

I've heard that we become angels when we die. Is this what the Church teaches?

As human beings, we are both spiritual and corporeal. We are body and soul. This makes us unique in all creation. No other physical creature — plant or animal — possesses an immortal soul made in God's image and likeness. Like the distinction with plants and animals, angels have an entirely different sort of existence. Angels are pure immortal spirit, and they have been so since the moment of their creation. While they may take on an appearance of a body in Biblical history, they are not a body like we are. Angels are neither male nor female, despite the art we often see.

As the result of the Fall, human beings experience death. Our souls are temporarily separated from our bodies. However, we do not become something other than human. Every Sunday in the Creed we profess "I believe in the resurrection of the body." As Jesus was united with his body on the third day, so too will we be united with our bodies at the end of time.

This week's message from Fr. Dave....



We just completed five weeks of reflection on the liturgy and liturgical prayer. We had a group of just around twenty-five people who met. This is one of my favorite topics to research and reflect on. I am always wondering

how I can better understand the meaning, context, and ritual of our liturgy. I have come to discover that the reflection can only go deeper. The more I think I know keeps telling me that I have more to learn. For that reason, I continue my research, reflection, and prayer.

The liturgy is how the church expresses itself. Through the liturgy we hear God's word and we enact the death and resurrection. Our going to liturgy reminds all the life given to us in Christ. We set the standard high because of our belief in the Eucharist as the real presence of Christ. We receive his body and blood through the transformation of the simple elements of bread and wine. The challenge to our liturgical lives is to become what we consume. That is the highest standard. We all struggle to live up to it and we need the Spirit to give us strength to be more like Christ.

Today's gospel reading is a hinge moment connecting what seems to be a gap in between Jesus' ministerial experiences. The disciples are coming to Jesus after having been sent to deliver the Good News. After the experience of the Apostles, Jesus invites them to a "deserted place to rest awhile." This is one of those moments in Jesus' ministry with the Twelve that is a good reminder for us when our calendar is controlling our lives. I hear all the time and say it to myself when I need to get away. Our work can get the best of us, it can bring us to the brink, and create all sorts of stress. The question is how we deal with this. Jesus has a great idea, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while."

As Jesus enters this moment of what appears to be rest and prayer, he notices those waiting for him as he disembarks. They all appear to him to be "like sheep without a shepherd." Those gathering around Jesus are looking for "something." Could it be their lives are unfulfilled? Are they trying to figure out Jesus and his mission? Do they need inspiration and reassurance that God is in their midst? Whatever the effort taken to find Jesus he responds by taking the time to be with and teach them.

This tells us when Jesus has his plans interrupted, he takes the time to be with those who need him the most. He sees a need and offers his time and teaching to give them hope. Jesus as the Good Shepherd does not let his flock flounder but provides direction and protection as he brings the lost back together. You would think that once Jesus has settled the flock that he would walk with his disciples to their place to rest.

However, he will not let the people go away by themselves. He will take the time to make sure they are fed despite the lack of food available.

Starting next week, we will read from the sixth chapter of John's gospel. We will go through most of the seventy-one verses through the next five Sundays. This is one of those sections of the entire scriptures that I enjoy. We call this chapter the "Bread of Life" Discourse. This section of John's gospel speaks directly to our belief in the Eucharist. In response to these Sunday readings, I will have a time of further understanding and reflection on Wednesday mornings at 9:15 -10:30AM in Hanson Hall. We will meet July 28th, August 4th. 11th, 18th, 25th. Please join us if you can.

Our parish staff and parish council will be spending this Tuesday, July 20th together as we plan for the upcoming year. We will measure where we are in comparison to our Five-Year Plan and discuss upcoming programs including our RCIA (starting in the Fall) and Alpha (starting in January). I will give a report as to our results from the day. Please pray for us as we spend this valuable time together.

Last weekend we baptized five children. I believe that might be a record in one weekend since I have been here these past seventeen years. I am grateful to the families who presented their children for this occasion. We should pray for the newly baptized, for their parents and Godparents. I hope they can realize the importance of living out one's baptismal call and nourishing that call with prayer and worship.

I hope and pray that all is well with you and your family. Like I said two weeks ago, the month of July goes quickly. I hope you have time with family and friends. Keep the Faith and strengthen your life with worship and prayer.






