FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

December 26, 2021
Feast of the Holy Family

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

The Nativity of Our Lord: A warm *Merry Christmas* to each of you! A Child is born for us! A Savior is given us! How blessed we truly are! In this season of giving, the greatest gift came with the birth of our Redeemer. In this season of beauty, nothing radiates more beauty than the manger scene of Bethlehem. And in this season of love, the greatest love of all is the very source of love itself – our wonderful God and Father! Jesus, remember, could have chosen to save us from our sins in any number of ways, but he chose to take on our flesh and share in our humanity. He is like us in all things but sin. He understands intimately our joys and our sorrows. Though Jesus is God, He is also one of us. And though human, you and I are invited to share in the very divinity of God. How amazing is our hope!

The Holy Family and Our Family: We are enjoying back-to-back feasts this weekend: Christmas on Saturday and Holy Family on Sunday! It is a most significant reality that our Savior chose to be born into a family. In the plan and providence of God, family life is of the utmost importance. As the Blessed Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – is a communion of persons and a communion of love, so the human family – father, mother, and children – is meant to be a communion of persons and communion of love. Please pray for strong families. The breakdown of the family leads to the breakdown of our society. But holy families (not perfect, mind you, but holy) provide the foundation of a just and peaceful civilization. And if I may speak to our parish families, thank you for your examples of faith and commitment to the Church. Especially for our older parishioners and our widows/widowers, you young families offer a burst of hope simply by coming to church and being you! And in the beloved words of Fr. Peyton, the rosary priest, "The family that prays together, stays together." Amen to that!

Shepherds Then and Now: In the time of Jesus, shepherds were near the very bottom of the social hierarchy. They were looked down upon. They were excluded. And yet, to whom did the infant Jesus initially manifest his presence? Those shepherds. The God who was born poor and insignificant, chose the poor and insignificant to be his very first house guests! So to you, who this Christmas, are lonely, forgotten, or distressed. . . please know how very welcome you are here at our parish. Thank you for being at Mass for these feast days, even if you are attending with a pained and suffering heart. As God welcomed and loved those shepherds of Bethlehem, so he welcomes and loves you. I too, want you to know that you are not insignificant. Your presence with us is a blessing for all, and your life, as lonely or as difficult as it may be, is of infinite worth. Please believe that. I promise my prayers for you during this Christmas season. And if you need a kind word or a boost of encouragement, I'd be glad to talk. No one should be forgotten!
