Parish Outreach Ministry. A number of years ago, with Fr. Joe's approval, members of the Events Committee formed a sub-committee whose responsibility is to organize personal care items donated by our parishioners and to then deliver these items to various agencies.



The agencies we have supported include Catholic Charities, St. Girard's Place, St. Gianna's Outreach Center, Response to Love, St. Luke's Mission of Mercy, and the Veteran's Hospital. Program coordinators from these agencies have overwhelmingly expressed their gratitude for your generosity and have, over the years, sent notes expressing how much they and their clients appreciate our efforts.

Suggested adult items include body soap and lotion, toothbrushes and toothpaste, deodorant, shaving cream and razors, feminine hygiene items, hairbrushes and combs, Q-tips, and small tissue packs. Children's items such as baby wash, shampoo, lotion, baby wipes, and diapers are suggested for the little ones. It is important that you remember we can accept new, unopened, unused items only. We cannot accept any items that have an expiration date that has passed.

We are seeking help with this important ministry, especially one or two adults to head up our efforts.


A FEW WORDS FROM YOUR PASTOR

With some frequency, all the priests of the diocese lately have been receiving updates on the "Road to Renewal". This process was begun during the time when Bishop Scharfenberger was the Apostolic Administrator of the diocese, for that year or so which began with Bishop Malone's retirement and ended with the appointment of Bishop Fisher. At the time of its inception, I do not remember any mention of this new endeavor, that is, of the Road to Renewal. But a few months after the process had begun, we then began to hear about it. So perhaps a couple of months ago Bishop Fisher visited each vicariate of the diocese, including our own vicariate, which is named the Vicariate of Northwest-Central Buffalo. Then Fr. Bryan Zielenieski, who is the Vicar for Renewal, also came to speak with the priests of our vicariate. And Bishop Mike Fisher and Father Bryan Zielenieski together have also now begun meeting with the priests of the diocese by age groups. First, they met with priests ordained in the last ten years. Next, they met with priests ordained from ten to twenty-five years ago. And two weeks ago, they met with some of the priests ordained twenty-five years and older. Now approaching my 34th year as a priest, I was a participant in that most recent meeting. So, at present, I have been at three meetings sponsored by the diocese regarding the Road to Renewal.

It would be less than honest on my part if I were to tell you that I perfectly understand what the Road to Renewal is. Its goal seems obvious enough: in the wake of a clergy abuse scandal, the bankruptcy and reorganization of the diocese, and the devastating effects of the coronavirus pandemic, how can we begin to rebuild and reinvigorate our community of Catholic faithful in these eight counties of Western New York? On the other hand, from the time our Lord walked this earth some two thousand years ago, has there ever been a time when the Church did *not* need rebuilding? In fact, over 800 years ago St. Francis of Assisi heard the voice of Jesus from the Crucifix of San Damiano speaking to him the words, "Francis, rebuild my Church. You can see it is in ruins." But the issue is in the details. Isn't it always?

I have never been a great fan of too many meetings. There just aren't enough hours in the day as it is. But I have been attentive to these Road to Renewal meetings and have done so precisely because they may directly affect all members of all parishes in the diocese in the years to come. There are not a lot of details that are certain just yet. The model that the diocese has decided to follow is called the "Family of Parishes" model. There are currently 161 parishes in the diocese, and these would be organized into 36 "families" of parishes. These "families" of parishes seem to have been decided largely based on geographical proximity. Our "family" of parishes would be Holy Spirit, St. Joseph-University, St. Margaret, St. Mark, and St. Rose. The goal would be to foster a greater sharing of personnel among the parishes which comprise a "family." But as I (and others) have pointed out at these meetings, such a sharing of personnel has already been taking place. I will let you know the state of any progress as any new details are announced. For now, I would simply ask that you pray for the Spirit's guidance of the diocese.

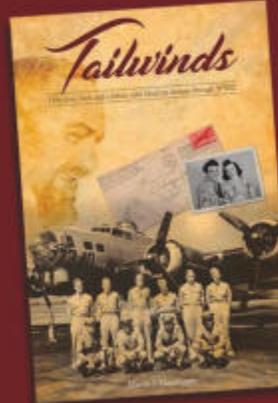
