



PASTOR'S CORNER



I am at all loss for words for this Sunday's gospel. We have had these three powerful Sunday feasts of Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and now we are confronted with the accusation that Jesus is a pawn of the devil. I guess we must change gears for today and reflect on how we can conquer

the power of evil in our lives and the world. What piques my interest is the twenty-seventh verse of Mark's third chapter, he states, "But no one can enter a strong man's house to plunder his property unless he first ties up the strong man." The question to ask, "Who is the 'strong man' and why does he need to be restrained?"

The strong man is Satan. This evil possesses human beings. Jesus is referring to those possessed as Satan's property. For us today, that is a lot to take in. How does evil present itself? He makes some things look attractive, but it is just a farce. Satan puts the bait out there for us to think we need this or that and it will make us feel better about ourselves. However, it backfires. The caution is that short term solutions to personal issues are rarely the answer. Often, it's the ability to push through the personal difficulties we go through to get ourselves to a better place. Then we can say that the perseverance of faith and belief in God has driven us beyond the "strong man's" force.

I believe we must talk about the evil in the world and how attractive it presents itself to us. How easy the human heart can be taken in and attracted to what evil presents to us. What makes me cringe is that some people believe there is no evil in the world. As a priest for thirty-three years, I am convinced and totally confident that evil is a personal force that will confront us. When Jesus talks about tying up the strong man, he means for us not to give into the many attractive allurements the devil may use to tempt us. Prayer each day is so vital to our relationship with Christ. He is the one who helps us to manage what we ourselves cannot confront on our own. Through prayer he gives us the ability to make good choices. This is a trusting and selfless way of interacting with the holiness of Christ that the devil cannot stand.

Pope John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis have all frequently spoken of the power the devil wields in our world today. They caution us to be aware of that power, but that we also have the ability within us to face the forces of evil that confront us. Our baptism alone is a power we do not often recognize, yet the devil has no power against this sacrament or the others. He is rendered powerless in the sight of every Catholic Christian baptized into the faith and who are faithful to Christ, unless we choose what evil offers to us. When we do choose what he offers we render ourselves into his own power.

The way we can divide the devil is through our steadfast faith through a consistent dose of daily prayer. Also at our disposal is our ability to rely on the Holy Spirit to make decisions in life that are long-lasting and feed our faith. We must believe as baptized Catholic Christians not only are we protected but, we can withstand all the solicitations of evil. This is how we tie up the "strong man" because he will recognize the strength in our life through Jesus Christ and the saints and angels are way beyond his power. I guess you can say I am not at loss for words on this topic. Let us together tie up the "strong man" and never let the devil have any power over us.

This week we have our young people gathering through Friday for our annual Vacation Bible School. It gives these young people the opportunity to have fun and at the same time to learn more about Jesus and our faith. I look forward to walking down to Hanson Hall throughout the next few days to see what our young people will do and how much fun they are having. Thanks to all who will make these days good moments for all those attending.

Several renovations are taking place on our property throughout the summer months. Two bathrooms in our priest's residence will be redone. They have needed repair and renovation for some time. Now is the time to do it as we anticipate the arrival of Fr. Jim Stenger. We will also be doing some work on the chapel area in the next few months. We will keep you updated as to their completions through these summer days.

We enjoyed our first neighborhood Mass last Sunday near the Kirtland and Chesterland border. What a spectacular sight! This is why I thought these neighborhood Masses would be beneficial to our parish. I have been to places in the parish that I have never seen. Thanks to all who provided so much to make this first neighborhood Mass such a good day.

I hope all is good through these warming days of summer. I hope that you can spend time on vacation and to be with those you love the most. Remember that you are in my daily prayers.

PERHAPS AN "AGE OLD QUESTION?"



Recently I've had interesting discussions with some lovely people. I'll focus on two who touched on the same concept. (Each is over 80 years of age.)

One has survived several bouts of cancer (and is in the midst of battling a new one - one that is normally found in people one quarter of this friend's age.) More than once, I've heard them say "I keep asking God what He has in mind for me and why I'm still

here?!" Unfortunately, not being God, I'm not able to precisely answer that question. But I think this individual can be a beacon of hope to many who are facing cancer, and enable them to learn that some cancers can be overcome. Plus, they are a joyful person and the world needs joy.

Another person is wondering precisely why the Lord hasn't taken them yet. Unfortunately, not being God, I'm not able to precisely answer that question. In this person's case, it seems life has become tiresome - almost a burdensome and tedious effort each and every day. But I don't think ours is to reason why, but rather to presume that the Lord has some intended purpose for us to still be here. In former columns, I've previously suggested that we should consider being immensely grateful and giving praise for every day. But I also understand when there's a loss suffered, or physical pain, that there can be uncertainty about why the Lord is keeping us here on earth. I'll still maintain that trying to remain positive and truly seek the Lord to determine why we remain here might help to provide good purpose to life.

I'm a believer that life is a dress rehearsal of what's to come. Philippians 1:21 states: "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." The New Living Translation states: "For to me, living means living for Christ, and dying is even better." The Amplified Bible translates it as: "For to me, to live is Christ [He is my source of joy, my reason to live] and to die is gain [for I will be with Him in eternity]." The whole concept/purpose as I read this scripture seems to be that we're here on earth to serve the Lord (thereby one another) but the best is vet to come. Perhaps the Lord chooses for us to remain on earth in order to pray for one another? Whatever His plans, we have to trust that He knows best.




