

FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

April 24, 2022 *Divine Mercy Sunday*

To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and St. Anthony,

Easter Joy: As we conclude the Octave of Easter, I look back with gratitude at our celebration of the Triduum and the Lord's Resurrection. What a joy that so many of you participated throughout those sacred days! I sincerely hope that you found our liturgies to be prayerful, reverent, and beautiful. I am incredibly appreciative of the many folks who worked hard to make that happen. In particular, wasn't it wonderful to have Deacon Joe back and in good voice!? It was also good to join together with the people of St. Joseph and St. Luke as we celebrated the Easter Vigil as one community. Not everything, though, went to plan. During the Holy Thursday foot-washing, the handle of the large water pitcher snapped off as I poured water on the second person in line. Yikes! The pitcher dropped, the pitcher broke, and then water flowed out everywhere . . . and . . . well . . . we simply had to laugh. Folks rushed in to clean up and we carried on with more foot washes. God has a wonderful sense of humor!

God's Mercy #1: Many of us, myself included, went to confession during the course of the Lenten season. Both as a penitent in need of forgiveness, and as a priest given the ineffable privilege of absolving from sin in God's name, I am so thankful for the grace that God bestows in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Eucharist is the sacrament *par excellence* of Christ's presence among us, but the sacrament of mercy has a powerful and unique way of touching the depths of our being. Praise God for this gift of forgiveness!

God's Mercy #2: Today's feast – Divine Mercy Sunday – is a true celebration of the Father's tender love. The graces of this day are abundant, so I encourage you to participate in our Holy Hour (April 24, 2:00-3:00 pm, with recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00 pm, followed by benediction). An integral part of this feast is the invitation to make a good confession. Even if you've gone recently, please know that I will be in the confessional during the course of our Holy Hour. Indulgences can also be gained during the Divine Mercy Sunday. Please see the reading material that is available in our churches for more information.

Frustrating Font Failures: The holy water is back! For the first time in many months, we are allowed to provide this sacramental for your use as you enter or depart church. But despite heroic engineering efforts by our facilities staff, we cannot keep the large baptismal font at Holy Redeemer from leaking. Unfortunately — at least for the time being — we have suspended efforts to repair the leaks. It's simply become too time consuming to keep trying. In lieu of water in the font, we have placed a bowl with blessed water on the rim of the font. Please use this if you wish to bless yourself with holy water.

Blessings upon Deacon Ray: We warmly wish a happy 20th Anniversary of Ordination to Deacon Ray and his family! Even a brief encounter with the good deacon impresses upon one the reality that he is a humble, compassionate, and faithful servant of Christ and his Church. But Deacon Ray is also a warrior. Despite illnesses and pandemics and moments of personal grief, Deacon Ray is always present when called upon, sacrificing his own time and energy for the good of others. He is always ready to lend a helping hand. He is always eager to visit the sick. He is always anxious to pray and serve and love. Since the day that I arrived at this parish, Deacon Ray has been for me an invaluable source of wisdom and support. He has become not only a fellow minister, but a cherished friend. I hope and pray that he is willing to continue his ministry at our parish for many more years!

Finally . . . remember that the Easter Season continues for an entire 50 days! Celebrate and rejoice! Jesus is risen! Mary, Mother of the Redeemer – Pray for us!

All employees and volunteers working/serving for the Diocese of Erie, in our parishes, schools or agencies are mandated reporters both legally and morally obligated to report any reasonable suspected or known child abuse to ChildLine, the local police, or other appropriate agency.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Since the Diocese of Erie was established on July 29, 1853, we have been blessed with many men who have devoted their lives to the priesthood. These priests have faithfully served and led the faithful in living out their lives as Catholics.

When a priest is ordained, he takes on the pastoral responsibility for the lives of others. He accepts and accompanies those he serves during happy times, such as marriage and baptism, as well as during difficult times of sickness and grief. He leads us in worship, hears our confessions, prays over our loved ones. He is our shepherd, pointing the way to Christ. Eventually the time comes when a priest will retire, usually due to age or medical challenges. A priest typically retires when he is 75. Even after that age, priests eligible to retire have continued to serve as pastors and administrators in our diocese. The people of the Diocese of Erie are called to share in the care of our retired priests and help provide for the future of those priests who care for and serve you now.

On the weekend of April 30th and May 1st you will have the opportunity to give to those who have faithfully served you throughout their lives, by contributing to our annual Good Shepherd Collection for retired diocesan priests. Every gift is appreciated for this worthy cause.

Pope Francis encourages us: "Dear people of God, be close to your priests with affection and with your prayers, that they may be shepherds according to God's heart. And pray for those whom God is calling to be priests that they may respond to this call with humility and joy."


