To My Spiritual Family of Holy Redeemer and Saint Anthony,

The Month of Mary: April showers - rain and snow - have at last brought us May flowers. Thank heavens! We wait a long time for spring to arrive in Warren County, but how beautiful it is when it finally makes its presence seen! May, of course, is also the month when we remember the beauty of our Blessed Mother Mary. The Mother of Jesus is most definitely our Mother too. Mary loves each of us as if we were her very own child, because we are - in reality - her very own children! The Fathers of the Church used to say that the one who does not honor the Mother does not honor her Son, Jesus. So let's be sure to honor Mary this month. Many of you, like me, pray the Rosary daily. The rosary is a powerful prayer indeed. Think about this, too, that with every Hail Mary, we are pleading with Our Lady to be with us at the hour of death. When that moment does arrive, should we not therefore have the strongest confidence that she will indeed be at our side? The last gift that Jesus offered from the cross was the gift of his very own mother. Thank you, Jesus! Pray for us Mother of God, now and at the hour of our death. Amen!

First Eucharist and Corpus Christi: What a joy to welcome to the reception of Christ's Body and Blood our wonderful First Communicants! What an ineffable mystery is the Holy Eucharist! Believe me, though, I'm anxious to complete my CDC-recommended period of isolation so that I can be back with you! Thanks again for your prayers, Flocknote texts, and offers of support. I'm particularly grateful to Deacon Ray and the parish staff who held down the fort. We have a great team! God bless you all!
