

NO NEW YEAR'S MASSES



This year there will be no special Holy Day Masses for New Years, or referred to in Catholic terms, "The Solemnity of Mary." Since this day falls on a Saturday it is not a Holy Day of Obligation.

THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that eera wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember.

- —The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.
- —Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.
- —Three French hens stood for faith, hope & love.
- —Four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke & John.
- —Five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.
- —Six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.
- —Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit—prophesying, serving, teaching, exhortation, contribution, leadership and mercy.
- —Eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.
- —Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.
- —Ten lords a-leaping were the ten commandments.
- —Eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- —Twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed


