

On this Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, our Scripture readings proclaim Jesus as God's chosen servant and beloved Son. In the text from Isaiah, the Lord declares

that this servant will establish justice on the earth. Saint Peter tells those gathered in Cornelius' house that God anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit and power. And in the Gospel, Jesus is baptized, the Holy Spirit descends upon him, and the voice of the Father resounds: "You

are my beloved Son".

"Before being immersed in the water, Jesus 'immerses' himself in the crowd; He unites himself to it assuming fully the human condition, sharing everything, except sin. In His divine holiness, full of grace and mercy, the Son of God made himself flesh precisely to take upon himself and to take away the sin of the world: to take on our miseries, our human condition" (Pope Francis, Angelus, 1/13/19). As this Christmas season ends, may we fulfill our baptismal commitment to bring Christ to the world around us.
