

# What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?

This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question

is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled. Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).

Jesus is revealed to the Magi from the East. This encounter is powerful in that Jesus has made himself known to the world. This story also gives us another example of people journeying to seek out this child. Why travel all that way unless this child is to reveal the extraordinary? This becomes the "epiphany" – Jesus discloses for us the presence of God. The Magi are radically changed after this encounter, and we know that as they return to their home by a completely different route. The encounter with Christ takes us to unexpected places by unexpected routes. I'm just wondering what unexpected places and routes we might travel this year?

This coming year could be one of seeking much like the Magi in their journey to the child Jesus. I am convinced all of us are seeking in this life. Hopefully the seeking is for that which will make us better people. Seeking Christ is a great opportunity. The Magi go to great lengths to seek the child and they are changed people once they encounter him. This year there will be opportunities to explore the same kind of seeking these Magi went through.

Let me tell you about the program coming to our Parish beginning Monday, January 24th in Hanson Hall. I hope all of you have heard of "ALPHA." This program is designed to help people grow in their faith through knowledge, insight, and discussion. This is an eleven- week course open to all. Alpha will give your faith a boost in learning or at least refreshing or reinforcing what you know. There is table discussion during each meeting to gain insight from others. 



# **Year-End Giving**



In this season of giving, consider making a year-end gift to our parish in gratitude for all the blessings you have received in life. As you plan to make the most of your charitable donations in 2021, know that we gratefully accept gifts of

cash and appreciated assets such as stocks or bonds. We wanted to take this time to remind you of some important CARES Act provisions that are scheduled to expire at year's end. These provisions may affect you—and even make it easier for you to make a gift to your parish. They include:

- An expanded charitable giving incentive that allows taxpayers who take the standard deduction to make up to \$300 in charitable cash contributions for single filers (\$600 for married couples) to qualified charities like ours this year.
- For those who do itemize their deductions, the law allows for cash contributions to qualified charities such as ours to be deducted up to 100% of your adjusted gross income for the 2021 calendar year.

And, if you are age 70 1/2 or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish. #### Welcome the Stranger

You'll likely recall the request for assistance with two Afghani refugee families temporarily taken in by the Sisters of Notre Dame in Chardon. BIG thanks to Joan and Dan Laux, John Nocera, Rosemary Morgan, and Joyce and John Kelleher for assisting the past two weeks. Joseph House is filled to capacity, and when the two families of nine arrived, the Office of Migration & Refugee Services had nowhere to house them. Sisters of Notre Dame to the rescue! But they felt they were amply stretched without being able to feed and clothe the families. That's where Divine Word had a chance to welcome the stranger, and to ensure they were clothed, fed, and loved.



Joyce and John and I headed to the grocery store with the two Moms and two teenage sons (none of whom can say more than hello in English, and we know an equal amount of Dari and Pashto). As you can imagine, that was a fun trip! Lots of hand gestures, oinking, mooing, quacking, and baa-ing. And lots of laughter! We filled an SUV and a car trunk and back seat, and the families were so grateful. An offer of tea was extended to us by both families.

All 18 family members needed additional clothing, particularly winter clothing. Five cars driven by Joan, Dan, John Nocera, Rosemary and Shari picked up all 18 family members and headed to Joseph House's clothing bank. Another fun experience! After shopping, we enjoyed lunch at Marie's Restaurant, near Joseph House, before returning them home. It was during this trip that we learned one of the dads had a severe tooth ache. Dan to the rescue! He took Guolala (spelling?) to an oral surgeon on Tuesday to have the abscessed tooth pulled. If you've ever endured the pain of a bad toothache, you'll know how grateful the dad was.

More food and clothing drops have occurred since those original outings, and I've had a chance to establish a relationship with the families. They have brought me so much *true joy* this Christmas season. A HUGE thanks to those who volunteered and assisted with the families – they also indicated it was a fun and joyful experience.

One of the dads showed me his certificate of appreciation from the US Army. He also showed me the wound where a bullet went through his left shoulder – entering in the front and thankfully cleanly exiting through the back, though he has lost some ability to raise his arm much above his head.

One of our two new refugee families at Joseph House is a mom with four children. Her husband was killed by the Taliban and a nearby bomb blast has caused her to be deaf. I genuinely can't imagine how one survives those horrendous events to carry on with living. I also know how incredibly important the work of Joseph House is to our refugees. I'm so thankful for our one parttime staff member and the volunteers who carry on the important work of Joseph House.

Before wrapping up, I found this on borderperspective.org, and I like it. "In the Old Testament, God's people are commanded: 'Don't mistreat any foreigners who live in your land. Instead, treat them as well as you treat citizens and love them as much as you love yourself. Remember, you were once foreigners in the land of Egypt. I am the Lord your God" (Leviticus 19:33-34).

While the New Testament was written in a different context, it too has advice about hospitality and welcome in Hebrews 13:2. 'Be sure to welcome strangers into your home. By doing this, some people have welcomed angels as guests, without even knowing it.'" Please pray for our refugees and our parishioners and volunteers who serve them.
