Please remember these friars in your prayers as they begin their formation in the Order of Preachers.




### **Prayer for Vocations**

## 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

On December 10, 1979, a very petite holy woman known as Mother Teresa of Calcutta spoke these words in her Nobel Peace Prize Acceptance Speech, "But I am sure in the families and many of our homes, maybe we are not hungry for a piece of bread, but maybe there is somebody there in the family who is unwanted, unloved, uncared, forgotten, there isn't love. Love begins at home. And love to be true has to hurt. I never forget a little child who taught me a very beautiful lesson. They heard in Calcutta, the children, that Mother Teresa had no sugar for her children, and this little one, Hindu boy four years old, he went home and he told his parents: I will not eat sugar for three days, I will give my sugar to Mother Teresa. How much a little child can give. After three days they brought into our house, and there was this little one who could scarcely pronounce my name, he loved with great love, he loved until it hurt. And this is what I bring before you, to love one another until it hurts, but don't forget that there are many children, many children, many men and women who haven't got what you have. And remember to love them until it hurts."

Living authentically and walking with holiness always involves sacrifice. It has to hurt. Only actions springing from true and deep sacrifice demonstrate true integrity. Without sacrifice, even what is apparently a generous gesture can be nothing. It is no wonder that the widow who contributed from her poverty received great admiration from Jesus and the young child in our story above the interest of Mother Teresa. It is easy to make the houses of our lives look like they are in perfect order when in fact they are in shambles within. Religion can sometimes make this hypocritical masquerade easy to accomplish. We can find ourselves in all the right holy places, reciting all of the correct prayers, participating in community collections, and reciting the proper doctrines only to find ourselves empty, shallow, self-focused, and overly anxious about personal concerns.

The one who learns to discover their inner poverty, their spiritual poverty, is the only one who can truly place him or herself at the mercy of God. It is only when we allow ourselves to be empty that we realize Who we actually need to fill us. This is the real meaning of trust. Many of us are afraid to take the plunge. We allow ourselves to detach from only so much, always keeping a watchful eye on the protection of our securities. We understand the value of poverty, but we do not want to become too poor. As long as we are able to recognize this tension, our reluctance to let go and our struggle, we can continue our journey of humbly learning how to love so deeply that it hurts. God understands and waits.

## As a family, how can we pray for the Dead?

Helping our loved ones get to Heaven is a beautiful task. Here are just a few ways you can pray for the dead.

### Anointing of the Sick.

So much grace, forgiveness, and even healing, can come from receiving this sacrament. If a loved one is nearing death, or even undergoing a serious procedure, consider asking a priest to come administer last rites. If someone dies without receiving this sacrament, you can still ask a priest to administer it.

### Funeral Mass.

The funeral Mass comforts family and friends and formally commends the soul of our loved one to God. Graces will abound.

### All Souls' Day.

On November 2, we remember everyone who has died. We invite you to take a prayer card for a deceased member of our parish and pray for their soul. It is also a tradition in the Catholic Church to visit a cemetery on that day. Pray for your loved ones there and for all the souls who have no one to pray for them.

### Mass.

You may recall hearing intentions at Mass for people who have died, either before Mass begins or during the intercessions. This is a great way to receive prayers for your loved one from your parish community.

### Light a Candle.

Most Catholic churches have shrines of Mary, Jesus, and the Saints with candles you can light. This is a beautiful way to ask for their intercession for your loved one.

### Pray the Rosary.

**The Rosary** is one of the most powerful prayers available to us. It is particularly powerful in praying for the dead. Each Hail Mary even ends with asking for grace in death: "pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death."

### Anniversary.

You can make a special effort to pray for your loved one on the anniversary of his or her death. You could visit the grave and offer special prayers on that day.

### Offer it Up.

Our days are filled many little trials and sufferings. We can offer these pains for our loved ones. When something happens, we can say something like, "Jesus, I offer You this pain for this person."

### Pictures.

Keep photographs of your deceased loved ones in your home. Every time you see them, offer a quick prayer for them.



## "Christmas Angel Tree"



In keeping with the spirit of Christmas and this Holiday Season, we are again requesting your support for our annual "Christmas Angel Tree Project". A Christmas Tree decorated with angels will be located at both church sites - St Peter and St. Bernard. As per tradition, our SPS children will also be adopting families.

This year in addition to the program sponsored by Catholic Health Mount St. Mary's Hospital, we will also be partnering with the Youngstown/ Town of Porter Christmas program.

**"Angels" from that program with specific requests will be placed on the tree at the St. Bernard site.**

**MSMH NHC program** - each angel will contain the sex and age of a child that is served by MSMH Neighborhood Health Center as well as community referrals that qualify for assistance. Due to COVID restrictions, once again the parents will not be able to come "shopping" for their children at the Niagara Falls Conference Center and the requests on the angels are quite limited. Each angel specifies a requested clothing item and size or a gift card from **Children's Place or Carters**. Additional gifts of hats, gloves, scarves and socks are always welcome. After choosing the angel, we are asking that you return the gift (place under the Christmas tree at each church) in a box or gift bag, **unwrapped, with the angel attached to the gift, no later than Sunday, December 5<sup>th</sup>.**

**If an angel is taken off the tree at St. Peter's, it must be returned to the St. Peter site.**

**11/21: Creed Workshop Grades 1-5 at St. Bernard's  
10:15 -11:15 am**

Our younger students will learn the basic tenets of the Apostles and Nicene Creeds. These Creeds express our Catholic faith through the Holy Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our students will learn why we make the Sign of the Cross and how it reminds us of the teachings in the two Creeds of our faith. Students will also be able to learn about St. Patrick and how he taught the Holy Trinity and the Creeds to the people of Ireland.

**11/22: Inter-Religious Dialogue Workshop Grades 6-8  
at St. Peter's 6:00 - 7:00 pm**

This lesson geared towards our older groups of students, will focus on the importance of inter-religious dialogue. This means that as Catholics, we are called to follow our faith and its teachings, but respect and love others who may not believe what we believe. The students will learn about the true definition of tolerance: the conditional acceptance of or non-interference with beliefs, actions, or practices that one considers to be wrong but still "tolerable," such that they should not be prohibited or constrained. It is not just blindly accepting everyone's beliefs, but knowing the Fullness of Truth comes from the Catholic Church and seeing the world and its varied beliefs through that lens.

**11/22: Sacred Scripture Workshop Grades 6-8 at  
St. Bernard's 6:00 - 7:00 pm**

This lesson is focused on the role Sacred Scripture plays in every Catholic's journey to sainthood. The students will be focusing on how the Old Testament is revealed in the New Testament, the miracles Jesus performed in the Gospels, and how to read Scripture attentively and prayerfully through Lectio Divina. They will also learn how saints such as St. Anthony of Padua and St. Bernadette encountered the Incarnate Word of God, Jesus Christ, through Scripture.




