Latest News on the Afghani Refugees at Fort **Pickett, Virginia:** You, the parishioners, have been so supportive of the Afghani refugees at Fr. Pickett in southeastern Virginia. We would like to update you on their status. Your donations were very much appreciated and needed! It is now up to the U.S. immigration service to help the refugees get settled in other parts of the country as quickly as they can.

All efforts at Ft. Pickett are being focused on resettling the Afghan refugees into homes in various communities. The bases are not collecting any further donations unless they have a specific need and then they will let everyone know. The operation at the base is set to be transferred to resettlement agencies on January 31, 2022.

If St. Patrick's would like, we can get involved with local resettlement agencies that will soon be receiving these families and need assistance in helping them find homes and starting new lives. We all know how traumatic that can be! The two agencies that we can work with are Commonwealth Catholic Charities (CCC) or Church World Service. Please do not call these agencies yourself. Patrick's will be in touch and let you know of any further news. In the meantime, we can all say a prayer that their transition is, if not an easy one, at least not difficult!

Lessons from St. John Paul II on the Feast of the Holy Family

The Redeemer of the World chose the family as the place for His birth and growth, thereby sanctifying this fundamental institution of every society... For every believer, and especially for Christian families, the humble dwelling place in Nazareth is an authentic school of the Gospel. Here we admire, put into practice, the divine plan to make the family an intimate community of life and love; here we learn that every family is called to be a small domestic church that must shine with the Gospel virtues... The family is called to bear witness to 'the Kingdom and peace of Christ, towards which the whole world is journeying.' May the Holy Family bless and protect all the world's families, so that within them may reign the serenity and joy, justice and peace, that the newborn Christ has given as a gift to humanity" (Angelus 2001).



#### **Music & Liturgy**

On the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, the Church's solemn liturgy and varied biblical texts summon us to full-hearted rejoicing at the Savior's birth. At the Vigil Mass, Isaiah prophesies the glorious vindication of Zion; Saint Paul announces that Jesus, born of David's line, is Israel's savior; and Matthew relates his miraculous conception. At the Mass During the Night, Isaiah declares that "a great light...has shone" upon Israel with the birth of a new king; Saint Paul says that God's grace has appeared, training us to live devoutly; and Luke tells of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem during the Roman census. At the Mass During the Day, Isaiah proclaims the good news of Israel's redemption; the author of Hebrews writes that God "has spoken to us through the Son"; and John sings of the Eternal Word made flesh.

"These two figures, Mary and Joseph, who first accepted Jesus through faith, introduce us into the mystery of Christmas. Mary helps us to put ourselves in the attitude of willingness to welcome the Son of God in our concrete lives, in our flesh. Joseph encourages us to always seek God's will and to follow it with full confidence" (Pope Francis, Angelus, 12/18/16). As we celebrate this Christmas season, let us welcome Jesus into our hearts, allow him to transform us, and share his love with everyone we encounter.
