
