

St. Peter Parish Family,

It has been two years since we walked this solemn journey together. This past year all of us have experienced in one way or another the pain of the cross, and the struggles of humanity that befall us who await utter union with God. With having to be away from the Sacraments for a time, sickness in our families, not being able to see our loved ones, the loss of family members and friends, we have been through a lot, learned a lot, and have hopefully come to a new appreciation of what is most important in life.

We begin this week walking that final journey with our beloved Lord. As he enters Jerusalem among the cheering crowds crying out “*Hosanna*,” he knows what awaits – death. We hear in The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ today, “*My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not as I will, but as you will.*” This is none other than complete resignation of human will to the Divine.

As we begin the most holy and solemn week of the Liturgical Year, we enter with our pains and sorrows, we enter limping along. Despite the subdued joy that comes from the anticipation of the joy of Easter, let us along with Jesus, give up our spirit. On Good Friday in the Passion according to the Gospel of John, we will hear Jesus say, “*It is finished, and bowing his head he handed over the spirit.*” It is to God’s Divine will, it is into the loving, forgiving, and merciful hands of the Father, that we too offer our souls. Giving up and surrendering ourselves are altogether different, for it is by relinquishing ourselves to Divine will that we *KNOW* new life, renewal, and resurrection awaits. Jesus made the journey for us and now we make the journey with him. After all we have experienced, let us pray, “*Father, into your hands, WE commend our spirits.*” With what seems like absolute darkness now, just wait and trust for the story is not yet over and what is coming will completely change our lives now and for eternity. And so we enter into the mystery...



All Are Welcome!

Beginning in 2015, [The Foundation of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y., Inc.](#) ("Foundation") began soliciting donations to its "Upon this Rock" ("UTR") capital and endowment campaign. The UTR campaign raised funds for many purposes, including soliciting funds for making essential upgrades to classroom facilities and technology of Christ the King Seminary ("CKS"), expanding CKS's role as a center of retreat and religious celebration, and establishing an endowment fund for CKS. Unfortunately, in early 2020, CKS's Board of Trustees determined that CKS would close at the end of the 2020-2021 academic year. CKS's closure will make it impossible for the Foundation to use the UTR funds raised for CKS for their original intended purposes. However, under New York law, when the original purposes for which funds are donated become impossible to achieve, those purposes can be modified in a manner consistent with original intent by the New York State courts. For many years, CKS provided education and formation for ordained and lay ecclesial ministers in the Diocese of Buffalo and beyond. Accordingly, the Foundation has asked the New York State Supreme Court for the County of Erie to approve a modification of the purposes of UTR funds raised for CKS so that those funds can be used to support the education and formation for ordained and lay ecclesial ministry in the Diocese of Buffalo, [as determined in the discretion of the Foundation's Board](#). If you have donated to UTR and would like to be heard regarding this requested modification, you may send a letter to: The Foundation of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y., Inc., attention Executive Director, 795 Main Street, Buffalo, N.Y. 14203 or an email to donor.info@frcdb.org. Copies of letters or email received by the Foundation will be provided to the Court. You may also make a formal filing in the legal proceeding entitled *Matter of the Modification of Endowment Funds of The Foundation of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Buffalo N.Y., Inc.*, Erie County Index No. 814747/2020. In order for your submission to be available for the Court's consideration, please be sure to send any letter or email, or make any filing, no later than Friday, April 9, 2021.

2022 Mass Intention Book

The 2022 Mass Intention Book is now available. We ask that you call the rectory office at 754-4118 before coming in to schedule any Masses. Mass requests will also be taken by phone, via email and through the mail at this time.

The following guidelines will be implemented this year:

- Only fifteen (15) Mass requests per parish family.
- Only four (4) of those fifteen will be scheduled on a weekend.

There is a \$15.00 stipend for each Mass requested, payable by cash or check (made payable to St. Peter RC Parish).

What does it mean to have a Mass “offered” for someone?

When a priest celebrates Mass each day, he *offers* each celebration of the Eucharist for a particular person, or intention. By doing so he applies special graces from God upon that person or intention.

Similar to how we are able to intercede for others by our personal prayers, the Church is able to intercede for us through the celebration of the Mass. However, since the Eucharist is the “source and summit of the Christian life” the Mass possess a power that our personal prayers do not.

Pope Paul VI said, “The Mass is the most perfect form of prayer!” It has immense power and countless miracles and conversions have occurred throughout the centuries by offering Masses for a specific “intention or person. Mass intentions are a great treasure of the Church and have a spiritual weight that is incalculable.

A Mass Intention may be said for:

1. A deceased loved one
2. A living person who is sick or suffering
3. A living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life;
4. In thanksgiving to God (including the Lord Jesus or the Holy Spirit);
5. In thanksgiving for a favor granted through the intercession of a Blessed or a Saint; For a prayer intention (so long as the intention does not contradict Church teaching)




