
Why are some saints honored as "patron saints"?

Each person is unique and each of us has different gifts, interests, talents, and, yes, even struggles and areas where we need to grow. This is no less true of those holy women, men, and children who have been canonized or beatified.



Because we believe that the saints and blessed are both models of faith and intercessors, Christians have looked to certain holy people as role models and heavenly protectors for occupations, spiritual charisms, and even places. Although the Church sometimes names a person as a patron saint (e.g. Saint Philip Neri as the patron of Rome, Saint Clare of Assisi as the patroness of television, or Saint Aloysius Gonzaga as the patron of youth and young adults), more often it is popular devotion that inspires lay Christians to turn to a particular saint or blessed for heavenly help and support. This is how, for example, Saint Cecilia came to be honored as the patroness of musicians, Saint Toribio Romo as patron of migrants coming into the United States, and Saint Gertrude of Nivelles as patroness of cat lovers. Although there are official and unofficial lists of patron saints, we should always feel free to ask any and all the saints to give us their patronage and protection in whatever it is that we need.

This week's message from Fr. Dave....

Today is a good day for several reasons. Liturgy returns to normal. Masks and social distancing are no longer the rule. The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is celebrated with great vigor. I can think of no greater feast to celebrate than on this day that marks the end of many restrictions placed upon us for over the past fifteen months. The one common theme I heard from people who choose not to attend Mass during the pandemic was missing the Eucharist. We gather today as a community and Church on this solemn feast that defines who we are as Catholic Christians.

I hope we can take the time to realize the incredible gift we have in receiving the Eucharist. Holy Communion should draw us into those days when Jesus gave his life and conquered death for us. By this action, He restores life to a fallen world. When we receive Holy Communion, we participate in those holy events. Every celebration of the Eucharist gives us the opportunity to make real those events that transcend time. So, every Mass places us at Calvary and at the empty tomb. The Eucharist brings us to the center of our faith.

Can you imagine trying to live up to what we celebrate? If we are participating in the real mystery of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection – how do we live it out? If this is what Eucharist is, then how can we even come close to living a Eucharistic life? I just wonder if this is the reason many shy away from wanting to believe that the Eucharist is the real presence of Christ. Holy Communion becomes the expectation as to how we live. Our life with Jesus is a call to live like him. Yet, we often fall short!

This should not deter us from what we believe as the Eucharist becomes the nourishment to our faith life. We are called to continue to seek Christ. Part of the motivation is the more we seek Christ, the more we can understand the beauty and goodness of the Eucharist. Our reflection, prayer and worship should never stop even during doubt or our human failings. Our intention to further our life with Christ will lead us to a better understanding of what we receive through Holy Communion. When we can see our participation in his death and resurrection as necessary for growth in Christ, the Eucharist brings us intimately into these sacred events of every Christian.

This is a day we have been patiently anticipating. No more masks and the ropes come off the pews. I hope that most of you will be comfortable with getting back to normal. We will have a section in the west nave that will still be roped off and if you desire you can still wear a mask. I have had several people tell me they are not completely ready for the change to come back to normal. I understand where they are coming from and will respect their decision to wear a mask and to remain at a distance.

The opening procession and offertory procession will be reinstated. We will take up the collection from the pews. The sign of peace will take place. Please note if you turn to those around you other than your family and you extend your hand, but the other person will not extend his or her hand, do not be offended. Our adjustments back to normal should be met with respect to all those around us. Honestly, these are adjustments back to normal that we all knew were coming. One aspect of the liturgy that will not return is the distribution of the precious blood. I suspect it will be some time before this returns to the celebration of Mass.

Please join us on the Wednesdays of June (June 9th, 16th, 23rd, and 30th) for presentations on the Liturgy. We will begin at 9:15AM (after the 8:30AM liturgy). You can join us by Zoom or come in person to Hanson Hall. I am looking forward to this time we can spend together. We will examine the Sunday and weekday liturgy. We will look at the different parts of the liturgy with further explanation. We will look at how we can properly prepare and foster a good mindset to enter the liturgy. Hope to see you there.

This afternoon we host the senior class from Kirtland High School. Our prayers are with the graduates and their future endeavors. We also keep in our thoughts and prayers all those graduating from high schools and colleges the next several weeks. This is certainly a great time of the year as we come out of COVID and with many occasions to celebrate. Best to all our graduates!

Look around you and enjoy the warm weather moving in and the thought of summer days ahead. I hope these days are filled with family celebrations and being together with loved ones. Have a great week and nourish the soul with prayer and worship.



To Forgive and to Be Forgiven

As I was thinking about what to write this week, a situation came to mind. I have a friend who has recently been attacked by a family member with unhelpful words. Cruel words that cut her deeply. My blood boiled when I read the words. I was offended on her behalf, and I thought about sending a response to the unkind person. As I happily considered what I would say, I found all sorts of “get even” comments that would allow him to potentially be hurt as badly as he’d hurt my friend. That’s only fair, right? Hmm. Then I read this scripture the following morning (after having spent part of the night thinking about the perfect get-even wording):

“When you stand to pray, forgive anyone against whom you have a grievance, so that your heavenly Father may in turn forgive you your transgressions.” Mark 11:25-26

Ouch! Last week in my “Words Can Hurt” column, I mentioned how sometimes scripture can give us a good kick in the pants. I decided that a better way forward would be to work to forgive the person and to pray for him, as he genuinely seems a lost soul right now.



Every time we pray the Lord’s Prayer, we ask that He forgive us our sins as we forgive those who have sinned against us. Think about that for a minute. That puts the responsibility on us to be forgiving. I honestly think that harboring hatred and ill will (regardless of how badly harmed we were or are by another) can create a lot of turmoil in our lives, including emotional and physical health issues. Letting go of hatred and ill will can be freeing. In turn, that creates a far better relationship with our heavenly Father when we can forgive others as we ask him to do the same for us. Sometimes we may need a little help from the Lord, and praying for the ability to forgive and to move on has helped me.

After having read the scripture, I felt a bit ashamed of all the great content I’d come up with




