

From the Desk of Father David

Dear Friends in Christ,

Going to Confession is the hardest Sacrament to participate in, because ever since we were children we were told not to show our faults to anyone. In Confession, we come before the priest who stands in the place of God and the Church to admit our short comings. Because the priest is aware of his own struggles with sin and how difficult it is to change, he is called to be compassionate, a sign of God's mercy. Remember, priests also go to confession.

Benefits of going to Confession are:

Our sins become concrete as we say them, thereby making it harder to fool ourselves. We recognize our need for God and His help. The priest can help us see how our sins are interconnected and help us locate the root sin. You chop the root sin by replacing it with a virtue and the other sins disappear or at least lessen. You create the opportunity to receive guidance through the priest. It gives great witness to others of your love for God.

You know through the Sacrament you are forgiven.

Nuts and bolts: When people come to confession, I am humbled because I know how hard it is to come and admit your faults. Especially for those who have been away for a long time. First, tell the priest when was the last time you were to Confession. Then tell him your sins. The priest does not need to know how many times, but it helps him to know how frequently. There is a big difference if the sin is committed once compare to every day. Some adults are writing out their sins and Act of Contrition, some even use a confession app. Come to confession frequently, I suggest at least every four months. The priest gives you a penance to help you make up for your sins and to help you avoid that sin. At the end, the priest stretches out His hand as a sign of Him calling down God's love and forgiveness as he speaks the words of Absolution. Please take time to reflect upon the Prayer of Absolution.

Prayer of Absolution

God the Father of mercies through the death and resurrection of His Son has reconciled the world Himself and sent the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins. Through the ministry of the Church, I absolve you of your sins. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

God thank you for reconciling us through the blood of your Son, Jesus. Help us to be grateful for the forgiveness you offer us and to freely give forgiveness to others.

An Introduction to the Liturgy of the Hours

From the beginning of the Church, the Liturgy of the Eucharistdoing what Jesus wants us to do in memory of Him until He comes again-has been our central act of worship and the way we keep holy the Lord's Day. It's the prayer of Sunday, the first day of the week, by which we sanctify the whole week.

But there was always a desire for daily prayer, a way of sanctifying each day. Here the Church followed the Jewish practice and used the Prayer Book of the Bible, the Book of Psalms. A collection of sung prayers to God that give Him praise and thanks, seek His favor and express distress in times of difficulties. The Benedictine monks, whose motto was "Ore et Labore", pray and work, made these psalms part of their rhythm of life and arranged to pray them mainly as morning and evening prayer but also at mid morning, midday, mid-afternoon and midnight.

They included prayer-poems from other books in the Bible called Canticles, and added short readings from the Old Testament, hymns, other prayers and moments of silence. This arrangement became known as the Liturgy of the Hours; it is required of men in holy orders and is sometimes called the Divine Office; religious sisters make it part of their daily practice and the Second Vatican Council encouraged the laity make it their own. When we pray it, we are to do so not simply for our own devotion, but on behalf of the whole Church. It is considered the official daily prayer of the Church.

What makes it very appealing is that the psalms were the daily prayer of Jesus, Mary and His first disciples. In fact, praying the psalms helped Jesus fulfill his own ministry and it helped the disciples understand His mission. In Like's Gospel we are told that after Jesus rose from the dead He appeared to His disciples and said, "everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled" (Lk 24:44). Because Jesus prayed these Jewish psalms He turned them into Christian prayer. To help us see them so, you'll find lines in italics that are not to be recited but make connection to our new life in Christ.

The Liturgy of the Hours does not replace the Mass, it complements the Mass by preparing us to celebrate the Mass with greater devotion and, after Mass, by applying the fruits of the Mass to our daily life. In community prayer it is usually prayed by alternating sides; one side of the Church recites one part, the other side of the Church recites the next, and so on. The high point of each psalm, like each decade of the Rosary, is the doxology when we give glory to our Triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit
