

## Besides the Wise Men, what is significant about the Epiphany?

Epiphany means "manifestation," or public display. The feast is usually celebrated January 6. In the US, it is celebrated on the Sunday

nearest to January 6. It originates from a story unique to Matthew (2:1-12). Magi from the East come to offer homage to the newborn King, presenting him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

This part of Matthew's infancy narrative differs from Luke's account of the birth of Jesus. In Luke there are no Magi, star, nor gifts. Luke has Jesus being born in a stable after Mary and Joseph's long travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Matthew seems to have the family living in a house in Bethlehem, where the Magi find them.

Why these differences? They stem from the needs and concerns of the audience the authors were addressing, as well as the theological stance of each author. Knowing the original intention helps get at the correct interpretation of the text.

Since Matthew was writing primarily to a Jewish community, his concern was to show that Jesus did not come just for Jews, but for Gentiles as well. From his very birth, Jesus not only manifests himself to Jews, but also to Gentiles, who are prominently included in the manifestation, symbolized by the Magi and their journey. This is the most significant aspect of the feast of Epiphany. How do you manifest Jesus to all with whom you come into contact?

## This week's message from Fr. Dave....



This is one of those mystical encounters between Mary and Elizabeth that makes us ponder the power of God's presence in our world. These two women are sharing in the joy of new life, yet the possibility of this happening goes

beyond our human reasoning. God has intervened in a woman too old to bear children and the other pregnant without any relations with a man. What do we make out of this situation? I believe most people today would simply write this moment off as impossible or just false. However, the attraction that Mary and Elizabeth feel towards each other is too powerful to place into words.

Elizabeth is so overwhelmed with joy when Mary visits that her child in the womb leaps for joy. At the same time, she cries out in a loud voice. She does not greet Mary in a customary way or say the words expected of her, but she cries out loudly. This helps us understand that Elizabeth has great love for Mary, and she has made that incredible connection that she is carrying her Savior. The realization of this understanding caused her to go beyond a simple pleasantry and produces a voice crying in love for Mary and the child she is carrying.

What causes me to sit back and ponder this moment of two lives effected by the intervention of God is the love they are filled with for one another. Could it be that the seemingly impossibilities of their lives were confirmed by this present moment? Sharing impossibilities gave Mary and Elizabeth greater hope and trust that God was doing incredible wonders in their lives. This is a moment of beauty between these two relatives. I cannot begin to fathom an explanation that would satisfy anyone who has no faith. All I can do is rely heavily that God can make the impossible a reality. These events often happen in scripture when the situation has a direct effect on the entire world.

Relationships are so important to us as human beings. Our identity is defined by those we live with and those we call friends. This story ranks among the best in scripture to define the importance of relationships. If we ponder long enough on this short, but powerful moment between Elizabeth and Mary, we can see that they are intimately connected to each other. Their experience of friendship helps them see the incredible task they will both have as mothers. What makes this relationship strong is how they allow God to infiltrate their soul and spirit. They can see God working in their lives and because of that they rejoice with each other.

These final days of Advent, as we approach Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, are hectic. One recommendation is to pause before your day begins to seek a sense of peace throughout the day. There is a liturgical tradition that starting on December 17th we can read the "O" antiphons at the alleluia verse before the gospel reading. These short, but compelling, words help our focus and direct us to the coming of Christ. Each of the seven "O" antiphons gives us titles of Christ as he is anticipated to come into the world. These antiphons are taken from the prophet Isaiah as he prepares his people for the coming Savior. You might notice in the popular Advent hymn the "O" antiphon, "O Come, O Come Emanuel." I often use these simple antiphons to help me focus during the day and be a reminder that Christmas is close.

If these times do not fit your schedule, please call the parish office to make an appointment.

Mass on Friday, December 24th, Christmas Eve, will be held at 4:00 PM (in the church and in Hanson Hall), 7:00 PM, and 10:00 PM and on Saturday, December 25th, Christmas Day, at 8:30 AM and 11:00 AM (there is no 4:30 PM Mass on Saturday evening, December 25th). The Feast of the Holy Family is Sunday, December 26th. Masses will be at 8:30 AM and 11:00 AM. Mass on Friday, December 31st will be at 4:30 PM on the Eve of the Feast of Mary, the Mother of God. Mass will also be celebrated on Saturday, January 1st, New Year's Day, at 9:00 AM. Mass for the Feast of the Epiphany will be on Saturday, January 1st at 4:30 PM and Sunday, January 2nd at 8:30 AM and 11:00 AM.

Our first Synod Listening Session will be Monday, December 20th at 7:00PM in Hanson Hall. Please sign up in the Gathering Area or call the parish office. A light dinner will be provided at 6:30PM. Your role in the Synod is to offer reflection on the state of the Church. We are interested in hearing your honest assessment of the local and universal church. Please note that we are hoping for both strengths and areas of life in the Church that need to be stronger. I hope you will join us for this night of reflection.

As we wind down to Christmas Day, please know of my prayers for you and your families. I cannot say enough about your generosity and giving to the parish to keep us strong and viable. As always, I am looking forward to a spirited and powerful worship on Christmas.

Enjoy the last days of Advent – and Merry Christmas in advance!

- An expanded charitable giving incentive that allows taxpayers who take the standard deduction to make up to \$300 in charitable cash contributions for single filers (\$600 for married couples) to qualified charities like ours this year.
- For those who do itemize their deductions, the law allows for cash contributions to qualified charities such as ours to be deducted up to 100% of your adjusted gross income for the 2021 calendar year.

And, if your are 70 1/2 or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish.
