## **Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

Extraordinary "Ordinary" Time: We have returned to the liturgical season known as "Ordinary Time," named as such because the weeks are numbered (or to be precise – "ordered"). To be clear, though, every moment of our lives is a moment meant to be pregnant with the extraordinary. God is with us always. His grace is available. Like Mary at the Annunciation, we need only say "yes" to discover the extraordinary opportunities that lie hidden before us. The poet Gerard Manley Hopkins said it beautifully: The world is charged with the grandeur of God. As Christians, we have the privilege and the responsibility to bring Christ into every moment. Let's make those moments extraordinary!

**St. Anthony of the Desert**: In the 3<sup>rd</sup> century, Christians seeking a more profound experience of prayer and asceticism began to leave the cities and move into the desert. This was especially true in Egypt. Known as the *Desert Fathers*, such men as St. Anthony of Egypt paved the way for the manner of life we now call "monasticism." Anthony's feast day is tomorrow, January 17. Many of the "sayings" of the Desert Fathers have been preserved for our edification. Here is an example from St. Anthony: *The devil is afraid of us when we pray and make sacrifices. He is also afraid when we are humble and good. He is especially afraid when we love Jesus very much. He runs away when we make the Sign of the Cross.* 

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children: So many of you share the hope that this will be the year when we see the Supreme Court strike down the *Roe v. Wade* decision of 1973 and thus return the question of abortion to the states. If that does indeed occur, it will be the answer to five decades of intense prayer, and it will give unborn children an increased chance of survival in America. Hearts and minds still need to be changed, though. The culture of death holds a tight grip on many, and we cannot rest until even the idea of abortion is unthinkable. Since the Day for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children falls on a Saturday this year (January 22), I invite you to Mass and Adoration at Holy Redeemer Church. Mass (with "an end to abortion" as our intention) will begin at 10:00 am. Adoration with the opportunity for confession will follow. Benediction will be at 12:15. Please join us.




