Q Where does the money go that is collected each week at Church?

A This is a good question! Every parish has financial obligations, including the basic operation of the buildings, salaries, maintenance, and improvements. In addition, there are schools to support, programs to run, charities to be funded, and operational expenses like hosts and wine for Mass, music books, vestments, and so on. In some cases, cemeteries and other buildings need attention. Finally, there is the diocesan assessment that each parish pays to help run the diocese and the support services provided to each parish.

Most parishes manage to get by with the collection, a few fundraisers and endowments. But contrary to popular opinion, cash flow is also a problem, and many parishes operate in the red. The Finance Committee is responsible for assisting the pastor in fiscal management, and good stewardship is the basis for successful programs. ©LPi





This week's message from Fr. Dave....

I am sure most of you have heard that our parish secretary, Mrs. Helen Petruziello, will be moving to Columbus in a few months. She will be leaving her position on the parish staff and enjoy time in retirement close to more immediate family. When Helen came to us several years ago, I was looking for someone who could be hospitable and kind to those who came to our front door. Helen has done outstanding work as the person most people see when they enter our parish office. I could not have asked for a better person to serve in that position. I am grateful to her and the time she has spent with our parish.

I ask you to keep Helen and her husband, Dave, in your prayers as they enter this new period of life together. Helen's last official day will be June 30th. If you see her before then, thank her for all she has done for us. Helen has told me that when they come back to visit, we will see her and Dave at Mass. I know Helen has touched many people in our parish with her warm and welcoming demeanor. Her compassion for others and wanting to help and listen are all a part of the ministry she has undertaken the past few years. Divine Word is a better place because of her.

Last weekend we celebrated the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ and the weekend before that we celebrated the Holy Trinity, today looks much like Ordinary Time. This second section of Ordinary Time in our Liturgical Year began two weeks ago. This means we will stay in Ordinary Time for the next twenty-four weeks until November 28th, the first Sunday of Advent. Most of these weeks will follow the journey of Jesus and his disciples through the gospel of Mark. However, from July 25th until August 22nd we will have our gospel reading from the sixth chapter of John's gospel, the Bread of Life discourse. Just to let you know, I thoroughly enjoy the Bread of Life discourse. I cannot wait until we share that part of scripture.

If you have not noticed, our parking lot has been seal-coated, the cracks filled, and lines painted. This needed to be done and I hope it helps with parking and keeping our lot in good shape. Have you noticed the grounds and the upkeep that takes place? We have several volunteers who serve our grounds well. Their time and effort are always appreciated. Last week our Holy Name Society spent some time on cleaning

and fixing the prayer walk up to our Grotto area. If you have never been on the prayer walk, I invite you to spend time there. Thanks to the Holy Namers who put in their time!

Let's get back to the gospel! When reflecting on these deep penetrating words of the gospel, I think of the many times people have said to me or I see it in others who I have been around for some time, "You have really grown." You cannot sense the growth in your own life, but somehow, we make the impression that growth is there, and others acknowledge it. This is much like the man who scatters seed and would watch night and day to see if the seed would sprout and grow. Then those few words, "he knows not how." Those words offer a perspective about a maturing faith. Much like a seed, our faith over the course of time has the possibility of growth. Growth in faith occurs through the grace of God. The mystery attached to this process of seeds or faith growing is difficult for us to detect – so we should pay attention when others notice it in ourselves.

Jesus supports these words with the Parable of the Mustard Seed. He uses one of the smallest seeds and its incredible growth to describe the Kingdom of God. The impression is something small can become larger than imagined. So often we think our faith is too small or could never improve beyond a certain point. The parable helps us understand that the Kingdom of God is larger than we can ever describe, hence our faith can grow into it. This mustard bush at its peak, can be a haven for the birds of the air. So often on Sunday I experience the peace and security of the "sanctuary" of our parish community, much like the looming mustard bush.

I hope you are up-to-date concerning our altar renovation that should take place early in October. This will include tile replacing the green carpeting, a new altar, a new lectern, refurnishing the chairs in the sanctuary, new candle holders, a new paschal candle stand, and a new baptismal font. We will keep you informed as we get closer to the actual date of consecrating the new altar, which can only be done by a bishop.

I hope you are enjoying the warm weather. These are good days for me, and I hope they are for you. Please continue to join us for prayer and worship. Have a great week!




