Personal Hygiene Products Outreach Ministry.

A number of years ago, with Fr. Joe's approval, members of the Events Committee formed a sub-committee whose responsibility is to organize personal care items donated by our parishioners and to then deliver these items to various agencies.

The agencies we have supported include Catholic Charities, St. Girard's Place, St. Gianna's Outreach Center, Response to Love, St. Luke's Mission of Mercy, and the Veteran's Hospital. Program coordinators from these agencies have overwhelmingly expressed their gratitude for your generosity and have, over the years, sent notes expressing how much they and their clients appreciate our efforts.

Suggested adult items include body soap and lotion, toothbrushes and toothpaste, deodorant, shaving cream and razors, feminine hygiene items, hairbrushes and combs, Q-tips, and small tissue packs. Children's items such as baby wash, shampoo, lotion, baby wipes, and diapers are suggested for the little ones. It is important that you remember we can accept new, unopened, unused items only. We cannot accept any items that have an expiration date that has passed.

We are seeking help with this important ministry, especially one or two adults to head up our efforts.

A FEW WORDS FROM YOUR PASTOR

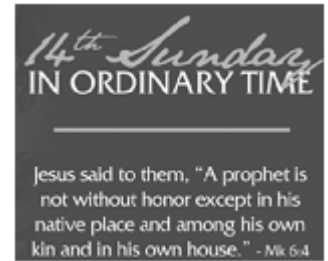
For the last two weekends I have been sharing with you in this column the information each pastor has been receiving regarding the "Road to Renewal." This is the "Family of Parishes" model that has been chosen by the Diocese as part of its effort to move forward in the midst of various trends which are unsympathetic to the practice of faith of any sort, including our own Catholic faith. However, perhaps in view of the complexity of restructuring all 161 parishes, we received an email this past week that the "Road to Renewal" and "Family of Parishes" are now being paused; so, we await further direction and dialogue. I, for one, am grateful that this process is, at the moment, being slowed down. Given that all of our parishes are seeking to recover from factors beyond our control – the devastating effects of the coronavirus pandemic shutdown, the clergy abuse scandal, the diocesan bankruptcy – it does not seem that this present moment would be the best time to attempt any major restructuring of all parishes too rapidly. The aforementioned factors in our diocese, as well as societal trends everywhere in the nation (and world?), seem to be trending toward individualism, at the expense of community. And, honestly, what is a parish if it is not a community of believers in Jesus Christ, Crucified and Risen?

The coronavirus pandemic changed our lives in profound and varied ways, not the least of which was (and is) the constant emphasis on "social distancing." Since we humans are social by nature, a result of the pandemic has been that of isolation. Even now, despite so many being vaccinated, I would venture to say that nearly one-half have not returned to church yet. The state and county and diocese have all ended capacity limits in churches, but our churches throughout the diocese, as far as I know, are far from the attendance that we enjoyed prior to the pandemic. It is my hope – what else do we have if we do not have hope – that those who have not been at Mass since March of 2020 will continue to come back. I am open to your suggestions of whatever you think I should be doing additionally that would help others to come back to Mass. I realize that the church is hot in the summer, and that some might wish it were air-conditioned. As you know, I personally love the winter, and putting on the vestments on top of clothes in church during the summer heat is not exactly my preference. However, I find that whatever temporary inconvenience the heat brings is more than made up for by the encouragement I find in celebrating with you our faith in Jesus.

Next weekend, Sister Ann Marie Grasso and Sister Mary Laura Lesniak will be coming to our parishes (one for each parish) to speak at all Masses on behalf of the Summer Missions Appeal. They will share with us the work of the Sisters of St. Mary of Namur in both our own nation and the eight other countries where they serve. There will be a special second collection at each Mass to support the work of their congregation as they bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to people both near and far. Thank you for your support of their many good works.
