

...regarding Sacraments...

Baptism

- •1st & 3rd Sundays each month at 1 p.m.; please pre-register.
- •Pre-Baptism class for first child **ONLY** as required by Diocese, offered here the 4th Sunday of January, April, July and October at 1 p.m. in Mary's Room. Pre-registration is required.

Marriage

Couples should contact a priest 6 to 12 months before their wedding date.

Anointing of the Sick Celebrated at Masses annually during October or at home at the request of family.

- •In cases of emergency: at hospital or other medical facility when a priest is available.
- •In non-emergency cases: call the parish or Catholic hospital chaplain nearest the location of person to be anointed.

Funerals

- •Contact funeral director of choice to meet; ask Director to call the Parish Office to arrange date and time.
- •Call & visit parish office; meet with priest assigned to Mass.

Holy Communion for the Homebound

Call Parish Office to arrange for Holy Communion to be brought to homebound by Extraordinary Minister. Priests visit on First Friday. Please let us know if you are ill and confined to home.

Hospital Calls

Please notify the Parish Office when you or a member of your family is hospitalized. Be sure to let the hospital know that you are Catholic and if you would like the Catholic Chaplain to visit. If it is an emergency, be sure that they reach the priest that is on call. Most hospitals also have Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who bring Holy Communion to the Catholic patients. Be sure to let your nurse know that you are a Catholic and would like to receive Holy Communion.

Sponsor Requirements

Requests for sponsor certificates are directed to a priest. Individuals must

- •be registered and practicing members of this parish; at least 16 years of age,
- •and have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.
- •if married, be in a marriage accepted by the Catholic Church.

DEAR PARISHIONERS OF SACRED HEART OF JESUS PARISH,

MERRY CHRISTMAS!

At Mass on Christmas Eve, the gospel reading from Matthew begins with the genealogy of Jesus. What is the significance of this long set of names spanning several centuries? In describing Jesus' descent from Abraham, Matthew emphasizes the continuity of Jesus with the history of Israel: his position as heir to the promises made to Abraham and his fulfillment as Israel's Messiah.

God's plan for Jesus' coming was in the works for a long time.

Similarly, at Mass on Christmas Day, the gospel reading from John starts with "In the beginning..." and echoes the opening words of the book of Genesis. God intended Jesus' birth more than thousands of years in advance. No detail is too small for Him.

Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us." God loves us so much that He desires to be with us. Rejoice in His great love for you! Just as God planned before the dawn of time for Jesus to come as our savior, God also has great plans specifically for you. God has given us great joy in bringing Jesus to us this Christmas.

Let the joy of the gospel radiate in your lives. If you are overflowing with joy, consider inviting a neighbor or friend to share your joy. If you are going through a difficult time, reach out and ask for help to live in that joy. If you are still looking for joy, I encourage you to come back to church on Sunday to celebrate the rest of the Christmas season and to discover more about the source of this joy.

God has certainly given me great joy this year while I am in residence at St. Dominic's, the Dominican parish in San Francisco. I am helping with confirmation classes, marriage preparation, RCIA, outreach to the homeless, and the solemn Mass choir. Being able to apply what I have learned during the past few years of philosophy and theology classes in my activities in the parish has been a great blessing and inspires me to study further. The parish here is quite busy, and there is always more to do. "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest" (Matthew 9:37-38).

Thank you for your prayers. I ask you please to continue them fervently and to ask the Lord for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

You are in my prayers. May God continue to grant you many graces this Christmas season and in the new year.

GREETINGS FROM JOE MCCARRON

MERRY CHRISTMAS!

I hope this letter finds you and your loved ones in good health and joyful spirits.

It is a bit of a cliché observation at this point to say that we live in strange times and that Covid years tend to rush by like a blur but we do, and they do! It is just these truths that bring me back, over and over again, to reflection on the shepherds in the Nativity story. Here were people out in a field doing a task they had done time and time again. Their quiet town had a stressful buzz of late, what with the census and all. And yet here they were walking the same sheep to the same pasture on the same trail with the same coworkers.

Despite the monotony of it all, they still had a reflective disposition that God saw fit to reach out to them with a message of incredible joy. Internally, they had no choice but to rush to the stable to see the shocking truth for themselves. Luke says the shepherds were so moved by the vision of this humble Child-King that they shared the message to those they encountered, and that they returned "glorifying and praising God for **all** they had heard and seen" (Lk 2:20, emphasis my own).

May we always have the capacity to recognize and receive the beautiful messages God is placing in our path in the daily grind! Whether we are in the office, a zoom meeting, a family room full of rowdy kids, a living room with nobody else, or anywhere in between, God is always reaching out to us, waiting on our recognition of His supernatural, consoling communication of love. Like the shepherds, we must be reflective enough to see it and act on it.

I know that I have always ended my parish messages with a request for prayers, but this year especially I ask for them. For the 2021-2022 academic year I requested and received a leave of absence from seminary so that I could better discern in a different environment whether I will continue onward in priestly formation. As I take my hiatus, it has been a privilege to serve more actively at the parish by teaching 7th grade PSR and assisting with Sacred Heart of Jesus Cares.

Thank you for your prayer support, and know that I continue to pray for you!
