

FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

March 6, 2022 1st Sunday of Lent

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

Conversion: We are sinners. Each of us. Thankfully, Christ took on our human flesh and died on the cross specifically to save us from our sins. Salvation has been won by the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ! We must, though, take hold of this salvation. Conversion is necessary. This means that you and I must freely choose to turn away from sin and embrace the Gospel. It's a battle. We are tempted by the world, by the evil one, and by the flesh. Christ experienced these same temptations. Yet he never succumbed. He remained sinless throughout his life. Now, he offers us his presence and his compassion. He makes his mercy and his healing available through the Church's sacraments. The choice is ours. Do we love righteousness more than sin? Do we prefer light over darkness? These days of Lent are days especially suited for examining our conscience. Humility and honesty serve us well in identifying and naming our sins. We can't hide our hearts from God. He knows. Nonetheless, the Lord respects our freedom. He will not force us to love him. Personal conversion is required. Repent! That was the call of John the Baptist. Repent! That was the call of Jesus himself. Lent is a season for running to God. Lent is a season of forgiveness and new beginnings. Lent is a season for my conversion and yours.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation: Why do Catholics confess their sins to a priest? Because that's the gift that Jesus Christ gave us. Yes, Confession is a gift! On the very first Easter night, Jesus appeared in the Upper Room to his first priests – the Apostles – and said to them: "*If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven* (John 20:23)." What an amazing gift! So please, go to confession. I sure do. No matter what our sin, and no matter how great (and humiliating) that sin may be, it is wiped clean in this sacrament. The devil definitely does not want us to go to Confession. And that's all the more reason to go!

The Sacrament of Confirmation: Bishop Persico will be in town (at St. Joseph's) on Thursday, March 10 to bestow the Sacrament of Confirmation on quite a few of our 10th and 11th grade students. To reach this moment, these young people have persevered through the difficult pandemic days and through the moral minefield which is our culture. I am proud of them. Come, Holy Spirit! Set them on fire with your love!

Visits to the Blessed Sacrament: Please remember that Holy Redeemer is open throughout the day and into the evening so that you may enter in and pray. Mother Teresa taught us that the best moments of life are spent in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. She could say this because she so intimately knew the One who abides in the Eucharist. Jesus is alive and present in our tabernacles! He longs for our visit. He loves us without limit. Let's go to him often during this Lenten season!

Last Synod Session: Today is the last of our Synod Listening Sessions at Holy Redeemer: Sunday, March 6, from 1:00-3:00 pm. Audrey Davis and Virginia Baker have done a beautiful service in facilitating these sessions. 

Meatless Soups for Lent

Broccoli Cheese Soup

5Tbsp. Butter 1 medium onion, chopped 1/4 C. Flour 2 C. vegetable stock 2 C. half & half 3 C. broccoli 3/4 tsp. salt 3/4 tsp. salt 3/4 tsp. pepper 1/2 tsp. paprika 1.2 tsp. dry mustard 1/8 tsp. garlic powder Pinch of cayenne pepper 2 C. shredded sharp cheddar cheese

Sauté onion and butter. Add flour and cook a couple minutes to form a rue. Whisk in broth gradually. Add milk, wine and spices. Simmer 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add broccoli and simmer another 15 minutes or until broccoli is tender. Remove from heat and stir in cheese until incorporated.
