


What kind of religious practices should we begin, once we marry, to help us practice our faith each day?

Your spiritual life as a couple is important. The sacrament of Marriage is a gift and a grace, but living it well isn't always easy! It requires intentionality and perseverance. Growing your spiritual life as a couple also requires a plan. Life can be incredibly busy. There's never "enough time" for everything we want to do. But we can live by our priorities. If we don't prioritize prayer, we'll find it slowly disappear from our lives.

If you're not already praying individually, that's a good place to start. If your schedules are similar, take some quiet time at the same time to help hold each other accountable. Praying together is also important! You could start by looking at the religious practices of your family and of families around you that you respect. Talk with your spouse about the ones who make the deepest impression on you or were most meaningful when you were young. Think about what you want your future children to experience. Making faith a commitment now will mean it is engrained habit when you grow your family. Ultimately, these faith practices should help us grow in our love for God and for one another.





This week's message from Fr. Dave....

We welcome to our parish staff, Mrs. Kelly McCloskey. Kelly comes to our parish staff as our new parish secretary. I knew Kelly as a student at Lake Catholic High School, where she graduated in 2002. I remember her as a focused and determined student with exceptional talent in many areas of life. She has tremendous organizational and computer skills and will be a great addition to our parish staff. Her parents, Rick and Joan, and sister, Kim, have been long-time members of our parish. I hope you all get the chance to meet her. I had the opportunity to preside at her wedding ten years ago. Kelly is married to her husband, Chris. They have two children, Camden and Quinn. We welcome Kelly to our parish staff!

Two weeks ago, I had a wonderful conversation with those who are attending the Liturgy Sessions on Wednesday mornings. We talked about the Universal Prayers and their purpose in the Mass. The intentions we voice at Sunday liturgy are prepared. This is so the intentions we offer match the readings, the homily, and the needs of the parish community. The intentions at our weekday Masses have been done differently over the years I have served here. The presider-priest begins the intentions with the standard formula we have been given to follow. The series of intentions is usually to be: a.) for the needs of the Church; b.) for public authorities and the salvation of the world; c.) for those burdened by any kind of difficulty; d.) for the local community.

After the presider-priest offers these intentions, he opens the intentions to those who are in the assembly. They can offer an intention that is a general intention and is not a personal, individualistic need. We pray with one another and for one another, for the Church, and the world at Mass. So, the optimal guideline to offering a general intention is for what is offered transcends the individual intentions of the faithful present in the celebration. The guidelines clearly point out that the intentions should be sober, be composed with a wise liberty and in few words, and they should be expressive of the prayers of the entire community. Since our last Liturgy Session, the intentions at our weekday Masses have been presented closer to what the Church calls us to do. With a little thought and consideration for the

entire community, the intentions can be properly presented.

We heard last week that Jesus was rejected in the synagogue by those in his hometown. He could have walked away feeling like a complete failure. If he had made a greater impression and “won” over his hometown people, Jesus could have felt an incredible sense of success. Rather, he has no hesitation to send out his own disciples immediately after he has seen such a lack of faith in his own hometown.

Not only does he not hesitate to send out his own disciples, but he calls them forth with very few provisions. They carry few things with them: a walking stick, sandals, and a tunic. They could not take food, a sack, or money. I cannot imagine not having food or money and just walking in a direction without having some sense of what will happen on the journey. Jesus is calling them to radical trust. Can you think of any example where you were called to radical trust?

I have seen this type of trust in action when people have gone against the norm in hopes of a greater Christian good. The times I have seen spouses reconcile despite tremendous hurt. The moments that people have admitted to an addiction or bad habit that requires help from others. Those who continue to struggle in their relationship with God and they do not give up on Him. The call to radical trust is only reinforced by our daily prayer-life with the Lord. Keep praying!

Do you see what happens to the disciples who have this radical trust in Jesus as they go out to their mission work? They drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them. This initial experience of mission for the disciples will forever affect their relationship with Jesus' mission. Once Jesus has ascended to heaven the disciples will have some skill and understanding of what it will mean to do mission work with a radical trust in God.

I hope your summer days are filled with good moments. July is that “hinge” month that leads us to the new school year and shorter days. I hope your family is safe. Please pray for those in our parish who are sick and suffering in any way. My prayers for you and your family always.



Someone to Live Up To

Last week, Rod and I headed to New Hampshire for a memorial service for my Mom. It was a lovely service, and we enjoyed time with lots of family and friends. We visited the Veterans' Cemetery where Mom joined Dad last January (without us present, as travel restrictions were still in place).

Even with dwindling numbers of friends and relatives still alive in New England, we knew that if we offered an opportunity for individuals to share words about Mom at the service that we'd be there until August! Instead, we solicited written memories from friends and relatives which were read at her service.

I learned a few things about my Mom. A number of people referenced her sense of humor. Interestingly, I never really thought of my Mom as having a major sense of humor, but in hindsight, I agree. She was funny!



More than one person indicated that their lives were changed when they met my Mom and she shared her love of God with them. I've mentioned that she was never afraid of sharing her faith. But she also lived such an exemplary Christian life, that one day a woman showed up at her door and

simply said "I want what you have." Another woman told of a time that she commented about what an odd bird someone was, and how my Mom gently replied "Isn't it wonderful how God made us each unique?" Her friend knew it was a tender reprimand – one that worked. That reminded me that I can honestly say I never heard my Mom say a bad word about another human being. Ever.

So many people mentioned that my Mom was a mentor to them and helped them to improve their faith, and their lives. She taught a young pastor's new wife how to cook and sew. When I was growing up, two or three times a week upon returning home from school, I'd say, "Oh, dinner smells so good," only to be advised that the dinner was for a family in need, and we were having leftovers.

My Mom emulated Jesus. If ever there was a woman who deserves to be emulated by her daughter, it's my Mom. I'm going to keep working toward living a life that causes others to want what I have.
