# FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

January 30, 2022 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

**Donut Ya Know**: We are so grateful to the men of the Knights of Columbus Council #964 for hosting a coffee and donut social after the 8:15 am Mass this Sunday. One of the devastating side effects of the coronavirus pandemic has been loneliness. As people have isolated in an attempt to stave off the virus, normal social interactions have been disrupted. But we need each other! The scriptures tell us "we are one body in Christ." We are made for communion with one another. We are created to reflect the communion of the Blessed Trinity itself. When we are cut off from other human beings, when we aren't able to share and talk and laugh with them, our psychological and emotional health is damaged (this is why "solitary confinement" is viewed by many as a form of torture). So as awesome as coffee and donuts are in themselves, the opportunity to be with one another is all the more important. Enjoy! And thank a Knight!

**Tithing Our Blessings**: This weekend's collections are the last of the month and the last to be tithed into our *Parish Emergency Fund* for those in need. We've already had quite a few requests for help this year. We've paid a young mother's electric bill, we've provided lodging for some homeless folks, we've given food assistance to a man down on his luck. And more! Your generosity makes this possible. Thank you! In February, our parish tithe will go to support the *Clarendon Veteran's Center*. You may have heard that the old elementary school in Clarendon is being repurposed to house homeless veterans. The work that is being done there is marvelous! Also, sadly, the need is great. Are you aware that some of our heroic veterans are now living in tents in the surrounding mountains? They are. Be certain, then, that our February tithe will be put to very good use!

You go St. Joe! We wish a very happy *Catholic Schools Week* to all of our students and staff at St. Joseph Catholic School. For the kids, this is a week of dressing in crazy clothes, enjoying sweet treats, and taking a breather from their studies. It's a week of fun! May I say a word, though, about our SJS faculty and staff? They (and almost every Catholic school employee throughout the nation) are grossly underpaid. Yet they stay (often for decades) and they teach and they nurture and they form young disciples for the Lord. Why do they do this? Why do they sacrifice? Because they love the children and they are dedicated to the gospel mission. So please, if you run into a St. Joseph teacher this week, thank them for their service to our youth. St. Joseph is a wonderful place! I encourage our young families to consider sending their own children there.

**Daily Mass:** Those of us who are at Mass every day know that a genuine community forms among those who attend. A spiritual bond exists. Even on some of our recent inclement weather days, folks were still with us for the Eucharist. What a gift to me, as pastor, to have such dedicated parishioners! Maybe daily Mass is something that you might want to make a habit? We'd love to have you. It's another one of those ways of putting God at the center of our lives. And if the early morning Masses are not a possibility for you and your family, remember that we have Mass on Thursday evenings at 7:00 pm.
