## GOSPEL MEDITATION The Baptism of the Lord

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ."- Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

#### The Feast of our Lord's Baptism

The Feast of our Lord's Baptism is celebrated on the Sunday after Epiphany. While it may seem a little strange to celebrate a moment in Christ's adult life so quickly after honoring His birth, it is entirely fitting when reflecting on the central mystery being commemorated. Both the Feast of the Nativity and Baptism of the Lord highlight the humility of Jesus Christ, who not only assumed our flesh at the Nativity, but also became like us in all things but sin. He was therefore baptized by His cousin, John the Baptist, to show us the way to our Heavenly Father's grace.

Holy Water is a sacramental that remits venial sin. Because of the blessings attached to it, Holy Mother Church strongly urges its use upon her children. You may use it to bless your children at bedtime, or before they leave the house. Keep in a door side basin to bless yourselves in your comings and goings, or sprinkle in your home for Holy protection in sickness, and other calamities.

In honor of this Baptismal Feast we are offering Holy Water to those who may be interested. Because we have yet to be cleared to offer it in the fonts at the entrances, you will be able to get small bottles of holy water near the sacristy door at St. Peter's site, and at the entrance font at St. Bernard's site. As always, you may refill your bottles at our Holy Water font as needed.

#### Baptismal Bib

#### Question:

At my grandson's Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. I do not remember seeing this before. Why is this done? Is it something new?

#### Answer:

When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.

Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like and fit over the baby's head. Others are simply placed on the baby's chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all: "See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers and this is symbolized by the white garment.
