

### What is the difference between a "Saint" and a "Blessed"?

The process of proclaiming someone as a saint in the Catholic Church has evolved over the course of many centuries. In the beginning, those honored as saints were almost exclusively biblical figures or martyrs. However, after the legalization of Christianity in the fourth century, new holy women and men came to be honored as saints, and this was often done by popular acclaim or by the local bishop or abbot. It was Pope Gregory IX (who was pope from 1227 to 1241) who officially proclaimed that only the pope had the authority to add someone to the official list (the "canon") of saints. This is the meaning of the word "canonization."

Today, the saint-making process includes several steps, including detailed studies of the person's life and a recognition that they died as a martyr or lived a life of "heroic virtue." Once someone is recognized as a martyr or if a miracle is attributed to their intercession, they will be beatified and honored as "Blessed." This means that they can be celebrated by Catholics in a particular country or region or by the members of certain religious community. If another miracle occurs and is approved, then the "Blessed" is canonized and honored with the title "Saint," meaning that they are now officially recognized as a universal model of holiness and an intercessor.

### *This week's message from Fr. Dave....*

At the practice for First Communion, just a few days prior to the actual First Communion Mass, the second graders put forth quite an effort. Let me explain. This past year of COVID and the restrictions in place kept us from consistently connecting with our young people. The schedule was often difficult to maneuver, teachers trying to catechize with great limitations, and always hoping for the cooperation of parents, created a difficult situation to properly prepare our young people for their special day. I saw first-hand the results of this past year and several months.

Our young second graders put forth a monumental effort to receive communion. The way they approached the altar (one after each other), took a bow, responded "Amen" to my "The Body of Christ" was done with great focus. They cupped their hands just the right way, I placed the host in their hands, they took a step to the side, and they placed the host in their mouth as they walked back to their seats. These young seven-year-old's, one after the other, proceeded with great caution and precisely with great effort and went through the proper way of receiving the Eucharist.

I left after having witnessed what appeared to be their struggle to follow procedure and the excitement of receiving the sacrament. What was most telling is that I could not see their faces until I placed the host in their hands due to the masks they were wearing. When they took off their masks, I was the only one to see the expression on their faces. What I saw was young people wanting to do the right thing. They were so focused on properly receiving the Eucharist that their face revealed a seriousness not often seen on young people of their age. I walked away from practice that night with little worry about what would take place at their First Communion.

What amazes me is how often I have seen young people, like our second graders, rise to the occasion. They did not disappoint, and I felt they were focused on the importance of what we do and receive at Mass. Their faith often inspires me to check my own relationship with God. I need to be cognizant of what Eucharist means and why I participate in the celebration. I left the two celebrations of First Communion with an incredible amount of gratitude to God and to our young people who have hearts willing to believe what they receive. I hope as adults we can stay focused on the great gift of Eucharist and express our gratitude to God by lives of faith.

Are you interested in learning a little more about Mass (Liturgy)? I will be offering, on the five

Wednesdays of June (June 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd, and 30th), an exploration into the different parts of the Mass. I am going to also examine a comparison between the experience of Sunday Mass and the weekday Masses we celebrate. I will be doing this in Hanson Hall with all restrictions and to offer Zoom for anyone who might feel uncomfortable with gathering on these Wednesdays of June from 9:15-10:30AM. Call me if you have any questions. We will have sign-up in the Gathering Area or call the office to let us know you will attend or will be on Zoom.

We are forming a monthly support group for widows and widowers. This is for anyone who has lost a spouse and is looking for support and a chance to share their experience of continued living. The first meeting will be Tuesday, May 25th at 7PM in Hanson Hall. Come and share your story and life and provide healing for others. Call the parish office if you have any questions.

I recently had the opportunity to gather with members of our parish who form the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. This is a group of people who try to meet the needs of the most disadvantaged in our community. The St. Vincent de Paul Society does its work behind the scenes and without any recognition. They do their ministry of reaching out to the poor and disadvantaged quietly and without expecting anything in return. If you know of anyone who might need some assistance, please do not hesitate to have them call our St. Vincent de Paul Assistance Line: 440-547-6718. If no one answers, leave a message and a way to contact the person in need and a member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society will return the call within 24 hours.

During the month of May we are baptizing eleven children. I believe that is the most children baptized in one month in my seventeen years at Divine Word. Baptisms will fill the weekends for most of the next two months and throughout the summer. I believe we are making up for some who postponed baptisms due to COVID. I am grateful that the parents and families are coming forward to receive the great gift of baptism.

Finally, May is such a great month because we know summer is not too far off. The weather will be more consistently warm as the school year winds down. I am praying that by summer's end many of the COVID restrictions will be relaxed. In the meantime, we stay steadfast with the attributes of patience and perseverance. Have a great week.



### **The Desires of Our Heart: Part Two**

Last week I mentioned a circumstance where the Lord gave me the desire of my heart before I even knew it was the desire of my heart.

For 23 years I worked for a non-profit that helps people overcome addictions. We had a small staff, 5.5 people, but we managed to grow the service internationally, to a point of opening offices in the UK and Australia in the five years before I left. We worked tirelessly, and I often worked six days a week, 10+ hours a day. (Not complaining, we were in the business of trying to save lives, and that's



what was required.) However, when my Mom moved in with Rod and me, I realized I couldn't maintain the schedule I was used to. I also had a little bout of breast cancer, which, while easily resolved with surgery and radiation, did give me cause to pause. So, I resigned from a job I loved, with no real plan for the future. I simply knew I wanted a job that served people. And one that wouldn't require six plus days and 60+ hours a week.

During this job transition time, Fr. Dave asked if I'd be interested in the business manager position, as John was retiring. I provided a quite hearty "no thank you!" I explained that I don't enjoy numbers, I love people and words/writing, but am not gifted with numbers. He later asked if I'd meet with him and John to review the position. I agreed (really, who can easily say no to Fr. Dave?) and we met later that week. Following that meeting, I felt even more certain this wasn't the job for me. Fr. Dave then asked if I'd interview for the position. Seriously? Then again, it had been 23+ years since I'd interviewed, and I decided it wouldn't hurt to brush up on interviewing skills. So I met, and I again admitted to the interview team that I really don't enjoy numbers, and this job seemed primarily numbers oriented.

A day after the interview, my brother called asking me how my job search was coming along. I indicated that I was going to take a few months off before beginning a search, but that I'd interviewed for the church business manager position. And wasn't **that** a hoot given my dislike of numbers! My brother reminded me that years before, he'd served as a church business manager. Twice




