At my grandson's Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. I do not remember seeing this before. Why is this done? Is it something new?

When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.

Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like and fit over the baby's head. Others are simply placed on the baby's chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all: "See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers and this is symbolized by the white garment.



This week's message from Fr. Dave....

The New Year is off and running! The Christmas liturgical season came to a quick end. My thoughts right now are on warmer weather. However, I came through the full weeks of

Christmas with much gratitude because of so many generous people in our parish. I look at the decorations in the church for Christmas, the liturgical ministers who give of themselves, our parish staff who are priming themselves for the many ministerial assignments on the horizon, and the financial and spiritual generosity of so many that keep our parish thriving. Thank you to all who contributed to our Christmas season!

Now we can say we are back to “normal,” at least in terms of our liturgies as we return to Ordinary Time. We will be in “Green” for the next seven and half weeks as we will quickly approach Lent and Ash Wednesday on March 2nd. This is a rather late start for Lent, but it provides us with some of the stories from Luke’s gospel in the next seven weeks that we may not always hear in other years.

In the meantime, Jesus comes to the shore of the Jordan River in today’s gospel and is baptized by John the Baptist. The description of the baptism is a powerful rendering of how this moment reveals the Christ. In Luke’s gospel, “heaven was opened, and the Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove.” Mark’s gospel offers a slightly different and possibly more powerful reaction, “heaven being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove descending upon him.” Jesus’ baptism offers us another opportunity to see him for who he is. Only the Son of God could render heaven and split it open.

We all know this being “torn open” description of heaven. Whenever we pray that God be there for us, are we not asking for the heavens to open for us? Whenever, we pray to alleviate our own suffering or those of our loved ones are we not asking for the heavens to open for us? Whenever we pray for God to help us make sense out of life are we not asking for the heavens to open for us? What comes from the rendering of the heavens is exactly what Earth’s

humanity needs. Today the need is more than fulfilled – the Christ is given to us!

I hope that you spend time with our Listening Sessions to offer feedback on your experience of the church. These sessions are a smaller part of a huge initiative the church is undergoing the next few years. The Synod Process is to gather information from churches and institutions through the world. The responses will be formulated into several documents that will be published for the church universal. The process starts with Parish Listening Sessions where you can offer your insight and wisdom concerning the church. The Listening Sessions will be Monday, January 10th at 7:00 PM and Thursday, January 13th at 7:00PM. Both meetings will take place in Hanson Hall.

We also begin the Alpha Program on Monday, January 24th with dinner at 6:30PM in Hanson Hall and Presentation at 7:00 PM. This program is designed to offer knowledge and insight into the Christian Faith. The Alpha Program has a good track record. It has reinforced faith and helped people gain more knowledge about our beliefs. I hope you will consider joining us. This Program can provide greater access to understanding our faith. You might consider bringing a friend or someone you know who is unchurched.

You might want to clear these dates on your calendar: Sunday, March 20th, Monday, March 21st, and Tuesday, March 22nd for our Lenten Parish Mission. Fr. James Sichko from Lexington, Kentucky will offer the Parish Mission this year. He has been given great reviews for his work. A great storyteller who engages the faith of people. I look forward to seeing this event take place in our parish.

I hope and pray for all of you as we enter the new year. I am sure that the challenges of the world and daily life will keep you busy. Stay strong and healthy through these winter months. Of course, I am counting down the days to warmer weather. My support is always with you and enjoy the week ahead.

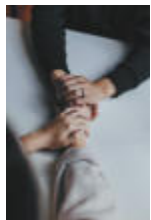
Upcoming Synod Listening Sessions

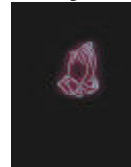
