#### FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

January 9, 2022

#### Baptism of the Lord

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

Though sinless, our Lord was baptized in the Jordan by John. Jesus leads where he wishes us to follow. The sacrament of Baptism is the gateway to the Christian life. It marks our souls with the indelible seal of God. Baptism washes us clean of sin (both original and actual sin). It prepares our hearts to enter into the life of faith. And Baptism makes us heirs to the kingdom of God, beloved daughters and sons of the Father.

You and I were created out of love by God and for God. We were given all of the earth to be our home. But we turned away from God through sin (the sin of Adam and Eve, first, and then our own sinfulness in time). Sin alienated us from God and shut the gates of heaven. Sickness and death entered our experience. The human race was in an awful state. Nothing we could do was capable of reversing our condemnation. We could not save ourselves. But God did not leave us abandoned. He sent us his own Son as our Savior and Redeemer. By his life, death, and resurrection, Jesus destroyed the power of sin and death. He opened up for us the path of eternal life. And Jesus demanded that we make a decision. Will you now live for me? Or will you reject me?

We are called to be saints. We are called to a life of holiness. But is that the trajectory our individual lives are taking? If not, we need to admit our sinfulness and return to God. We need to repent of the evil we've done and turn back to the source of life. Each one of us will someday breathe our last breath and find ourselves standing before the judgment seat of God. Are we ready for that moment? Are those we love ready for that moment? A choice must be made.

And so I encourage you to embrace the Christian life with all your being. Christianity is above all a relationship – a romance! – with the person of Jesus Christ. Christianity, lived well, is the greatest of all adventures. But we must go 100% in on Jesus. It's important to reflect: Am I living out my baptismal promises? If not, now is the time for us to turn back in humility and faith. Prayer is essential. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is essential. And the Sunday Eucharist is the absolute source of our strength and our hope. As we forge forward into this New Year, I invite you to consider the following:

- **1.** Is God at the very heart of all that I am and do? If not, what do I need to change? How can I make a greater commitment to Him?
- **2.** The 3<sup>rd</sup> Commandment makes clear that attending Mass each Sunday is an absolute expectation. Am I willing to make that commitment? If my family has strayed, am I ready to work and especially, pray for their return?
- **3.** To whom must I offer forgiveness? With whom do I need to be reconciled?
- **4.** Who in my life needs to hear the good news of Jesus Christ? Who can I invite to return to the Church? Who can I encourage to be baptized?
- **5.** Does my marriage situation need to be made right? Am I ready to take that step? Am I primarily motivated by self-interest or God-interest?

Never forget that you are cherished and loved by the God of the universe. Your life has incomparable worth and beauty. Your prayers and good works, no matter how seemingly insignificant they may seem, are accepted by God with great joy. You really can make a difference in the lives of others. You are needed at your parish and in the Church universal. You are a treasure!




#### **Catholic Schools Week**
