

Q What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?

A Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God's will, living each day with confidence in God's mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus' public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: "For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people."

It is this image of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God's grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches.

This week's message from Fr. Dave....

The assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is not seen in the scriptures but has been with our tradition since the early Christian centuries. This solemnity comes out of the great devotion many people have had for Mary since the early days of the church. Our honoring Mary comes out of her profound openness to God and how she continued to respond with incredible faith. She was a human being who displayed how great faith can be for all humanity. Her willingness to bring Jesus into the world and to guide him to adulthood was her most powerful role. Her faithfulness as a mother to Jesus serves us well, as she directs us to her son, who is our salvation.

This is Mary's gift to us that we live our lives for the sake of Jesus Christ. In Him we have what is needed to find peace that this world cannot give. Mary leads us to see who Jesus is and so we adore him as the Son of God. He is everything to us in our faith. Mary, by her love for God and the Holy Spirit, brings Jesus into the world. This is one of the most powerful moments in history as Jesus is given to the world from his heavenly Father.

The words of Elizabeth on Mary's visitation speak well to us all, "And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." Even during her pregnancy there were words and experiences that mark out for us as Catholic Christians that Mary's faith was so powerful. Her willingness to respond in faith to every life given situation exemplifies the inner beauty of her person. She is the model disciple and calls all of us to greater faith in her son, Jesus.

I am always curious about the story of Mary and Elizabeth. This is one of my favorite stories from the infancy narrative. Mary, who is pregnant goes in "haste" to visit her cousin. The word is often associated with "in a hurry" or "rushed". I immediately ask myself why would a young, pregnant, and vulnerable women rush to her cousin's house? I am wondering if she needs to confide the circumstances of the conception of this child with someone else who can understand. Of course, Elizabeth speaks those powerful words upon Mary's arrival, "Blessed are you among woman, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." Could it be, that Elizabeth senses something extraordinary in the birthing of Jesus as she herself is to give birth beyond childbearing age?

The teaching of Mary's assumption into heaven was decreed by Pope Pius XII in 1950. This is a relatively modern decree coming from the Holy Father. If you look at his words, Pius XII declared Mary assumed both body and spirit into heaven in an age of dissipating virtue and goodness. Pius XII saw devotion to Mary flourishing and regarded her as a model for all to emulate. The world needed her example and as a person who directs us to Jesus

Christ. I hope we never forget that this woman we honor today leads us to adore her son.

As many of you have heard from me over the past several months, we are preparing to renovate the sanctuary area in the church. This will include replacing the green carpeting with marble tile, a new stationary altar, a new lectern, a new baptismal font and new carpeting in the choir area. We will also be replacing the carpeting in the Gathering Area. A bishop is the only person who can consecrate a new altar. We are trying to time the construction in the sanctuary to coincide with the day the bishop is available to consecrate our new altar. We have scheduled Bishop Gries to preside and consecrate the new altar and sanctuary area on Saturday, October 30th at our 4:30PM Liturgy. I hope you will attend and pray with us.

Next Tuesday, August 17th at 7:00 PM in the Gathering Area the Book Club will meet to discuss "The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry." The book is an easy read but offers great insight in how to properly balance life, faith, and our "hurried" pursuits. I hope you will consider joining us for a lively discussion.

Many calls have come in about the start of our PSR program. Registration will open the week of August 16th. PSR classes will begin on Sunday, September 19th, which happens to be Catechetical Sunday. I appreciate all the parents who have called or asked after Masses about the upcoming PSR year. It tells me you are concerned about your children's religious formation.

Our parish picnic is next week (Sunday, August 22nd). I hope you will consider joining us for a few hours in the afternoon. We will begin directly after the 11:00 AM Mass. Our parish picnic committee has done a great job in putting together this year's picnic. Please come out and celebrate a good Sunday afternoon with your fellow parishioners.

A big "Thank You" to our Holy Name Society on the excellent golf outing last Monday. This is always an enjoyable day for me. I love the outdoors and a good game of golf with the company of good people. Thanks to the people who plan this event each year. You do excellent work and thanks to all who attended and participated.

Finally, I hope the month of August serves as a good transitional time for all of us. Many will be heading back to school and others preparing for the many activities of the Fall. Have a great week and may we all seek nourishment for our spirit through prayer and worship.
