If you have a claim against the Diocese, including, without limitation, a claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date.

The front page of the bulletin this week “features” a required legal announcement that the Diocese has required us to publish one of 8 times in conjunction with the Diocesan bankruptcy matters. In the next column there is an announcement from the Vatican that the Holy Father has called for a year highlighting Family Love beginning on the Feast of Saint Joseph this March 19.

Thirdly, an article in the Buffalo News reports that the Diocese recently hired an additional law firm to defend itself against the suit brought by NYS Attorney General Letitia James. These lawyers are being paid \$1,250 per hour for their services. (\$900 per hour for associates).

How are these things related?

With the sex abuse and hierarchal cover-up there have been tremendous cutbacks in the Diocesan Offices. Recently I called the Diocese to reach Steve Halter, a retired FBI Agent who had been working for the Diocese. I was told he was “no longer employed by the Diocese.” To my knowledge, there had been no notice that he was no longer working for the Diocese, but that’s not unusual.

There have been rumors of many changes. Yet while priests have asked for and been promised lists of current employees and department heads, no full listing has been given.

These things are intertwined. There is no longer a Family Life Department. Cutbacks. How, in the Year of the Family, will these requests of the Holy Father and the suggestions by the “Dicastery” for Family Life be carried out?

They may be shifted to the parish. However, parishes are strapped because the Diocese keeps demanding money (assessments/taxes) to feed the beast.

Consultants and public relations gimmicks are not the answer. The TRUTH is the answer. Sincere reconciliation and apologies to the victims may be part of the answer.

If someone gives the parish a gift of \$1000, we are overjoyed! But that gift would not even cover 1 hour of the new attorneys’ fees!

And there is the deep moral dilemma for me. A number of parishioners have asked me how they can give to the parish but avoid money going to the Diocese of Buffalo. That is virtually impossible.

If you don’t maintain your level of generosity — which has been so faithful and great—we cannot maintain our level of ministry. On the other hand, when you give, the Diocese demands about 25% of our income.

There is no trustworthy accountability as to where that money is directed, in my opinion.

Attorney Michael Taheri has offered opinions on these matters in the local media (newspaper and tv) which are worthy of consideration, yet ideas which are outside the norms of the institution which have been in place for at least the time of Bishop Head (1972) are so ingrained they are hard to change.

Finally, I have had the opportunity to meet and speak with about a half-dozen victims of the abuse and cover-up over the years. It has humbled me, taught me, and caused many tears. Protect your Children!

A special year to bear witness to family love

On 19 March 2021, the fifth anniversary of the Apostolic Exhortation *Amoris laetitia*, on the joy and beauty of familial love, Pope Francis will inaugurate the Year “*Amoris Laetitia* Family,” which will conclude on 26 June 2022 on the occasion of the World Meeting of Families in Rome. The Holy Father will be present for the Meeting.

Family, the domestic Church

“The pandemic experience has highlighted the central role of the family as the domestic Church, and has shown the importance of community ties between families,” the Dicastery said in a statement announcing the Year. “Through the spiritual, pastoral, and cultural initiatives planned in the Year ‘*Amoris Laetitia* Family,’ Pope Francis intends to address all ecclesial communities throughout the world, exhorting each person to be a witness of family love.”

Formation instruments at the service of communities

The statement goes on to say that the Dicastery will share resources on “family spirituality, formation and pastoral activity for marriage preparation, affective education for young people, and on the holiness of married couples and families who live out the grace of the sacrament in their daily life.” In addition, international academic symposia will be organized, “to examine in-depth the contents and implications of the Apostolic Exhortation in relation to highly topical issues that affect families around the world.”

Concrete suggestions

The Dicastery also offers concrete suggestions for initiatives that can be implemented in dioceses and parishes throughout the year, including strengthening marriage preparation programs and accompanying newlyweds in their first years of marriages, and organizing meetings for parents on how to raise their children. The brochure suggests “promoting meetings for reflection and discussion on the beauty and challenges of family life, which should expand horizons both in terms of recognizing the value of the family on a societal level; as well as in creating well-established networks of pastors and families who, by their own sharing and witness, can accompany those who are struggling.” The brochure also addresses the care and concern that should be shown for couples in crisis.

The elderly, too, should be the object of pastoral attention, which “seeks to overcome the ‘throw-away culture’ and societal indifference”; while youth ministry should be incorporated “into initiatives that reflect upon and discuss issues such as family, marriage, chastity, openness to life, the use of social media, poverty, and respect for creation (cf. AL, 40).” The brochure also recommends special attention to young children during the Year.

A further suggestion is to “promote a missionary vocation in families (cf. AL, 201, 230, and 324) by creating times for formation in evangelization and missionary initiatives (e.g., on the occasion of children’s reception of the sacraments, during marriage preparation, anniversaries or important liturgical moments.”

Youth Ministry Reflection:
Still Traveling to Meet Him

The Feast of the Epiphany to me is a great reminder that Christmas is not meant to be one day of the year. We are always on this journey to meet the King, and we are especially reminded of that in this great season.

We have a lot to bring before The Christ, and we certainly need more than one day to do it. I especially like the story that the wise men ar-

rived sometime after the birth of Jesus. It does a couple things for the story in my mind: it creates a bit more of an atmosphere of solitude for the Holy Family on that most blessed night of the Birth of Our Lord, and it also shows us that sometimes we have a bit more time than we think.

In college, I liked to give myself personal deadlines for papers and projects a bit ahead of the time they were due. I would hold myself to the fact that they were due when I wanted them to be, sometimes a week in advance to the actual due date. Then I would work hard to meet my deadline and if I was a bit off, it was okay, but when I did hit the early deadline, I had time to proof it and minimize the stress of getting something done just under the wire. I think the wise men had to have a mentality that allowed for some wiggle room with their predictions and expeditions. I like the idea that the star which was leading them could have been over the manger on the night of the nativity, but then that it moved to Joseph's home after that night.

I guess what I am trying to say here, is that the Lord still desires souls to pursue Him. Sometimes we find Him in different places, but it does not make those encounters less real or less important.

I experienced a new kind of solitude this Christmas. I was frustrated at first, but in a moment of grace I was overwhelmed by gratitude for the opportunity to meet Christ in a new way. I felt a new small way that I could relate to the Holy Family. It was something that I knew I didn't deserve, but that it was a gift the Lord Himself was offering me. I will never forget this Christmas, and I know that my prayers to meet the King of the Universe anew, and to view Him with the eyes of St. Joseph were answered in some new and beautiful way.

I pray that we might continue to walk towards Christ, despite the circumstance, the sorrow or the trial, that all would be seen as an opportunity to meet Him on the road. May we be the wise men and women of faith, who do not limit encounters with Christ to specific times or places, but that we might be always ready to follow the star, to listen to the Spirit within us, urging us to say yes to this beautiful faith of which we find ourselves a part.
