

FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

February 6, 2022 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

Pastoral Planning Continues: The priests of our diocese are meeting in groups with Bishop Persico this week to further the discussion of pastoral planning for our parishes and our ministries. I'll be at the meeting in Brockway on Tuesday. You are aware of the key question: How do we continue the Church's mission with a decreased number of priests? You also realize that there are no simple or easy answers to that question. The Catholic community in our own county has experienced the recent merging of once "stand-alone" parishes, and we can certainly anticipate that more of these mergers will continue throughout the 13 counties of our diocese. Sadly, we should also expect that some parishes will have to be closed. I know this is a reality that causes you anxiety and concern. Do I anticipate that St. Anthony will be closed in the next few years? I do not. I hope not. Admittedly, though, difficult decisions must be made throughout the diocese. In the "joyful news" category, though, three new priests are to be ordained for our diocese in June. Praise God for that! So let's stay positive and prayerful. It's God's Church. He will provide.

World Day of the Sick: This Friday, February 11th is the World Day of the Sick. This commemoration always coincides with the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes because so many miracles of healing have occurred through the intercession of Blessed Mary at her shrine in Lourdes, France. I will offer the *Sacrament of the Sick* after the 7:00 am Mass this day for anyone who desires the healing power of Christ. This anointing is especially intended for those with serious illness (physical or emotional), those battling chronic disease, and those struggling with the disabilities of old age. Scripture tells us: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord (James 5:14)."

The Body of Christ: For us as Catholics, the Eucharist is the very bread of life. When we are not together at the altar on Sunday, there is reason for sadness. For me, that sadness is something I am experiencing now. The pandemic has wounded us in many ways. The virus has taken the lives of beloved family members and friends. Our world is only slowly beginning to recover from these ills. And yet our own parish needs to recover as well, for our Eucharistic communion has been injured and weakened. Faces we were accustomed to see at Mass each Sunday are no longer there. I mourn over those who I long to see but do not see. Clearly, a significant number of our brothers and sisters are absent from our spiritual family. But maybe the moment is right to come together again. So I ask you, please, return to Mass if you've been away. Certainly, some of you are in precarious health situations where you simply cannot be together with others in a public setting. I understand that. You must take necessary precautions, and the bishop has made it clear that there is no sin for missing Mass in such a circumstance. You can be at peace. But when I look out at the pews each Sunday morning, I cannot but be concerned that other members of our spiritual family have simply stopped coming to church for other reasons. Is God simply no longer a priority for some families? Are there folks who have ceased practicing their faith due to apathy? Is a pursuit of the world's attractions more alluring than the love of God? Has watching Mass on TV become a convenient excuse for not attending in person? Has fear overtaken our faith in some circumstances? If, for whatever reason, you've chosen to attend Mass at St. Joseph or another parish – that's absolutely fine. We want you to attend somewhere! Anywhere! But if you've simply lost the savor for worship or your family has prioritized other things over God, please know that I welcome you back. I want you back! The world is too dangerous to live in without God at our center. God mourns when you are not at his Eucharist on Sunday. So please, if you can, return to church. My thoughts and prayers are with you all.




