

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER
UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts. Later in the afternoon, he experienced a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the emergency department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist, having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.

We all have our wake-up calls. We have experiences and encounters that force us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our needs to lure us into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is a self we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

We spin our wheels, naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But, we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of us. In order to heed his invitation, we must leave our ego-self behind and follow.

When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well.

WANT TO SAVE TAXES ON YOUR IRA WITHDRAWAL?

If you are the owner of a traditional IRA, you can use your
required minimum distribution (RMD) to help your favorite
charities, including St. Peter's Parish and/or our "St. Peter
R.C. School Lewiston Endowment Fund." These gifts
remain strictly within our parish. The general details are:

- must be age 70 ½ or older
- must have a traditional IRA (can't be done out of a 401k account)
- You can donate up to \$100,000 of your RMD amount per year directly to a non-profit organization from your IRA account.
- In doing so, you will avoid paying ordinary income tax on the amount of the distribution.
- doesn't have to be all to one charity or in one lump sum
- can be done anytime during the year

A Message from our Principal

I know many times in the past when I have written in the bulletin, I have referenced something that touched me or really hit home; from a book of "every day devotions," that I received as a gift from a very special friend when I retired from teaching in Niagara Falls in 2009. (WOW...am I getting old!!!) But the beauty of this collection of readings, with which I begin each day, is that the messages allow me to make real life connections...some more than others...every single day. And...some days...this is just what I need to add meaning and purpose to all that is going on in my life, in our school, in the world!

We, at St. Peter RC School, have been blessed... and with the constant vigilance and ever-present efforts of our teachers and staff, our children and our families, we have been able to remain open at SPS five full days every week. We have had a few positive cases since September, where classes had to be quarantined as required by NYSDOH and NCDOH guidelines, we have had our days when we were short substitute teachers, (I was the PE teacher a couple of times...OUCH!!) and we have excluded all from entering our building to limit exposures we are unsure of...but we keep going...and we are just about at the midpoint of the school year. We are tired, but grateful that we can continue to make all of this happen, especially during these terribly tough times.

- Every class in quarantine has had full instruction virtually, by their classroom and special area teachers, and has kept up with the remote learning that is offered for all daily...never missing a beat
- We have maintained wherever possible all specials that enhance our regular instruction
- We have provided tours, Christmas programs and lessons, virtually, and have an active website and presence on Face Book, so that even if people cannot "physically come into the building, they can know and see all that is happening inside!

My reading this morning reminded me that this is ALL a part of God's plan...a plan to be lived and embraced.....Jesus said...

*'I am leading you along the high road, but there are descents as well as ascents. In the distance you see snow-covered peaks, glistening in brilliant sunlight. Your longing to reach those peaks is good, but you must not take shortcuts. Your assignment is to follow Me, allowing Me to direct your paths. Let the heights beckon you onward, but stay close to Me. Learn to trust Me when things go wrong. Disruptions to your routine highlight your dependence on Me. Trusting acceptance of trials brings blessings that far outweigh them all. Walk hand and hand with me through this day. I have lovingly planned every inch of the way. Trust does not falter when the path becomes rocky and steep. Breathe deep draughts of my presence, and hold tightly to my hand.
Together we can make it!*

Social distancing is a requirement in this time of pandemic...keep six feet apart from all of those around you! THAT rule does not apply to God... feel free to break all protocols and hold His hand tightly, His heart warmly, and follow Him always.


