

My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?

There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns.

Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you!

This week's message from Fr. Dave....



I hope that the rush of school and activities of these days are not creating too much havoc in your life. We had a group discussion last Wednesday night about the book, "The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry." The author of the book speaks of his experience of building a large church and watching his schedule fill as he leaves to the wayside his family and even in many respects, his personal relationship with God. What happened to him can occur in our life. We get caught up in so much activity that we ignore those parts of life that need our constant attention.

In a radical decision, this pastor went to the Church Board and told him he was resigning his position for another that would not require more than he could give. He began to attend to family, friends, and his relationship with God with more vigor and passion. He discovered that his life was much more fulfilling. He gives the reader several suggestions on how to slow down life. Many of these suggestions cut to the heart of our rushed, crazed lives.

Here are just few of his suggestions to create a slower more reflective life.

-Drive the speed limit. Can you imagine doing that?

-Get into the slower lane while driving. You must be kidding! But, this will slow life down.

-Get into the longest checkout line at the grocery store. Will people think we are crazy if we did this?

-At the start of each day put your cell phone on the other side of your house and don't look at it until after you have spent time in prayer with God. I like this idea! I have tried it and it works.

-Set a time for social media or if you want to be a real radical, get off it. I go back and forth with this one. Social Media has its purpose once it turns into "throwing mud" at each other, I get off it for a period. I love this quote from the author, "Multitasking is the drive to be more than we are, to control more than we do, to extend our power and our effectiveness. Such practice yields a divided self, with full attention given to nothing." I am always amazed at those who can multitask. Single-tasking is more my speed anyway.

-Walk slower. Literally and intentionally walk at a slower pace than normal.

-Take a regular day alone for silence and solitude. Prayer is powerful. We hear in the secular culture the need for people to meditate or to experiment with mindfulness. The author of the book reacts, "Mindfulness is just silence and solitude

for a secular society. It's like prayer, minus the best part." I am glad he said this because I have been thinking this for many years. Our spiritual tradition and what is written about prayer from the beginnings of Church is unmatched by any other secular source or religion. We have a treasure trove of spirituality in our tradition. Try to put some of this point into practice. Thanks to those who came to share in this discussion.

Please place on your calendar, Saturday, October 30th as the day our new altar and renovated Sanctuary will be consecrated. We will be renovating the choir area first. This area is scheduled for redesign in September. We will change the carpeting and add new outlets for electricity. Dividers will be designed for the choir section.

The new altar and lectern are being shipped to us as we speak and will be placed in the Sanctuary toward the end of October. The carpeting will be replaced with marble tile. Bishop Gries is scheduled to come Saturday, October 30th at our 4:30PM Mass. We will later replace the baptismal font. Finally, the carpeting in the Gathering Area will be replaced. We are all excited for the big changes!

I am so happy with the many people that attended our parish picnic last Sunday afternoon. Those on our committee did incredible work with their planning, set-up, cooking, and clean-up. I had a great time seeing everyone and meeting several new families who have recently registered in our parish. Thank you to all who participated in this event.

I hope these weeks of August and into September remind us what is truly important to our faith. We need time to pray and to worship. This will only make our relationship with God stronger. I hope God touches your life in response to your passion for His presence in your life. You are all in my daily prayers.

Dear Divine Word Family,
I have been considering Assisted Living since my serious illness last November, with a probable move in January 2022. How quickly one's plans can change! I began chemo/radiation treatments on August 4th. They are going quite well. On August 14th, I was diagnosed with a kidney stone and a procedure was performed at Hillcrest that evening. While recuperating, I was informed on August 17th I had contracted C-Diff (probably due to my compromised immune system). Because of the contagious nature of C-Diff, other living arrangements had to be made on the spot. For the past seven years I have been celebrating Mass for the patients at Enclave of Newell Creek and I fell in love with the staff and facilities. They welcomed me when I was discharged from Hillcrest on August 18th. Although Enclave will be my new home, once I have conquered the triple whammy, I hope to continue celebrating liturgies at Divine Word. So it's not "goodbye," just "hello" from a new location. I am deeply grateful to Father Dave, the staff, and to all of you, the parishioners, for your care, support, friendship and prayers since I came to Divine Word on July 1, 2014. You made these years of retirement a dream come true. If all the pills I am taking do their job, I will see you soon.


