

What is the "Miraculous Medal" and why is it called that?

The medal of the Immaculate Conception that has come to be called simply the "Miraculous Medal" dates back to an apparition of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure, who was then a novice sister with the Daughters of Charity. On November 27, 1830, Our Lady appeared to her standing on a globe, with shafts of light streaming from her hands and the words, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee," surrounding the image. In the same vision, Catherine saw a capital "M" with a cross above it and below two hearts. Catherine seemed to hear a voice telling her to have what she saw struck as a medal and a promise that those who wore the medal would have the protection and intercession of the Mother of God. The first 1,500 of medals were distributed in 1832. Many miraculous favors were attributed to the use of the medal.

Saint Catherine's "Miraculous Medal" is among the recognizable and popular symbols of modern Catholicism. Reflecting on its widespread use, the 2001 Vatican document, "Directory on Popular Piety and Liturgy," observes that the medal "recalls the mystery of Redemption, the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. It signifies the mediatory role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mystery of the Church, the relationship between Heaven and earth, this life and eternal life."

This week's message from Fr. Dave....

A woman and a child become the center of Jesus' ministry in today's gospel. They both are suffering from ill health. Their afflictions have no immediate or hopeful solution. The young girl, the daughter of a synagogue official, appears to have lost her life. At the same time, the woman with hemorrhages is considered an outcast to society because of her flow of blood. Anything she touches will be considered unclean and contaminated.

These two stories are intimately connected so that Jesus can display his power within these hopeless situations. The woman who finds herself in the middle of this crowd is not in the right place. However, her focus is to seek out Jesus. She only believes she must touch his clothes and some good will happen. Jesus does not disappoint. Once she touches Jesus' clothes immediately the flow of blood dries up. She is relieved of her affliction. Those around her would still consider her unclean because the label of "unclean" sticks. Besides, they would not see the actual healing. She touched Jesus and now many have the perception that he is contaminated.

He carries what has happened to this woman to the young girl who is supposedly dead at her home. Jesus will face ridicule, scorn, and even death. Again, he does not disappoint. He is not worried about what others think of him or even that he has cured a woman considered unclean. He simply puts those out who are creating a commotion and then he tends to the young girl. He invited the girl to rise. She gets to her feet, moves around freely and at Jesus' request has something to eat.

Jesus brings life where it appears that there is little life or no life at all. His power presents everyone who witnesses these situations with the hope of believing. Jesus is unrelenting when he sees faith displayed and his saving power is made manifest. I hope we can understand the display is not to show Jesus to be a miracle worker. Rather, his ministry of healing is a display of the Kingdom of God. We can be assured in our faith that God manifests his power so that we can come to understand who Jesus is and his mission here on earth.

The days of summer are here! I hope that you have time spent with getting away and being with family through these weeks of the summer season. We all know how quickly this time of the year slips by us. I am looking forward to just getting out and being with friends which was stifled by the pandemic the last year and half.

I hope you have heard my prayer at the end of the Universal Prayers at Mass. I am praying on behalf of the parish community that more people will step forward to join our RCIA process. This program is designed to help those wanting to be baptized Catholic (catechumens) or those who have been baptized but not fully initiated into the Faith (they have not received Holy Communion or Confirmation). These individuals we call candidates. Let us all keep praying that more adults and children will come forward with the desire to receive the sacraments.

Coming out of the pandemic has helped us realize that we need to adjust to what we were doing before our confinement. I am looking at the area of liturgy and since we are not offering the precious blood at Communion this means fewer number of Eucharistic Ministers are needed. We have faithful and competent Eucharistic Ministers who have participated well in the past. The unfortunate result of not distributing the precious blood from the cup is that many of our Eucharistic Ministers will not have the chance to distribute communion as often. I wish I could change this, but now is not the time. I ask our Eucharistic Ministers to be patient with one another and with us as we make this adjustment.

To all our liturgical ministers which includes Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers, Altar Servers, Adult Servers, Lectors, Ushers, Choir Members, Money Counters, Sacristans, those who clean the church, those who clean our altar linens, and our Art and Environment Committee, we are having a Night of Reflection on Wednesday, August 11th at 7PM in the Church. We will briefly go over some updating of procedures during Mass and offering some reflections on the liturgy. More information to follow.

We are all pushing forward to the weekend of Fourth of July. Every morning at our weekday morning Mass we pray for our country. I am hoping that we can learn from our past, stay steadfast in our faith in the present days, and hope that faith flourishes as we press on to future days. Our families, schools, and governments (local and national) can benefit from our prayers. We have our independence because many before us sacrificed for our freedom. We can never lose sight of the great commitment many displayed through laying down their lives for us. We are lucky individuals because Jesus has given us our freedom of spirit and generations before us have given us freedoms to live as we do. May God bless us in Kirtland and in the USA. Keep the Faith!

Another "Gotcha"

One of the scripture readings this past week (from Matthew 7) really hit home for me. Jesus says:

"Stop judging, that you may not be judged. For as you judge, so will you be judged, and the measure with which you measure will be measured out to you."



I thought: "Wait, I not only have to forgive to be forgiven, but I also have to not judge in order to not be judged by the Lord?!" (A bit of further thought caused me to think that they do seemingly go hand-in-hand.)

Jesus continues with: *"Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own eye?"* It's so easy to be critical of others, isn't it? And often what we would identify as problematic behavior in another is present in ourselves -- it just seems much easier to identify in others.

I've recently been struck by how much more easy Christian life might be if we heed some of these simple principles – don't judge, forgive others, and primarily, what Jesus identifies as the two greatest commandments: *"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself."*

When we truly love someone with all our heart, we want to do everything to please them, right? Our thoughts go to them before thinking of ourselves. So, if I work toward loving God with all of my heart, soul and mind, it seems it will be more difficult for me to find time to judge others or to do things requiring the Lord's forgiveness. I'm going to start there – working to ensure my heart, soul and mind are focused on improving on my love of God.

And may your week be filled with love of God!


