This week's message from Fr. Dave....



Christmas is the story we all know. We know the truth of this story and its lasting effects. When we read from the gospels about the birth of Jesus, it creates a nostalgic overtone. The story always plays

good on the screen or stage, for the young or the old. The deeper, spiritual meaning of the birth of Christ relies on the deep passion God has for us. Why else would we even ask the question, "Why did God take on human flesh?" The only compelling answer I can give is passion for His people.

His birth is more than just righting the wrong of humanity. Rather, God has this incredible passion for us. He wants to be in a relationship with us and he wants us to thrive in life. Hence, Jesus, his Son, is born with a mission. Jesus will show us how to live and act to give glory to his Father. Our faith is the only one that claims that God takes on human flesh. Christianity's story begins today and continues through his passion, death, and resurrection. We see Christ doing incredible things, but always keeping in mind how God provides for us in the person of Christ.

Sunday, December 26th we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family at 8:30AM and 11:00AM. Next weekend, we celebrate on New Year's Eve at 4:30PM and New Year's morning at 9:00AM the Solemnity of Mary, the mother of God. On Saturday, January 1st we celebrate at the 4:30PM Mass the Epiphany of The Lord and on Sunday, January 2nd we continue the celebration of the Epiphany at 8:30AM and 11:00AM. As you can see, I will be spending lots of my time at Mass this next week.

I hope you can help us with the Synod Listening Session that will be coming our way. These Listening Sessions are a process to gather feedback from the entire church. They are facilitated to allow people to speak of the strengths, weaknesses, and hurts they have experienced in the church. This is an ambitious process. The hope is to get a better reading of what the experience of Church is for our people. Alpha is a faith program based on enriching our relationship with Christ. Those who will be attending will meet on eleven consecutive Mondays. Each week we will provide a meal at 6:30PM and then a presentation and table discussion. The meeting will end by 8:30PM. We are hoping you will take advantage of this program and join us for Alpha. I am thankful once again for all who have passed through our doors during Advent and these days of Christmas. Your spiritual and financial support is overwhelming! I count myself lucky to be your pastor. You make my life as a priest worthwhile. I hope and pray that this time of the year has a powerful impact on you. Year-End Giving



In this season of giving, consider making a year-end gift to our parish in gratitude for all the blessings you have received in life. As you plan to make the most of your charitable donations in 2021, know that we gratefully accept gifts of

cash and appreciated assets such as stocks or bonds. We wanted to take this time to remind you of some important CARES Act provisions that are scheduled to expire at year's end. These provisions may affect you and even make it easier for you to make a gift to your parish. They include:

- An expanded charitable giving incentive that allows taxpayers who take the standard deduction to make up to \$300 in charitable cash contributions for single filers (\$600 for married couples) to qualified charities like ours this year.
- For those who do itemize their deductions, the law allows for cash contributions to qualified charities such as ours to be deducted up to 100% of your adjusted gross income for the 2021 calendar year.

And, if you are age 70 1/2 or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish. Or even suggesting to people that I love going to church or mentioning the excellent Advent reflection series at church. I need evangelization to become a more natural occurrence in my life. Rather than fear offending someone, I think I'd benefit from thinking of it as an opportunity to reach someone in need of Jesus in their life. I think there are a lot of people searching for peace and love. And a nonthreatening sharing of God's goodness may be just what they need.
